With summer rapidly coming to a close, it is a good time to reflect back on the events of summer.





Her interest in the book was triggered by her Grandfather's personal story of being one of these children sent to Canada. These children have played a large part in Canadian history (more than 11.5% of the population today) and many in the group were not aware of this group of immigrants nor of their sad history.



Genevieve Graham (a Canadian) is the author of a novel is about a young girl caught in a scheme to rid England's streets of destitute children based on the true story of the British Home Children. Within the narrative, she describes the horrific treatment these city kids received - basically being sent out as slave labour. Between 1869 and 1939, over 100,000 children were sent from Britain to Canada (formally called 'assisted juvenile emigration.'






