
## **June Spinecrackers**

**Deadly Trade** and **Shadow Play** are her latest, one due in October.



## **August Spinecrackers**




We are back into Historical Fiction once more.

In July, we walked at Osprey Marsh in Mississauga, Lions Valley Park in Oakville and the Britton Tract north of Campbellville.




