## FROM OUR SPECIAL EVENTS DIRECTORS



## Survey Results January 2026

Thank you to all the members who participated in the travel survey at the January meeting.

We have reviewed the feedback and interpreted the data as follows:

### Two categories / groups identified.

1) Well travelled members who indicate a desire for:

- ⑩ arrive and unpack once.
- ⑩ included leisure/ free time.
- ⑩ more exotic locations to tour.
- ⑩ ocean ships/ resorts/ longer stays.

2) New to travel members who indicate a desire for:

- ⑩ entry level locations & tourism areas. (London & Paris)
- ⑩ moderate to active activities and excursions.
- ⑩ Include a busy itinerary
- ⑩ lots of locations on a tour
- ⑩ bus/train, river/ocean ships

10 responses. 40% for fall travel, 30% for summer travel

### Duration of Travel

The majority identifying 7 to 14 day travel duration.



## Spinecrackers (book club) – 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday of the Month @ 1:30 pm





