Dear Valued Customer,

We are writing to share upcoming changes to Zoom software releases designed to optimize security and platform performance that may require action.

Beginning November 1, 2021, customers will be required to update their Zoom software to ensure it is no more than nine months behind the current version, at any given time. From that point on, users will be prompted to update their software when using the platform should their version fall behind this nine-month window. For example, if on November 1st the latest version of the Zoom Client was released in September 2021, customers who try to access Zoom services with a version prior to January 2021 will be prompted to update to a more recent version in order to access the platform.

This change is in line with industry practices and designed to help ensure that Zoom users receive the latest Zoom features, as well as any privacy and security enhancements we make to the platform. To prepare for the new schedule, we recommend customers update to the latest release supported by their organization or at minimum software version 5.5.0, prior to November 1st. Starting in September, we will introduce a prompted update to help customers update to the latest version of the Zoom client. If you have prompted updates turned off for your organization, you will not see the prompt.

As always, we recommend you regularly download and update to the latest version of the Zoom software by checking for updates within the Zoom client or by navigating to <u>zoom.us/download</u> to take advantage of all our latest security and functionality features.

Please note that while the minimum Zoom Client software version required for this schedule is 5.5.0, we may require additional updates outside of this release window to address larger security or compliance features. We always encourage customers to look at our <u>release notes</u> for any included security enhancements.

We will continue to share reminders and additional information as we approach the implementation of this policy. Thank you for your partnership as we continually work to make our platform more secure and deliver a better experience for our customers. 

Online Joker Game History

Did you ever wonder how a flat wooden joker board evolved into an online joker board game? Our very own magical wizard **Bob Streeter** has developed and programmed the online Joker boards, for our entertainment. Bob Streeter started developing his first online Joker Board in April 2020.




Spring 2020, Dan and Linda Reid started playing Joker games with friends using a stand with an iPhone on FaceTime to display the joker board moves for each player. The players used hand held cards and Dan and I moved all the marbles.




Fall 2020, we started playing Bob's First online game using Zoom with club members for a about four months with hand held cards. It was great to talk with friends and have an online joker game. Three months later, Martin Capper's relative developed a browser version from standalone software.

Winter 2021, The Test Group; Dave & Nancy Lynn, Dan & Linda Reid, Joe & Zina Yaworski and Bob & Carol Streeter started testing Bob's first online Joker Game every Thursday afternoon for 8 weeks using Zoom. Sizing the joker board to fit our computer screens and playing in break-out-rooms to test the joker game.



Spring 2021, Bob developed and released another online Joker Game with animation to see the marbles move with cards on the screen for four players using Zoom. The Test Group got busy and in two weeks we trained (51) joker club members on how to access and play the online game. Bob provided numerous "Help Sessions" when needed. We invited 8 to 12 players in break-out-rooms with us to practice playing the game.

Summer 2021, Bob developed and released another NEW online Joker Game with cards, video and sound built into the joker board, without using Zoom. There were also mute and video options. The Test Group got busy again and trained (20) joker members on how to access and play the game. We asked joker members to help out by calling other members to set up games.



September 2021, The Test Group started testing Bob's latest updates in break-out-rooms. A new update is the Recover Button, when another player presses Recover it will let a player who is having problems log back into the game.

Bob is always making changes to enhance the game:

Like highlighting the marble colours; leaving a yellow star where a marble was moved from; alternating solid circles with bull's eye circles on the board. Reset game, cards, video, sound, mute and video on/off options. Stars light up when you join the game and whose turn to play is highlighted on the board responding to the player's marble colour. When a Joker lands on an opponent's marble the board actually says "I'm Sorry."

Bob has worked for a year and a half to develop, programme and update the Joker boards, which has provided us with wonderful entertainment during the pandemic.

We appreciate Bob's dedication and would like to express our gratitude for the numerous hours he spent developing the online joker games. We are so fortunate to have Bob in our Probus Club.
