## **MILTON PROBUS MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE APPROVES COVID 19 PROTOCOLS AUG 16**

(As recommended by COVID 19 Subcommittee)

### **PROTOCOLS OBJECTIVE**

Create for members and guests at Milton Probus events, an environment that minimizes the risk of transmission of COVID-19 based on best practices and public health guidelines with protocols that are effective, simple and unobtrusive as possible.

### **PROTOCOLS SUMMARY**

**All members, guests and speakers** attending Milton Probus **in-person** inside or outside, general meetings, other meetings and activities **must be fully vaccinated**.

**All members, guests and speakers** must submit their **final vaccination receipt** issued by the Ontario Ministry of Health to our Membership Director for verification. The copy of this receipt will not be retained. **No exceptions will be allowed** for any reason, medical or other (Our club does not have the expertise to review exception requests).

**Milton Probus in-person activities** will adhere to all Health Department and Town of Milton rules and regulations and may have other protocols as experience dictates.

**Membership Director** will inform Probus activity group leaders and coordinators the vaccine status of their group members to assist them with protocols.

These protocols are **effective** immediately.

### **PROCESS**

Members are requested to email their pdf Vaccination **receipt** to Anne Eadie, Membership Director, at [aeadiehome@cogeca.ca](mailto:aeadiehome@cogeca.ca) **as soon as possible**. After recording vaccination status, the member pdf receipt file will be deleted.

**Members who cannot email** their receipt before the first in-person event must bring a copy of their receipt to the first in-person event they attend.

**Your receipt**, if you did not retain a copy, can be downloaded in pdf format from the Ontario Ministry of Health at "[covid19.ontariohealth.ca](https://www.ontariohealth.ca/covid19)."

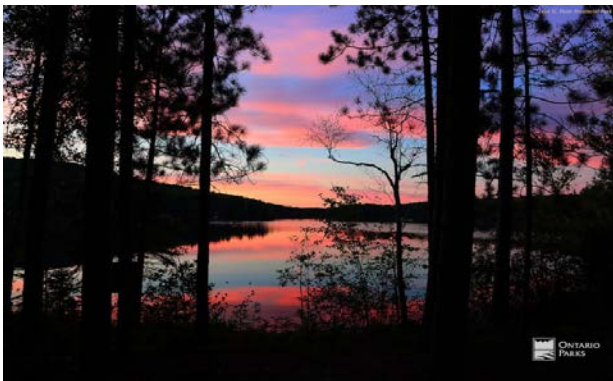

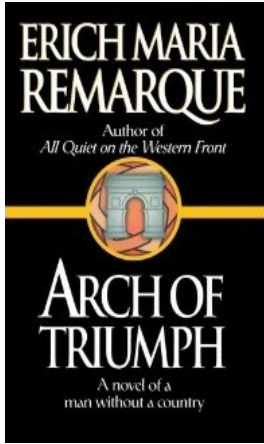
A big thank you to all who have taken time to teach Joker players how to navigate this application. It is very friendly and easy to use.

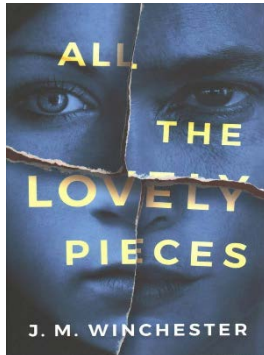
Shirley had read Erich Maria Remarque’s previous book **All Quiet on the Western Front** and suggested his next book **Arch of Triumph**.

Sadly, our group found the book generally depressing and difficult to read.



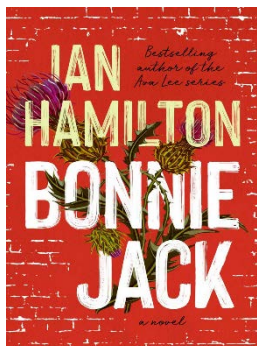
### 2021 July Spinecrackers
