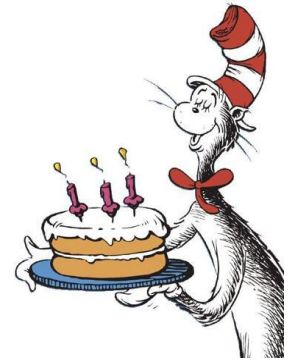

Tuesday, March 3, 2026
