Math (Nash)

We finished our measurement chapter and took the test on Friday. The test grades have been entered on FACTS. We will spend the week reviewing skills students have struggled with on the last two tests--- ratios, proportions, and measurement. Please check FACTS because there are a lot of missing assignments causing lower grades.

Science (Nash)

We will finish our Genetics/Heredity chapter this week. We will start the week completing our "Paper Pet Genetics" activity and then we will work on lesson #5 which is the last lesson of the chapter. Throughout the week, we will also be working on the study guide for the Science test on Friday. Students have been filling out a sheet during each lesson, and those sheets are able to be used on the test!

ELA (Baker)

Reading and English: We will take the iLearn practice tests this week on Tuesday and Wednesday. During the rest of our time next week, we will review various English skills as well as work on planning and writing an argumentative essay.

Jar of Books: Students are reading fictional chapter books this month. They will identify the theme and mood on their response bookmarks. As a reminder, the students are required to read at least one book (of 100 pages or more) per month for the Jar of Books.

Word Study: Test over #21-25 on Tuesday.

History (Newton)

The history students will continue to learn one Washington, DC landmark per day. They will be quizzed on these eventually. We will also discuss Thomas Jefferson and the exploration of Lewis and Clark. In our timeline unit on the Civil War, we will briefly outline the battles and focus on Gettysburg and Lincoln's famous address.

Bible (Baker)

Our Bible time will be limited this week due to testing, but the students will memorize 1 Cor. 13:5 for their test on Friday.
