Math (Nash)

Science (Nash)

We will be finishing chapter 3 this week over natural resources. Instead of a test this chapter, we are going to be doing an in-class project. We will be working on the project Wednesday (11/19), Thursday (11/20), and Friday (11/21). The presentations will be Monday (11/24) and Tuesday (11/25).

ELA (Baker)
