Devos

"Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing."

- 1 Thessalonians 5:11 (ESV)

Reflection:

Encouragement is one of the most powerful gifts we can offer each other. In a world that often tears down, discourages, and critiques, the act of building someone up stands out like a bright light in a dark place. Paul's words to the Thessalonians remind us that encouragement isn't a suggestion—it's a calling for every believer.

God Himself is the ultimate Encourager. Throughout Scripture, we see Him lifting the brokenhearted, strengthening the weary, and reminding His people of their worth and purpose. As His ambassadors, we are called to do the same.

Encouragement can come in many forms: a spoken word, a written note, a helping hand, a silent prayer. Sometimes, it's simply listening when someone needs to talk. Other times, it's boldly reminding them of who they are in Christ when they are tempted to forget.

Our words have the power to breathe life into someone's soul—or to drain it.

Proverbs 18:21 says, "Death and life are in the power of the tongue." What if we chose to use our words today to breathe life?

Think about someone in your life who may be carrying a heavy load. A timely word of encouragement might be exactly what God wants to use to lift their spirit and point them back to Him.
