There have been outages of both the internet and some cable in June. Sentrics can detect those problems even when there is not a technician on site.


RESPITE CARE AVAILABLE IN MONTCLAIR Montclair offers RESPITE CARE to Clairmont Place residents. Respite Care can enable eligible residents to return to our community after a fall or a hospitalization when they cannot safely return to their condo. This can be particularly attractive now that Powerback Rehab is located in the 2100 building to provide therapy to all eligible residents. (The nature of the resident's condition and insurance requirements may impact both admission to Montclair and eligibility for services from Powerback Rehab.)

Montclair has two respite rooms that are furnished. Please keep in mind that Montclair is not a hotel! Some families have been surprised that they cannot move in within hours of calling Claudette. Respite Care residents are considered to be temporary residents, but they must comply with all the admission paperwork of all personal care home residents in the state of Georgia, including medical testing. Montclair must also have a room available for you, and Montclair is filling up.

The current minimum admission for respite care is 30 days.

ASSEMBLING MEDICAL EQUIPMENT—For the safety of our resident, and for warranty coverage, Maintenance will no longer assemble or repair medical equipment to include wheelchairs, walkers, automated carriers, etc. We will provide contact information for medical equipment technicians to assist with this type of work. We also suggest that if you purchase this type of equipment, ask the vendor to assemble your item onsite or prior to shipping. Thank you for supporting us with this change.
