ITALIAN PIANO MUSIC

Born in Pistoia in 1685 –same year as Bach–, Lodovico Giustini's contribution to music is of utmost value as he was the first to ever compose for the fortepiano and explore the timbre and dynamic possibilities of this instrument, invented by Bartolomeo Cristofori, in Florence.

Due to her status as a woman, during her career as a composer, Fanny Mendelssohn, Felix's sister, didn't benefit from the same recognition as her peers from the opposite sex. Nowadays it's very important to bring to light forgotten composers and hidden musical personalities such as hers, since she herself composed outstanding music such as the "Italian Collection": a set of piano pieces inspired by her travels in Italy beetween 1839 and 1841.

Nino Rota is well-known in the entire world for his film music. But how many of us know him a classical music composer? His compositions are like a fascinating kaleidoscope: full of unlimited colours and ecletic moods. There are two of his piano works which I find to be the ones that describe perfectly the many shapes of his curious and creative personality: "Fantasia in sol" (1944) and "15 preludi per pianoforte" (1964).
