OLD LEGISLATION: None

Administrator Bailey stated that back in April 2022, Council passed a bond ordinance allowing the sale of bonds to finance the Sanitary Sewer Interconnect Project. At the time, the cost estimate was approximately eleven million two hundred thousand dollars (\$11,200,000.00). Through several iterations the price has gone up. He explained that the legislation has to cover the total amount of the loan which is going to be approximately eleven million seven hundred thousand dollars (\$11,700.000.00). He explained that the legislation before Council is not to exceed twelve million dollars (\$12,000.000.00), will cover the cost of the project.

ORDINANCE NO. 27-2022: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 8-2022 TO INCREASE TO TWELVE MILLION DOLLARS (\$12,000.000.00) THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT AUTHORIZED FOR A BOND ISSUANCE TO THE WATER POLLUTION CONTROL LOAN FUND OF THE STATE OF OHIO TO FINANCE THE COSTS OF IMPROVEMENTS TO THE VILLAGE'S WASTEWATER SYSTEM; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Questions/Discussion: Administrator Bailey explained how the debt service would be paid off. He explained that the Village has a cash portion, as well as some monies from the American Rescue Plan, which will be used for debt service. The balance will be a surcharge on the quarterly bill for all of the customers that are in the system.

Mr. Bailey explained that the average customer currently pays \$75.05 monthly for their water/sewer bill. With the surcharge that will be added, the customer will pay approximately a little over \$64.00 monthly.

He explained that once the interconnect is turned on, Lake County Department Utilities will take over the billing and our residents will be billed quarterly.

Mr. Bailey stated that a couple of months prior to the system being turned over to Lake County, we will have an information campaign going on for our residents.
