Let's get ready for Spring...



As the weather gets warmer, we want to share some information that may be helpful.

- ⊗ Building permits are needed for home improvement projects. If you are not sure if your project applies, you can call the Borough office for further information.
- ⊗ Make sure your trash is in a secured container and bring your containers back onto your property and away from curbside
- ⊗ Grass can not be more than six (6) inches high and vegetation must be kept maintained so that it does encroach on neighboring properties, roadways or walkways.
- ⊗ Street sweeping will begin in April, so please adhere to the parking signs posted on your street to avoid a parking citation.
- ⊗ If your spring cleaning includes items that are considered Household Hazardous Waste (t.v.'s, electronics, batteries, fluids, etc.), you can contact Waste Management at 1-800-449-7587 to schedule a pickup.
- ⊗ Do not feed wildlife as it is an Ordinance violation and could attract unwanted wildlife/rodents.

MS4 STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

Ideas and tips for the upcoming spring season to help manage stormwater runoff and provide cleaner drinking water for the environment:



- ◆ Create a rain garden and/or rain barrel to prevent water runoff
- ◆ Do NOT dump anything into a storm drain (i.e. chemicals, animal feces, etc.)
- ◆ Wash your vehicles at a professional carwash or in an area that does not enter sanitary sewers (soap and dirty water that enter these sewers are untreated that eventually end up in rivers, streams, etc.)
- ◆ Minimize or cease the use of fertilizer, herbicides and pesticides for lawn care
- ◆ Do NOT dump grass clippings into any nearby streams or creeks
- ◆ Properly dispose of fluids that may be Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) products by calling 1-800-449-7587 to schedule a pick (there is no extra cost for this service)

BOROUGH REAL ESTATE TAX FOR 2026 has been mailed. The 2026 millage has not gone up; it is the same as 2025. If you do not receive a tax statement by March 15, please let me know (412-241-5080 Ext. 2). If you have a mortgage, the bill was sent to the company. Also, I would like you to provide your contact information (phone, email, etc.) when returning your tax and payment. This helps me to contact you if there is a problem with your payment (no signature, incorrect amount, etc.). I do not want anyone missing the discount amount because I could not reach you.

WOODLAND HILLS SCHOOL DISTRICT TAXES FOR 2025: The third installment is due on March 31, 2026. If no payment has been made on your school taxes, you must send it to Jordan Tax Service, 102 Rahway Road, McMurray, PA 15317-3349.

TRASH BILLINGS will be mailed out after March 1. If you do not receive a physical bill, check your email (including spam folder). If you have not received a bill from Jordan Tax Service via mail or email by the end of March please contact them directly at 724-731-2300.
