**CORE LEARNING PHASE**

The Core Learning Phase forms the academic foundation of the program, focusing on building essential knowledge and practical skills required in the Media and Entertainment industry. During this phase, students learn media communication, digital marketing, content creation, media management, and emerging media technologies through a combination of theoretical learning and hands-on industry-oriented projects.

**PHASE 01****FOUNDATIONS OF MEDIA, COMMUNICATION AND CONTENT CREATION (4 MONTHS)**

This phase introduces students to the fundamental concepts of media, marketing, consumer behaviour, and business management, enabling them to understand how media organizations operate and how audiences interact with media content.

**1. Principles of Marketing and Media Management**

Introduction to marketing fundamentals with a focus on media and entertainment industries, including brand positioning, audience segmentation, and media market dynamics.

**2. Media Research and Consumer Insights**

Techniques for understanding audience behavior, media consumption patterns, and research methods used in media strategy and campaign design.

**3. Public Relations and Strategic Communication**

Concepts and practices of public relations, reputation management, media relations, and communication strategies used by media organizations and public figures.

**4. Art, Culture and Film Appreciation**

Understanding cultural narratives, creative expression, and cinematic storytelling through film appreciation and the role of arts in media and entertainment.

## 5. Content Development, Script Writing and Direction

Foundations of storytelling, script writing, creative ideation, and direction for film, digital media, and entertainment platforms.

## 6. Advertising and Campaign Management

Advertising strategy, campaign planning, creative development, and integrated marketing communications across traditional and digital media.

## 7. Event and Celebrity Management

Planning and managing media events, entertainment shows, brand activations, and working with artists, influencers, and celebrities.

By the end of Phase I, learners develop a strong foundation in media, communication, marketing, and content creation, enabling them to understand how media and entertainment industries function. They also gain practical skills in storytelling, advertising strategy, public relations, and campaign design required to create engaging media content.

### PHASE 02

## DIGITAL MEDIA, ADVERTISING & ENTERTAINMENT MANAGEMENT (4 MONTHS)

This phase focuses on modern digital media strategies, advertising practices, and technological developments shaping the entertainment ecosystem. Students gain practical exposure to digital platforms, brand communication, and media analytics.

## 8. Digital Media, Social Platforms and OTT Marketing

Strategies for content distribution, audience engagement, influencer ecosystems, and marketing across OTT platforms and social media networks.

## 9. Media Planning, Buying and Advertising Sales

Media channel selection, audience targeting, ad inventory management, negotiation strategies, and revenue models in media businesses.

## 10. Media Laws, Ethics and Industry Regulations

Financial planning in media organizations including budgeting for productions, campaign cost management, and revenue streams in entertainment businesses.

## 11. Media Budgeting, Finance and Business Operations

Financial planning in media organizations including budgeting for productions, campaign cost management, and revenue streams in entertainment businesses.

## 12. Film Marketing, Distribution and Exhibition

Promotion strategies for films and entertainment content, distribution channels, theatre networks, and digital release strategies.

## 13. Rural Media and Alternative Communication Channels

Understanding regional audiences, rural communication strategies, community media, and outreach through radio and grassroots platforms.

## 14. Human Resource and Talent Management in Media

Managing creative teams, talent acquisition, project collaboration, and organizational practices in media and entertainment companies.

By the end of Phase II, learners acquire advanced knowledge of digital media ecosystems, OTT platforms, media planning, and entertainment business operations. They become capable of designing integrated media strategies, managing productions and campaigns, and understanding the legal, financial, and distribution aspects of the media industry.
