
Fast Facts About PEDIATRIC BRAIN CANCER

OVER THE LAST 20 YEARS





90% BREAST CANCER SURVIVAL RATE

5yr survival rate for patients with invasive breast cancer. If the cancer is contained only in the breast, the survival rate is 99%



35% BRAIN CANCER SURVIVAL RATE

5yr survival rate for all patients. The survival rate varies widely, however, depending on the type of cancer and where.



< 01% DIPG SURVIVAL RATE

Only 10% of children will survive more than 2 years post-diagnosis. Survival after 5 years carries a less than 1% rate.

BRAIN TUMORS

Leading cause of disease-related deaths in children ages 1-14



THE PONS

DIPG effects an area of the brain stem known as the "Pons." The pons control all our basic functions such as sleep, posture, breathing, swallowing, facial expressions, and balance.

ONLY 4% OF FUNDING GOES TOWARDS CHILDHOOD CANCER RESEARCH

Research Dollars

DIPG receives less than 0.005% of research funding

That means you'd have to donate \$50,000 to the American Cancer Society to have \$1 spent on DIPG Research
