

Back At The Drury In 2019



The Drury Inn in Wichita will be the host hotel for our 2019-2020 Annual Convention again. As most of us agree, this is one of our favorite venues for the convention. With an early registration room rate of \$107 per night, the deadline to get this rate is 2/18/2019. Be sure to take advantage of this rate early as we have a block of rooms reserved for members and attendees of the KAT. Make sure that you identify that you are with the KAT when you reserve your room. Again, the room rate will include a hot breakfast and hot appetizers and alcohol during the dinner time. The early registration deadline this year is March 4th. If you are planning on eating at the banquet on Saturday night, meals must be paid for by this date. Entries can be paid for at the show but to enter the drawing for a 2020 membership and registration paid for, your registration needs to be postmarked by the 4th.

We had such a good response from the silent auction last year we have decided to repeat the silent auction format again this year. If you have any new or used items in good

useable condition and would like to donate them to the auction, contact Brian Sigman.

This year, the kids program will start at 10 am with a program by The Great Plains Nature Center. After the program, the kids will paint a life size frog that everyone will get to vote on during People's Choice. For information please contact Avery Rush.

We will again be offering a scholarship worth \$750. To enter the scholarship drawing, please message or email Tim Stidham before March 11. This scholarship can be used to further your knowledge in the taxidermy area of your choice. Other than submitting your name, the only requirement is that the recipient will provide a brief summary of the experience at a meeting during the next year.

Again this year, all entries will be photographed prior to being placed in the showroom. All competitors will be able to place their own mounts in the showroom until noon on Friday when the judging begins. After that time, mounts will be placed by the showroom committee. If your mount (s) win a major award, please be ready to have them photographed with the awards Saturday after the banquet. While this may cause a slight inconvenience in the showroom, it is logistically necessary if you want to have this photo at the show.

If you want to compete in the Annual KAT Scramble on Friday night, contact Chris Rickard or just bring a piece to mount. As always, there will be plenty of fun and learning during this event. The winner of this event will also receive a plaque for first place and a check for \$100. The second place finisher will also receive a plaque.

Remember while unloading and loading that there are many behind you waiting to do the same. Once you get your mounts unloaded, please move your vehicles as we will have attendants in the drop off area to keep an eye on your mounts until you get parked and can return to the prep area. If you have a trailer, it will need to be parked in the north lot so remember to lock it after it is parked!

Join van Wijk Safaris for eight days of hunting and relaxation in the Limpopo Province of South Africa. This trip will be for two hunters and two observers and include all accommodation, meals and daily laundry, \$500 per hunter credit towards trophy fees, services of a Professional Hunter, trackers, skinners & camp staff, transportation in and around hunting area and transporting of trophies to a South African Taxidermist.

CONDITIONS: This is a 2x1 hunt (2 Hunters, guided by 1 Professional Hunter). Credit can only be applied towards Trophy Fees and not additional tours, trips or daily rates. Rates are subject to change without prior notice, Certain species require CITES or TOPS permits. Only animals taken or wounded will be charged for. Day of arrival and day of departure will be charged for irrespective of number of days booked. The hunt starts upon pick up at the airport and ends with drop off at the airport. Donated Hunts will be hunted out of our Wilde Avontuur Lodge in Limpopo Province. Hunts in different Provinces will cost \$200 per person per day extra. Hunting method is Rifle, Muzzleloader or Handgun (can be upgraded to Bow). **A \$2000.00 deposit is required to secure booking.** Deposit is redeemable against trophy fees, side trips and/or tours taken but NOT refundable. Animals not listed may be available. This hunt will be valid until 31 December 2020.

***Mount judging begins at noon on Friday. After that, all mounts will be placed in the showroom by the committee.**

Proposed KAT Disciplinary Code



Expulsion:

Any member may be expelled for conduct which brings discredit upon, or is otherwise detrimental to, the KAT by a majority vote of the Board of Directors.

Allegations of misconduct made against a member shall be submitted to an officer of the KAT.

Following a Board of Directors review of the allegations, and after consideration of any response made by the individual concerned, the Board of Directors shall determine if the charges are justified and of such a nature to warrant expulsion.

Liability:

For any reason what so ever, legal action cannot be taken against the KAT.

If a dispute arises, the two parties responsible shall be required to settle their matters on their own expense and time.

Proposed K A T Code of Ethics

I will obtain and maintain all applicable licenses and/or permits necessary for the taxidermy work in which I am engaged.

I will abide by, all applicable conservation and game laws, statutes and regulations as well as fully cooperate with any State and/or Federal wildlife official/agency.

I will conduct my operation and services in an ethical and professional manner.

- Rates for services will be clearly defined to customers.
- Rates and services will not be misrepresented.
- Refrain from false or fictitious advertising.

Work will be done in a professional manner and to the best ability of the taxidermist.

I will refuse to alter or falsify trophy characteristics to misrepresent and manipulate official trophy records.


I will always, safely and properly handle specimens entrusted to me for trophy preparation.

- Clients will be advised of any circumstance that could endanger their trophy or its quality. I will make sure to inform client of trophy potential to avoid disappointment with finished product.

Principals of professionalism and integrity will be maintained.

- I understand that illegal, disruptive, or other behavior determined to be detrimental to the KAT or KAT participants, may result in discipline and/or termination of my membership.
