



Friends in Christ,

March 5th will mark world day of prayer, a day when the entire church throughout the world is invited to come together and pray. In my ministry I've sometimes had people ask me to explain what prayer is, but doing so is somewhat difficult because our faith doesn't provide a clear and concise definition of prayer. On a basic level, prayer is part of our relationship with God and one another. Through prayer, we offer thanks and praise to God for the many ways that God blesses creation. We can also bring the struggles we face to God, asking for help in prayer. Scripture tells us that God hears the prayers of God's creation (Psalm 66:19). However, it's important to

understand that prayer is very different than making wishes to a magic genie who gives whatever we desire. Scripture teaches that we actually learn how to pray from God. The Lord's Prayer itself is the prime example of this, being something Jesus taught to his disciples, imploring them to "pray in this way" (Matthew 6:7-13). That's why in worship before we pray the Lord's Prayer together the liturgy declares "Lord remember us in your Kingdom and teach us to pray". The Lord's Prayer is sort of like an instruction manual for prayer. In the *Small Catechism*, Martin Luther goes through each line of the Lord's Prayer, identifying through them the things for which we are called to pray; i.e. for the in-breaking of God's Kingdom, for God's will to be done, for the daily needs of ourselves as well as our neighbors, for forgiveness, and for help throughout the trials and evils that we all face.

Prayer is an important part of our faith lives because of the way it inspires God's creation. I had a professor in seminary who used to describe how prayer was kind of like an athlete or musician honing or practicing their craft. Explaining how much like athletes or musicians will become the same type of player which they practice to be, so too we will become the kind of disciples which we pray to be. Similarly, Mother Teresa once wrote, "I used to pray that God would feed the hungry, or do this or that, but now I pray that he will guide me to do whatever I'm supposed to do, what I can do. I used to pray for answers, but now I'm praying for strength.

I used to believe that prayer changes things, but now I know that prayer changes us, and we change things." In other words, through prayer God shapes us into being steadfast believers, inspiring us to care for our neighbors. While there are many things that myself and others certainly don't understand or can't explain about prayer, prayer is also much less about being understood than it is about being practiced. So with that in mind, let us pray.



<u>Lasagna</u>

9 lasagna noodles cooked

2 jars of pasta sauce

1 16 oz container ricotta

1 egg

Fresh spinach optional

2 8oz pks mozz/Italian cheese

1 pound cooked hamburger

8 oz fresh parmesan

Mix the ricotta, egg, 1 cup parmesan cheese & cut up spinach. Layer some sauce in the bottom of a 9x13 pan, add 3 noodles, put half the cheese mixture on top of the noodles, add a half bag of the Italian cheese, add half of the hamburger, half a jar of sauce (I like to add some extra Italian seasonings also), repeat all the layers to end up with sauce on top and mozz cheese. Bake covered for an hour at 350 then uncover & bake for 15 minutes, let set for 15 minutes.
