The word love is one of the most powerful words in the entire English language. Yet, it's also one that gets thrown around an awful lot in this society. People say that they love the food they're eating, their household appliances, pieces of technology, and even sports teams. Don't mishear me, there's nothing wrong with enjoying any of these things, I know that I certainly enjoy many of them ©, but I think that using the word love in relation to these things is just a little strong.

Earlier this year I read the book *Love is the Way* by Bishop Michael Curry. As the name implies, love is a central theme in this book and if you

haven't read it yet it's a good one to add on your summer reading list. In this book, Bishop Curry describes how other cultures have many different words for love to nuance and distinguish its different meanings and uses. Some of these different terms for love revolve around enjoyment, like what I mentioned at the beginning of this article. There's also words for romantic kinds of love. However, what Bishop Curry spends most of his time discussing in this book is the kind of love that seeks to give something to its object. This is the kind of love that God has for the world; in the original Greek language in which the New Testament was first written, the word used to describe this kind of love is agape and in the original Hebrew language in which the Old Testament was first written the word is hesed, and yes, if you were wondering, it does take a lot of phlegm to pronounce that word correctly ②. This kind of love which God gives to creation is active and does something for the recipients, in other words, it's a love that centers more around what's done instead of just what's said. We as followers of God are called to share and reflect God's active love to the world. That's why as a church we go on mission trips and do local service projects, that's why we contribute to different charities and organizations that do God's work of justice in the world, and finally that's why we end each worship service with the words, "qo in peace, Christ is with you". These words remind us that in worship we experience the active love of God, now we're called to **go** and actively share it with the world around us. So church, let us **go** and love the world!
