- Employed or formerly employed within critical infrastructure.
- ✓ At least 18 years of age on the date of application completion.
- U.S. Citizen (by birth or by naturalization).
- ✓ Complete the InfraGard membership application form in its entirety.
- Agree to the InfraGard information-sharing policy, privacy act statement, agreements to hold harmless, and code of conduct.
- ✓ Consent to a security risk assessment and to periodic re-confirmation of the security risk assessment. The risk assessment is a process completed by the FBI which includes local, state, and federal criminal history, and other security-related database checks.
