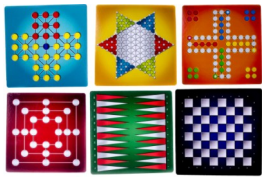

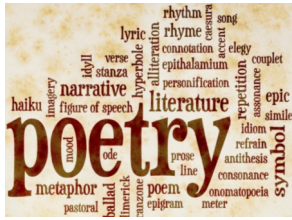
- **Monday, July 12th 1 pm, “Big Fish” PG-13 Starring Ewan McGregor and Albert Finney**

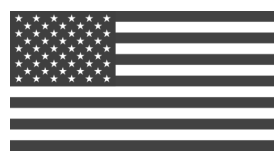

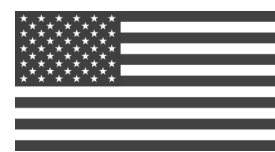

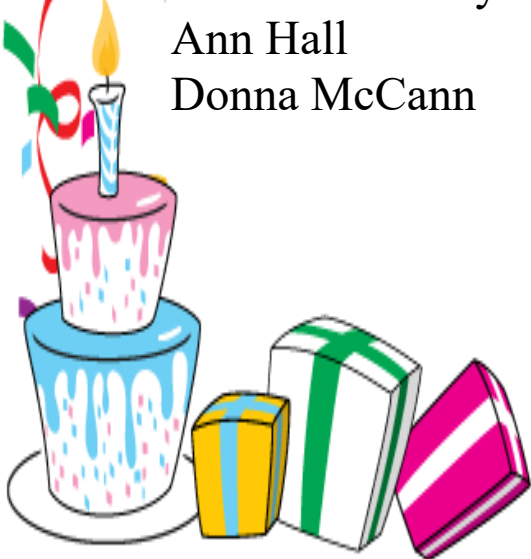

Dear Fayetteville Area Friends and Neighbors,

During these challenging times, all of us who are affiliated with the Fayetteville Senior Center hope this letter finds you safe and well. Since last March, we have all felt the effects of the isolation caused by COVID-19. The need to stay apart to slow the spread of the virus has had a huge impact on the population we serve—the senior members of our community—who rely on us for social activities, nutritious meals, programs to enrich their mental and physical health and, above all, a sense of family. Even though we have not been able to welcome seniors to the Center for many months, we have worked hard to continue to provide services and to stay connected.

For example, we have:

- **provided 120+ take-out meals each weekend, starting last April.**
- **held our annual Chicken BBQ in August, with all meals served as take-out.**
- **held our annual rummage sale outdoors under tents in September.**
- **undergone exterior and interior renovations at the Center designed to make our facility even better for our members, with a new kitchen, an exercise room, and a beautiful new covered porch where seniors will be able to sit and relax when good weather returns.**
