The 2022 Annual Appeal campaign is vital so we may continue to provide services and fellowship for those that need it most. During these trying times we have maintained contact with our members, opened our doors for other not for profits, and fed our seniors with nutritious meals. Our commitment to support our senior population and the community at large is unwavering. Many do not know that we are not subsidized by the county, NYS or the Federal government. Our funding is split between the Village of Fayetteville (1/3) and the senior center (2/3). In order for us to attain our portion of the budget, we rely on fundraising, planned giving, grant writing, our food program and donations.

The Annual Appeal provides approximately 20% of the budget each year, so it plays a large part in helping us sustain our mission. 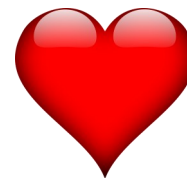

Party Bridge: 2 groups that play every Wednesday, call for info.

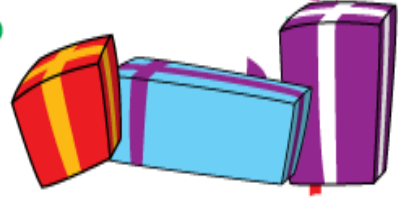
