Here are a couple of possibilities:

**Artist's Website List** – We're asking all members that have websites to include their website address on the membership forms. If there are enough to warrant it, we'll list your websites on ours. Of course, mention of our website on yours would be neat too.

**The Mentor Connection** – This would be an opportunity to expand our educational capabilities. CCAL would maintain a list of members willing to serve as mentors along with the type of artwork that they would be comfortable in mentoring for, the area they would mentor from and their contact information. Probably all would also want timeframe limits on when they could do this. We don't have the staff to include more information than that or often update it. Nor do we have the staff to "vet" the instructors; it would be up to the mentors and mentees to decide for themselves if they are a good fit and the amount of mentoring to be done.

CCAL would put the name of the artist, type of artwork mentored, the area they mentor from and the available timeframe (but not the contact info) on our website. Members interested in being mentored, if they find a potential fit on our website, would ask CCAL for the mentor's contact information.

Implementing and maintaining this Mentor Connection depends 100% on the membership's interest in having it. We're floating this idea to help in gaging that. If after the Annual Meeting there seems to be enough interest, we'll send out an e-mail soliciting members willing to be mentors. The Connection would be open for mentoring in all types of art that CCAL accepts except for photography. That area is so intertwined with a multitude of continually changing equipment and software that we feel it is something we should not attempt to include.
