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DUE TO THE STRONG WORKING INSTINCT OF ANATOLIAN SHEPHERDS, WE PREFER TO PLACE PUPPIES IN WORKING HOMES, AS GENERAL FARM OR FAMILY GUARDIANS, OR WITH PEOPLE WHO HAVE HAD EXPERIENCE WITH LARGE WORKING BREEDS. ANATOLIANS NEED ABUNDANT SPACE AND FREEDOM TO EXERCISE AND PERFORM THE JOB THEY WERE INTENDED TO DO. WHILE THEY ALSO EXCEL AS WONDERFUL GUARDIANS AND COMPANIONS TO FAMILIES AND CHILDREN, THEY ARE NOT MEANT FOR ALL ENVIRONMENTS. WE DO NOT RECOMMEND THEM FOR CITIES, TOWNS, OR URBAN AREAS WITH SMALL YARDS, APARTMENTS OR CONDOS UNLESS YOU CAN GIVE THEM THE EXERCISE AND MENTAL STIMULATION THAT THEY REQUIRE.

acres, for example. Bear in mind, however, that dogs will sometimes increase the size of the area
they guard as they mature if they are not in a securely fenced area.)

(Anatolians are primarily livestock guardians. As such, they are more nocturnal than are other breeds. Typically, their first warning to potential predators is a loud, aggressive bark. This cannot be "trained out" of the dog, nor should an anti-bark collar be used. Upon arrival to a new home, it will take an Anatolian about 2 to 3 weeks to adjust to the new sights and sounds. Even after the Anatolian has settled into its new home, it will bark, if a threat is perceived. Our dogs at Ewawki River DO NOT bark excessively nor do they bark throughout the night; however, we cannot guarantee that a puppy will act similarly.)

We also recommend socialization of the working livestock guardian dog to humans with hands-on instruction in the pasture and around livestock. It is important to be able to handle your livestock guardian for training purposes, veterinary visits, pasture checks, and monitoring the well-being of the dog. In addition, do not expect an Anatolian to excel in obedience, as 6,000+ years of working independently from human intervention has created the extremely independent and strong-willed Anatolian breed that we have come to love so much!
