Another Melbourne-based business has decided to donate the Sound System and all speakers for the Mosque.

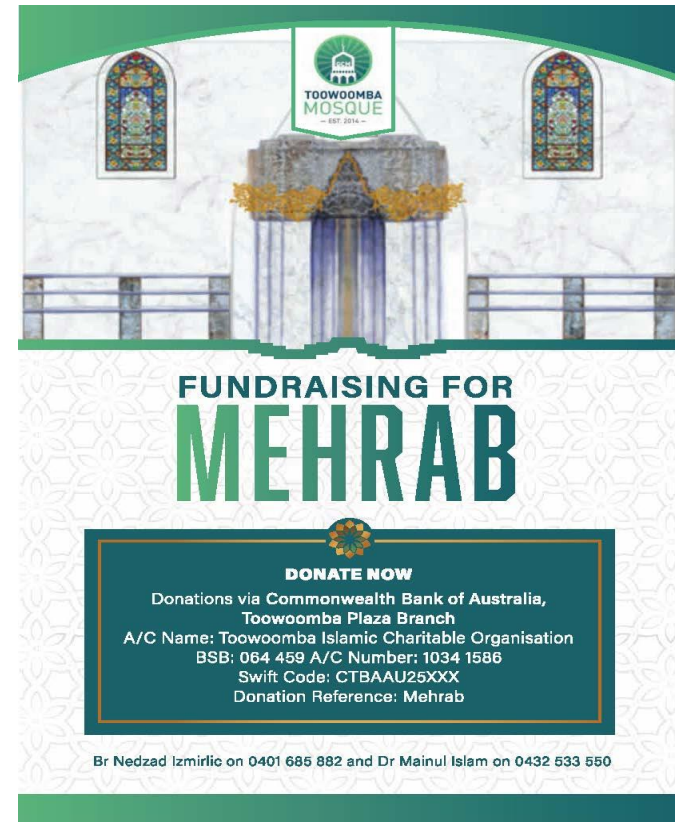
Couple of doctors in Gold Coast has agreed to contribute to purchase best quality security cameras for the Mosque.

The construction of the Mehrab will change the interior of the Mosque and will ensure the look of a typical Mosque.

Mosque open day to feature rare Qur'an

A special highlight of the forthcoming 7th Annual Toowoomba Food Festival and Mosque Open Day to be held on Saturday 14 November 2020 from 11am to 4pm will be the exhibition of an extremely rare hand written copy of the century-old (AH 1329-1330 / 1911 CE.) Hasan Riza Hatti Mushaf-i Serif Qur'an which arrived in Toowoomba from Turkey.

This magnificent, beautiful and awe-inspiring Holy Qur'an was imported into the country by Toowoomba theologian, bible collector, and curator of the Helon Theology Reference Library (HTRL) George Helon Esq. (a Freeman of the City of London and a Kentucky Colonel) who is an avid supporter of Toowoomba's Islamic community.

Qur'an (sometimes spelt Quran, or Koran) is an Arabic word which means 'the recitation' - the sacred scriptures of Islam; the words of Allah (God) brought by the Archangel Jibril (Gabriel) to the prophet Muhammad (pbuh).

Sultan Mehmed V Resad (2 November 1844 – 3 July 1918), who reigned as the 35th and penultimate Ottoman Sultan from 1909–1918, commissioned the calligrapher Seyyid Haci Hafiz Hasan Riza Efendi (1849-1920) – who at the time served as prayer leader at the Imperial Band - to copy the text of the Holy Qur'an so that the manuscript would be read at his mausoleum in Istanbul's historical neighbourhood of Eyup Sultan.

Bahaddin (Baha) Efendi and Hilmi Efendi were the illuminators.

President of the Republic of Turkey Recep Tayyip Erdogan in his forward to the Hasan Riza Qur'an wrote: "From the times of the first humans up to the present day, we have recognized and respected every value that arose under the sun as merely another manifestation of the truth. The cultural riches that have been distilled down through Islamic and Turkish history represent a great source of wealth for us. Based upon learning, wisdom, and scholarship our civilizational values have prioritized love, tolerance, justice, fraternity, and solidarity throughout history."

"Our greatest responsibility toward future generations is to ensure the effective transmission of this unique heritage that are fundamental constituents of our vision of humanity and of the world. The continued progress of present and future generations is contingent upon a better comprehension and a deeper commitment to the great legacy of culture and civilization that has been bequeathed to us from our past."

“This heritage presents us with a broad range of works produced by the greatest scholars and thinkers of history. The protection and preservation of works that feature the greatest and most significant texts produced by our civilization in a great variety of fields and disciplines, their dissemination through translations and facsimile editions, and their effective reconstruction are an important element of our vision for a Great Turkey.”

Numan Kurtulmus, Turkish Minister for Culture and Tourism added: “Under the aegis of our Ministry of Culture and Tourism, the Turkish Institution for Manuscripts (Türkiye Yazma Eserler Kurumu) “publishes translations, transcriptions, and facsimiles of the legacy inherited from our ancient civilization, focuses on building a detailed inventory and cataloguing available manuscripts, and works on restoring damaged exemplars by using the most up-to-date techniques, thus ensuring the physical preservation of this precious heritage.”

The Minister for Culture and Tourism Numan Kurtulmus presented the number one copy of the Hasan Riz Qur’an to the President of Turkey Recep Tayyip Erdogan.

In 2014 the Turkish Institution for Manuscripts, affiliated with the Turkish Ministry for Culture and Tourism and the Topkapi Palace Museum (where the original Hasan Riza Qur’an is held), initiated a project to produce a very limited number of facsimile copies of the Hasan Riza Qur’an. Finally published in 2018, the Hasan Riza Qur’an is limited to only 1000 copies ever the world over which makes it extremely rare and undeniably valuable in more ways than one.

George Helon said that “after jumping through some political, legal and financial hoops I am very fortunate to have been able to acquire a copy of this magnificently rare century-old mushaf-i serif (handwritten copy of the Qu’ran). Toowoomba is indeed very fortunate and honoured to have such a rare artefact here.”

Impressively bound according to the Ottoman style of fully sewn leather binding with flap, cased, embossed and gilded in gold leaf, the Hasan Riza Qur’an has a weight of 10kg, is 756 pages in length, written in Naskh and rika scripts, and completed using soot ink, gold and pigments on polished paper.

The present manuscript measures 49 X 29.5cms with an inscribed area of 17.8 X 34.8cms, is certified and serial numbered 255/1000.

“The Hasan Riza Qur’an has been acquired in accordance with the Mission Statement of the Helon Theology Reference Library (HTRL), i.e. the promotion of biblical and theological appreciation and exegetical research and scholarship,” Mr Helon added.

Further, Mr Helon said “as destiny would have it, 255 is the ‘Throne Verse’ of the 2nd surah (chapter) of the Qur’an, Al-Baqarah (‘The Cow’ or ‘The Heifer’). The verse speaks about how nothing and nobody is regarded to be comparable to Allah. One of the most significant verses in the Quran, Al-Baqarah 2:255 is widely memorised, frequently recited and displayed in the Islamic world.”

In Defence of our Prophet Muhammad SAWS

Children Arabic Lessons: At Masjid and Online

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, Children are learning Arabic language and fundamental Islamic knowledge through both options: Online and face-to-face sessions. A good number of Children are attending at Masjid during learning sessions. However, many families still prefer online option of learning. Families can combine between options as well if they wish. They have still the option to learn online if they cannot bring their children at masjid. We have been using Zoom ID: 379 889 2083. The online session now starts on those days from 5:30pm. The face-to-face session starts after maghrib prayer which is at 6:20 now. The sessions continue till Eshaa prayer, which is 7:45pm now. The overall progress and outcome of having two different options of learning is very promising and satisfactory. During October 2020, 2 students (1 girl and 1 boy) were promoted to Qur'aan reading level. We hope to get another 2 students get Qur'aan in November inshaaAllah. Parents are encouraged to accompany their children during the online lesson. This boosts learning capacity of the pupils and helps overcome communication limitations due to network issue. Please feel free to contact Imam if they need more information in this regard. Suggestions and feedbacks are always welcome.

Online Workshop on Domestic Family Violence

A number of Muslim community members including Imaam of Toowoomba Masjid joined Domestic Violence workshop organised by Queensland Churches Together QCT. It's a 3 days workshop. Imaam presented a paper in the workshop on how Prophet Muhammad abolished DV and how we can benefit

from his guidance in today's world. Imaam also was a member of Q&A panel on the final day of the workshop. It was a very successful program of learning and knowledge sharing and consequently generating more awareness about the severity of DV in our society. Participants joined from all states across Australia. Islamic Society of Toowoomba expressed its interest to work together with other organisations including QCT to stop DV in our families and societies.
