Islamic Society President meets Federal MP

President of the Islamic Society of Toowoomba, Professor Shahjahan Khan met Hon Dr John McVeigh, Federal Member for Groom, on Tuesday, 21 July in his new office on Ruthven St, Toowoomba. Professor Khan briefed Dr McVeigh about the beginning of the Second Stage of rebuilding of burnt Toowoomba Mosque and the difficulties related to the fundraising for the project due to convid-19 pandemic.

Professor Khan thanked Federal Government for introducing various stimulus packages to help Australians during the pandemic. He also appreciated the Australian Government's support for Rohingya Muslims against brutal ethnic cleansing by Myanmar. He asked the Federal MP to view the Palestine-Israel problem in the two-state framework and recognise Palestine Statehood as it has recognised Israel. He also emphasised that the Australian Government should not blindly support Trump's plan to occupy more Palestinian land by Israel. It is sad to see that Australia is following the US inspired Israeli occupation of Palestine while Europe is opposing the illegal occupation.

He invited Dr McVeigh to the upcoming 7th Toowoomba International Food Festival and Mosque Open Day on Saturday, 14 November 2020. Dr McVeigh supported the proposal of Professor Khan to organise and be a part of a national conference on achievements and challenges of multiculturalism in Australia at USQ, Toowoomba early next year.

Toowoomba Mosque Rebuilding Work hits Second Stage

After completing the new building last year, the Second Stage work of internal fittings of the Garden City Mosque started on 20 July. The work will include electrical cabling and fittings, plastering, plumbing, toilet/ablution fittings and air conditioning.

NI Builder from Gold Coast was awarded the contract last month.

Dr Omar Alajarmeh, a civil engineer and a University of Southern Queensland researcher has been appointed by the Executive Committee of the Islamic Society of Toowoomba as the Project Manager. He will be assisted by a team of engineers including Eng Shabbirul Mujib, Dr Nateque Mahmood, Dr Wahid Ferdous and Eng Hasanur Rahman.

The contract is for \$334,850 and the job is expected to be completed in 18 weeks. At the moment the shortfall for the Second Stage work is \$95,000. Any donations are welcome.

Assalamu alaikum warahmatullah.

On behalf of the Islamic Society of Toowoomba and my family, Eid Mubarak to everyone of you and your family.

This year Eid is very different. We all are going through a very uncertain and restricted time. The pandemic has not only affected our work and family life but also changed the way we practice our religion and social culture. So the celebration of Eid this year is not really what we have been familiar with in previous years. There is no festivity, there is no large Eid gathering, there is no social visits, or even sharing of feasts and sweets. Even Hajj is being limited to a very small number of local Muslims. The core teaching of Eidul Adha is sacrifice, and that of Hajj is the unity of the Ummah. May this Eid reinforce the teaching of charity and caring for others, especially those are struggling to meet their basic needs of life. May this Eid help rethink the essence of the unity of the

Eiid Al-Adha: Submission, Sacrifice and Selflessness

Eiid Al-Adha, the second most important festival in Islam, is celebrated on 10 of the Arabic month *Dhul-Hijjah*. The celebration comes after a season (the first 10 days of the month) of devotion and rituals observed by Muslim pilgrims in the holy land of Makkah, and by other Muslims elsewhere. During this time, Muslims get the opportunity to practice all rituals (5 pillars) of Islam together. Another significance of these days is that Islam was completed during this blessed season while the Prophet (SAWS) was performing his farewell pilgrimage in Makkah. This term of spiritual uplifting is concluded by the celebration of *Eiid*. Muslims all around the world follow the tradition (*Qurbaan*) of Ibrahim (AS) and his example of unconditional and non-negotiable submission to Allah's command. They present before Allah their sacrifices in the forms of permissible livestock. By so doing, they in fact present before Him their hearts. Their sacrifices, they then distribute and share the meat with family, friends, relatives, and obviously the least privileged people of the society. This is indeed a practical demonstration of selflessness. Such custom of sharing and caring for others should be practiced beyond the day of *Eiid*. May Allah accept our sacrifices and bless. *Aameen*.

Qurban Arrangements for 2020

Record number of Muslims from Toowoomba have registered for offering sacrifice locally this year. Br Mohamed Abdulkareem is coordinating the Qurban with the community and Almedina Meat in Inala Plaza, Brisbane.

The Qurban will be completed on Saturday, 01 August and the processed meat will be delivered to Toowoomba on Sunday, 02 August.

Many Muslims from the city also have paid online for Qurban to be offered overseas, including Muslims living in poor countries and refugees in many war devasted countries and camps.

Eidul Adha Prayer Management and Registration

Assalamu alaikum. Eid Mubarak to everyone of you and your family.

As you may appreciate, due to covid-19, we will have to observe strict health restrictions for participating in the Eid prayers this year.


We will pray Eid salat on Friday, 31 July at the Masjid in 5 separate Sessions/Jamats: Three sessions for MALE only: Jamat 1 at 7:15am; Jamat 2 at 7:45am; Jamat 3 at 8:15am (maximum 100 per Jamat)

Two sessions for FAMILY (male and female): Jamat 4 at 8:45am and Jamat 5 at 9:15am (maximum 40 families per Jamat)

Everyone must (a) make wudu at home - no toilet/duwu in Masjid (b) bring own prayer mats - but no food or drink (c) maintain social distance - no handshake or hug (d) arrive on time and park your car properly - if late then wait for the next Jamat- do not push in to the Masjid if it is full (e) leave Masjid immediately after salat for others to get in for next Jamat and (f) must register in one Session/Jamat of Eid Prayer Group by following the steps below.

Please follow the instructions of Police/Security/Volunteers. Don't enter the Prayer Halls if they are full. You may pray on the concrete area outside the Prayer Hall, weather permitting.

Application to Toowoomba Regional Council for extension of Work Permit

The Toowoomba Mosque is in the process of submitting an application for the extension of the current Operational Work Permit for the Toowoomba Mosque project. Associate Professor Mainul Islam, Secretary of Toowoomba Islamic Charitable Trust is finalising the application to be submitted to the Council soon.

Due to delay in raising sufficient funds for the completion of the project it is essential to get an extension of the Permit. The unprecedented bushfire last year and worldwide covid-19 pandemic have seriously

affected the fundraising for the project. There is still a lot of uncertainty about the ongoing fundraising due to the fear and threat of prolonged pandemic adversely affecting the economy and subsequently the income of potential donors.

On 10 July 2020, Dr Tarek Omar and his family visited Toowoomba Masjid, and joined Khan family for a dinner. He completed his PhD degree in Engineering from USQ and now working in Abu Dhabi.
