Successful Job Forum at Toowoomba Mosque

Islamic Society of Toowoomba organised an excellent Job Forum in Toowoomba Mosque on Saturday, 20 November 2021. The objective of the event was to inform and connect members of the community about the opportunities exist to get jobs or access training and apprenticeships as a pathway for jobs. The community event was jointly organised by Queensland Department of Employment, Small Business and Training (DESBT); Multicultural Australia; and Toowoomba Chamber of Commerce. Over 200 people participated in the event with free BBQ lunch.









Professor Shahjahan Khan welcomed everyone and explained that earning income through jobs or businesses is an act of worship (ibadat) in Islam, a highest level of good deed. He told that all prominent prophets (PBUT) had profession to earn livelihood along side preaching divine teachings. Prophet

Muhammad (PBUH) worked for a woman in business and he also was a shepherd and soldier. Ms Jenelle Choyce and Mr Scott Christ from DESBT and Ms Tanja Miljevic from Multicultural Australia also spoke. They explained the opportunities for the Toowoomba communities for jobs and getting help for training and apprenticeship, and how to engage with the stakeholders to avail the opportunities.

The main attraction of the event was one to one conversation of members of the community with the officials who help navigate jobs via training, apprenticeship and linking with employers. Everyone was very happy and engaging. Special thanks to Br Mohamed Ali who coordinated the event very efficiently, and Br Muhidin Hadzich for managing and cooking best quality BBQ lunch. The speakers emphasised that employers in Toowoomba are finding it difficult to recruit staff for their businesses. Also, the employers often do not look for specific degree/certificate. In many cases they are looking for good workers simply with demonstration of commitment to job, punctuality and work ethics. The meeting also emphasised that the employers require to open themselves to the culturally diverse staff and look beyond any discrimination. It also agreed that lack of local experience should not be an issue for the new migrants and refugees. They should get the job if they able to do their duties as per Australian standard and quality.

The officials from the DESBT and Multicultural Australia were very happy with the organisation, management and running of the event, especially spontaneous engagement of the members of the community with the guests.

Special thanks to Mr David Forde from the Department of Multicultural Affairs, Queensland for connecting the community with the DESBT, Br Habib Jamal, President of Islamic Council of Queensland for discussing the benefits of such engagements and Br Mohamed Abdulkareem for liaising with the Multicultural Australia.


YouBelong Australia's podcast on 'Who is your neighbour'

First Mosque in Australia using Fibre Glass for construction

The concrete slabs at Toowoomba Mosque will be made from Glass Fibre Reinforced Polymer (GFRP) bars, which are corrosion resistant, durable, lighter, more sustainable and stronger than traditional steel bars. Research has shown that GFRP reinforced structures emit 43% less carbon-dioxide than steel reinforced structures and reduce energy consumption by almost 50%. This initiative is a crucial step toward achieving the Australian Government's 2050 plan for net zero emissions.



Abrahamic Faiths Gathering

The latest quarterly session of the Abrahamic Faiths Group was held on 17 November 2021 evening in the St Anthony's Hall, Harristown Toowoomba. The topic of discussion was Abraham in Scripture.

Mr Ariel Heber discussed about Abraham in the Jews scripture, and Fr Jamie Collins covered Christian teachings about Abraham. Professor Shahjahan Khan presented on how Muslims know about Prophet Abraham (PBUH).

Quoting extensively from the holy Qur'an, Professor Khan said that Prophet Abraham's extensive search for the true God, persistent criticism of worshipping idols, idol worshipper thrown him into fire, slaughtering his son Ismail, leaving family in the dessert etc were great tests from Allah SWT. He passed all the tests and then rebuilt the Kaaba, House of Allah in Makkah and every Muslim going for pilgrimage pray at the spot where he prayed, Maqam e Ibrahim. May Allah bestow the peace and baraka on Muhammad SWS as He did on Ibrahim (AS).

Interestingly, although Abraham was a prophet long before Judaism and Christianity yet both faiths claim him to be of them, and so do Muslims. The Qur'an says that he was upright and followed monotheistic religion who believed in only one God without attaching any partners, and advised his followers to worship only and unique God.
