

After the Third Day ...

n Resurrection Sunday, also known as Easter, churches all over the world preach about the fact that Jesus was crucified on Friday and, on the third day, He arose from the grave. One of the most powerful ways that preachers can close a sermon is by pointing out that early Sunday morning, the stone had been rolled away. Jesus left the tomb He had been buried in, empty.

This miraculous fact is what separates the God of Creation from any other person, place, or thing that people worship. It is the basis of all Christian beliefs. Although the events leading up to Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection are the most important events in establishment our spiritual lives, after the third day is when the real work of Christianity began.

It is no coincidence that Jesus rose on the third day. The number three has special significance - it relates to the very nature of our triune God. Before the world began, the Trinity - Father, Son, and Holy Spirited coexisted, three-in-one, in perfect harmony and love with one another.

Protect yourself from being



Although the writer of Hebrews advised "don't forget to show hospitality to strangers, for some who have done this have entertained angels without realizing it," do question the ones who ask you for your personal information. Cybercrime has escalated at an alarming rate. According to the FBI the most recent statistics available show a record amount of losses due to cybercrime, surpassing \$4.2 billion dollars. Much of that affected those 50 and older, with losses in this age group exceeding \$1.8 billion.

During the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, overall reports from victims of cybercrimes in all age groups jumped 69 percent from 2019. The increase was blamed on crooks who exploited the COVID-19 pandemic for financial gain. "While the American public was focused on protecting our families from a global pandemic and helping others in need, cybercriminals took advantage of the opportunity to profit from our dependence on technology to go on an internet crime spree," said the FBI's Paul Abbate, a 25-year veteran who is the bureau's deputy director.

Americans age 50 and older are victimized more than other age groups. Older victims are "targeted by perpetrators because they are generally believed to have significant financial resources." As such, tech-support frauds were a particular bane to victims age 50 and older. These schemes see criminals defraud others by posing as technicians who will resolve an issue such as a compromised bank account or a computer virus. At least two-thirds of tech-support victims, who overall filed almost 15,500 complaints last year, were 50-plus, and they lost millions of dollars.

Cybercriminals run the gamut. They may pose as fake "grandchildren" with phony emergencies who hit up real grandparents for cash. Or online romances who promise love and marriage but want to get their hands on one thing: your money. Or e-commerce outlets that advertise having personal protective equipment for sale and accept payments, but never deliver.

With the COVID pandemic permeating all parts of life last year, fraudsters committed crimes tied to federal COVID-19 relief funds, grants and loans; enhanced unemployment benefits; and the purported online sale of scarce goods. They also coaxed victims into handing over personal identity information to commit identity theft.

Some of today's most popular frauds include:

THE WRONG NUMBER TEXT SCHEME. A text message addressed to someone else pops up on your phone. It seems urgent, and since you're such a helpful person, you text back "sorry wrong number." This could trigger a scammer. According to the FBI "scammers are primarily aiming to find phone numbers where people are willing to engage ... They might then use that to try to get personal information to target you

for another scam."

PROTECT YOURSELF: don't respond to texts from numbers you don't recognize. Simply delete them. Don't click on links in these messages or respond with STOP if the messages say you can do this to avoid future messages. Instead, block the phone numbers they come from.

Bank Impersonator Racket. Criminals are finding a low-tech way around two-step authentication. Let's say you've set up your bank or credit card online accounts so that it requires a live code sent from the institution. Now let's say a criminal has your credit card username and password login, wants to steal from you, and tries to login your account. In this increasingly common fraud, they call you, claiming to be from your bank and warning about a problem with your account. The caller tells you they're emailing or texting you a "onetime passcode" for logging in, and asks you to read it back to them for verification. In reality, the scammer's login attempt triggered your bank to send you the passcode. Handing it over gives fraudsters full access to your account.

PROTECT YOURSELF: scammers are good at impersonating bank or credit card company employees. Never give your one-time passcode to anyone who calls you. Hang up, find your institution's phone number on your bank statement or on your credit card and call them to find out if there is really a problem. If not, report the scam to the bank or credit card company's fraud division. Note: be wary of participating in social media games and quizzes that ask you to divulge personal information like "mother's maiden name," "name of your last pet," or "name of the street you lived on as a child." Often these answers are used for security questions on your accounts. Be careful you don't give a scammer all he or she needs to steal your identity.

THE OUT OF STOCK ITEM SCAM. The email says the company is out of stock for a product you ordered. So where's your refund? Scammers often place fake ads on social sites for products at too-good-to-be-true prices, take your order and payment information, then tell you the item is not available right now. They promise your refund is on the way, but it never arrives, and you can't reach anyone at the company about it.

PROTECT YOURSELF: Research businesses online before you buy, and only shop on secure websites with a lock symbol in the browser bar and an internet address that begins with "https." And pay by credit card. That way, you can withhold payment pending an investigation.

The FBI offers these key tips: use extreme caution in online communication. Verify the sender of an email. Criminals sometimes will change just one letter in an email address to



Satan looked at Jesus and sneered, "All your tears, and all your blood."


Jesus paid the price. The pastor picked up the cage he opened the door and he walked from the pulpit.



hold a voice from Heaven said, 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." (Matthew 3:16-17). Jesus affirmed the Triune nature of God in the Great Commission, telling believers to baptize in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Spirit.

Acts chapter one gives us a good picture of what happened after Jesus' resurrection. "During the forty days after he suffered and died, he appeared to the apostles from time to time, and he proved to them in many ways that he was actually alive. And he talked to them about the Kingdom of God. Once when he was eating with them, he commanded them, "Do not leave Jerusalem until the Father sends you the gift he promised, as I told you before. John baptized with water, but in just a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." (v. 3-5) Jesus spent 40 days on Earth teaching His disciples about the Kingdom of God and preparing them to use the gift of the Holy Spirit so that they would "be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere—in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (v. 8)

After He told the disciples about the power and authority they would receive when they received His Spirit, Jesus ascended into Heaven. Jesus left instructions for believers to go make disciples and empowered them with the Holy Spirit to fulfill this Great Commission, but He died for the sins of all—not just believers, so that after the third day, humankind would have the opportunity to experience the Kingdom of Heaven. Simplifying Luke's account (written in the first chapter of The

Acts of the Apostles) of the 40 days after Jesus' resurrection, Jesus did three things after the third day: First, Jesus showed up (v.3-5). "He presented Himself to the disciples," "He appeared to them over 40 days and spoke about the Kingdom of Heaven," and "He commanded them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait for the gift promised by God the Father" - the Holy Spirit.

Second, Jesus showed out (v. 8-9) Jesus empowered the disciples by giving them everything they needed to do the work He had assigned them to do. Showing out means that everything is front and center. Jesus poured into His disciples the Spirit of Life through His righteousness.

Third, Jesus showed the way to the Kingdom of Heaven (v. 11). When Jesus was taken up into a cloud, two angels appeared among the disciples and asked them why were they staring at the sky. The angel told them that "someday He will return from Heaven the same way you saw Him go." Until He returns, Jesus showed how to live in obedience and work for the reward of the faithful.

Jesus told believers what to expect after the third day. He said: "many will come in my name, claiming, 'I am the Messiah.' They will deceive many... You will hear of wars and threats of wars, but don't panic. ... Nation will go to war against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be famines and earthquakes in many parts of the world ... Many will turn away from me and betray and hate each other... Many false prophets will appear and will deceive many people. Sin will be rampant everywhere, and the love of many will grow cold. But the one who endures to the end will be saved. And the Good News about the Kingdom will be preached throughout the whole world, so that all nations will hear it; and then the end will come." (Matthew 24:4-14) The faithful will receive the victory that Jesus claimed when He arose on the third day.





make it look like one you know. Be very wary of attachments or links. Hover your mouse over a link before clicking, to see where it's sending you; question anyone offering you something that seems too good to be true. This guidance also pertains to purported medical advice and so-called secret investment opportunities.

Rely on trusted sources for information. For medical information, turn to your own doctor, your health department and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. For consumer protection information, turn to the Federal Trade Commission; for tax information, try the Internal Revenue Service.

The FBI warns people age 50 and over in particular, to avoid these 10 common scams: advance fee schemes; investment fraud; romance scams; tech-support scams; grandparent scams; government impersonation scams; sweepstakes/lottery scams/ charity scams; home repair scams; TV/radio scams; Family/ caregiver fraud.
