We Need Our Fathers

ingle mothers ... you gotta love em. Single mothers seemingly do everything. Mother Teresa penned a line that, although it wasn't written about single mothers, describes them perfectly. She wrote "we the willing, led by the unknowing, are doing the impossible for the ungrateful. We have done so much, with so little, for so long, we are now qualified to do anything, with nothing." Mothers, and especially single mothers, are AMAZING!

The one thing that mothers cannot do is be fathers. We need men to fulfill this critical role in the lives of our children.

Statistics indicate that

million men who are fathers in the United States. Unfortunately, of that number, less than half of them are reported as living in the same household with a spouse or their kids. Fatherlessness has reached epidemic proportions in America. The U.S. Department of Justice provides some shocking statistics: 90% of homeless/ runaways are from fatherless homes; 85% of reported behavioral issues come from fatherless homes: 75% of substance abuse patients reported a fatherless home; and 63% of youth suicides are from fatherless homes.

There is a deep societal need for developing good intentional relationships there are approximately 72 with our fathers, as well as

a spiritual need: the better the relationship we have with our earthly fathers, the better the relationship we have with our Heavenly Father. And while the data is alarming, it also emphasizes the profound purpose for fathers in the lives of their children. We need our fathers!

God is our Heavenly Father and we are all His children. This relationship makes it easy to understand the important role of a Christian father being in the home. Although lifestyle changes over the generations have taken many fathers out of the house, the role of a Christian father makes a huge impact on "training up a child in the way they should go"

What's it like being a dad? Ask, and you'll get as many answers as there are fathers. Some men will tell you that becoming a father means your life completely changes. "When you first have a baby you're not going to sleep for the first six months. There'll be diapers and tantrums and messes and confusion. You'll be more exhausted than you've ever been in your life, and your personal life will all but disappear." It sounds like a parental nightmare.

Others will tell you "being a dad is the most revered and humbling title I have held in my lifetime. It requires your attention 24-7. Unlike other jobs we have, we can't take any time off. It means holding and consoling your child when they have an ear infection. It also means playing catch or Barbie dolls on demand. It means that I have a life filled in ways that I could have never imagined."

No matter how men describe it, being a dad is a huge responsibility which should never be taken lightly. Sisters in the Spirit (SIS) talked to several men who shared what it meant to them to be a dad.



Ron

(pictured in the middle with sons Marcus and Justin) has been a father for 42 years. He has two sons and eight grandchildren. SIS asked him: what does it mean to be a father?

Ron: Being a father is the most important job a man could have. You are given an opportunity to instill good values in another person, and help them to carry on the family traditions and the family name.

SIS: What has been your biggest challenge or worry for your children? Ron: *My biggest concern is that my children not be confronted with racism and hostilities.* His concern is bolstered by seemingly unrelenting attacks on Black men. High profile cases highlighting the number of Black men who die at the hands of the police, or who are shot by extremists targeting African Americans with violence, is overwhelming. Ron says he is deeply troubled by how these events impact his family.

SIS: What do you want your children to remember about you? Ron: *I* want my children to remember that *I* was a good father, that *I* was always there for them, and that *I* taught them how to be good fathers.

SIS: what does it mean to you to be a father?

Tim: Being a father provides a sense of purpose. Everybody needs a course, or a direction for their lives. Being a father provides that for me.

SIS: What has been your biggest challenge or worry as a father?

Tim: *I* want my children to experience acceptance and

joy. It's important to me that my children find their niche in life. I want them to be able to do whatever makes them happy.

SIS: What do you want your children to remember about you? Tim: *I want them to remember two words about me - energy and positivity. These are some of the things that I brought to their lives.*

SIS: What do you want your children to remember about you? Nelson: I want them to remember that I was not selfish, and that I was always there to do what was needed. KWB

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

and also how the child will experience God.

Christian fathers are God's instruments for discipline and instruction in his children's lives. Ideally Christian fathers should also provide for, protect, support, and pour purpose into their children. These are fundamental qualities that emulate how our Heavenly Father cares for His children; this reflects the very character of God. Even though the stereotypical image of the family is often one where the father is remote and emotionally unattached while the mother is the one who nurtures the children, the Bible paints a more balanced picture. A Christian father should be able to fulfill both the physical and emotional needs of his family.

We need our fathers to be a leader for his family and to be anchored in Christ at all times. We need our fathers to be providers, protectors, supporters, and to sow purpose into his children. Without our Christian fathers fulfilling these critical roles, it is difficult to raise children who are grounded in life and anchored in Christ.

As providers, Christian fathers should make sure his family has what they need. Responsibilities include making sure that there is food on the table, that the family has a place to lay their heads, and that everyone has clothes on their backs. If there is any worrying to be done, theoretically, the father is the one who shoulders that burden. Worry however, is not in God's plan for fathers. Jesus told His disciples "that is why I tell you not to worry about everyday life—whether you have enough food to eat or enough clothes to wear. For life is more than food, and your body more than clothing. Look at the ravens. They don't plant or harvest or store food in barns, for God feeds them. And you are far more valuable to him than any birds!" (Matthew 6:25-27) God wants fathers to take care of their business, not by worrying, but by working to make provision for his family.

As protectors, Christian fathers project safety and security for his children. He makes the home, and thus the world, a safe place to live. When Dad is around there is often no safer feeling - fear of those things in the outside world is rejected. Our Heavenly Father also gives us the ability to live fearlessly. *"For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline.* (2 Timothy 1:7) We need our fathers to be our fearless super heroes who makes his children feel safe.

When our fathers support and sow purpose into their children, it speaks life and confidence into them. He lets them know they are important and significant, and he calls them to something bigger than themselves. The father should challenge his children to make a difference in the world, just as he has made a difference in their world. Our Heavenly Father does the same thing. Not only does God call us into greatness, but He pours into us what it takes for greatness; prepares us as overcomers; and sets us up for success. Children need this same kind of support from their fathers as a way of helping define their purpose in life.

God's Word reminds us that He has plans and purpose for fathers. "I know the plans I have for you declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." (Jeremiah 29:11) God believes in us so much that in John 14:12 He confirms "very truly I tell you, whoever believes in me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father."

Fathers serve as role models for their children, so we need them to be strong examples of good Christian fatherhood. Encourage our fathers to showcase God in their lives and to emulate how God is a Father to His children. 
