Course Description:

- Conduct medication therapy management (MTM) services and implement adherence strategies.

- Develop business acumen by analyzing financial operations, performance metrics, and reimbursement strategies.
- Utilize electronic health records and pharmacy management systems efficiently.
- Engage in interprofessional collaboration and lead community outreach initiatives.

Rotation Activities:

Week 1: Orientation & Advanced Introduction

Students will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- Professionalism and leadership (20%)
- Competency in prescription verification and processing (25%)
- Patient counseling and clinical interventions (25%)
- Engagement in pharmacy business operations and adherence programs (20%)
- Final case presentation or quality improvement project (10%)
