SENIOR WARDEN REPORT — CAL SIEVERS

My report will be shorter than normal this month as much of what I will have to report will be taking place during the regular Vestry meeting (tomorrow, April 27th) along with our Vestry retreat meeting which will follow the regular Vestry meeting.

I did have a meeting a few weeks back with a Pastor of another church that was looking for a more permanent space for their Sunday evening services, plus some space for some of the other activities that they are involved with in relation to their church. They are currently renting space at the Dahl.

I met with Cliff, the flooring specialist from Flooring America a few weeks back and he has yet to get me a price on replacing the

stained carpet around the baptismal font as well as the burgundy/maroon carpet that is so badly discolored out in the hallway. Different options were discussed but until we have an idea on the cost and the options available, no decision will be made.

Personally, I have been extremely busy at work which includes my regular activity along with meeting with Pastors from various congregations in coordination with Black Hills Habitat for Humanity, of which I am a board member. The purpose of these meetings is to ask for them to participate in a Faith Builds opportunity of a Thrivent/Habitat home.

We had a very successful Faith Build in 2018 and had strong participation of many members of our faith community with several churches participating. Thrivent Financial pays for 50% of a build, approximately \$80K with the other half of the cost covered through fund raising efforts.

With the need for affordable housing an ever-present issue in Rapid City and with the influx of families associated with the expansion EAFB in the next few years, the issue is only expected to worsen.

As always, I am certainly open to answering any questions you may have about the expected changes taking place at St. Andrew's. - Regards, Cal Sievers

Handmade Lanyards —Annette Brant

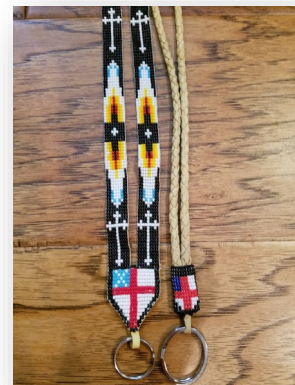


St. Andrew's is the recipient of several beautiful

Recently, I read a short story from one of the “Chicken Soup” books. It was about a man named Joe who by all accounts was a “hopeless drunk”. Joe went to a mission, similar to our Cornerstone Mission. One evening the hand of God touched Joe and he turned his life around at that moment. Joe continued to attend the mission, but was

Grandma Elsie Red Bird's Apple Dumplings - Eddie Crandall

For Pastry:
2 cups Flour
3/4 tsp. Salt
2/3 cups

Shortening (I still use Lard).

5-6 Tablespoons Cold Water

Roll out and cut into 5 inch squares. Put in middle of square, the equivalent of one apple (sliced).

Add 1 tsp. sugar and a little cinnamon along with a pat of butter on top of apples.

Fold over all 4 corners and pinch tight.

Place them one inch apart.

Make syrup of 1 cup sugar, 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon and 2 cups water. When the syrup boils take it off the heat and add 4 pats of butter. Pour around the dumplings.

Bake at **550F** for 7 minutes; turn the oven down to **350F** and bake for 30 minutes or until the pastry turns brown. Make sure the apples are tender.

When I was a child this was served with homemade ice-cream, but I lost the recipe somewhere along the line and no other tastes as good as Grandma's, so I just use store-bought Vanilla Bean.

These are worth the effort to make them. Enjoy!

Ascension Day—Marks the end of Jesus Christ's earthly ministry. He was recently raised from the dead and is now taken into heaven after appearing to his followers for 40 days. It is the final elevation of his human nature to divine glory and the near presence of God the Father. The Ascension is affirmed by both and Apostles' and Nicene Creeds.

Ascension Day is celebrated on May 30th, the 40th day of the **Easter season, which this year falls on May 30th.**

The Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary—records that at the time of the Annunciation, Mary learned her

relative Elizabeth was miraculously pregnant. Mary went to visit Elizabeth and greeted her. During this greeting the child—John the Baptizer--leaped in Elizabeth's womb. Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and greeted Mary as the mother of the Lords and exclaimed that Mary and the child in her womb were blessed. Mary responded with the song of praise known as the *Magnificat*, "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my savior." This day has been celebrated since the 14th century and this year is celebrated on May 31st. Fr Hal+

CLOTHE A KID! - Annette Brant

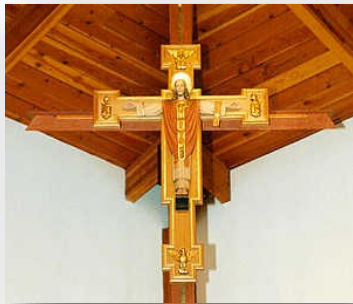
Clothe-A-Kid season is
