


Our services, offered free of charge, are wide ranging and include:

- **Caregivers' Resource Center** containing information on Alzheimer's disease and subjects important to those who care for someone with a dementia
- **a monthly newsletter** containing articles on all areas of caregiving
- **support groups** (more than 30 meetings each month) including general discussions as well as specialized groups focusing on topics such as caring for parents/siblings, adjusting to a facility placement, early stage dementia, Gentlemen's Club & Ladies Club
- **special care room** for loved ones during support group meetings
- **monthly educational meetings** open to the public, featuring local and nationally known experts
- **a 24-hour Helpline**
- **problem solving** for individuals and families
- **informed** referral to area services
