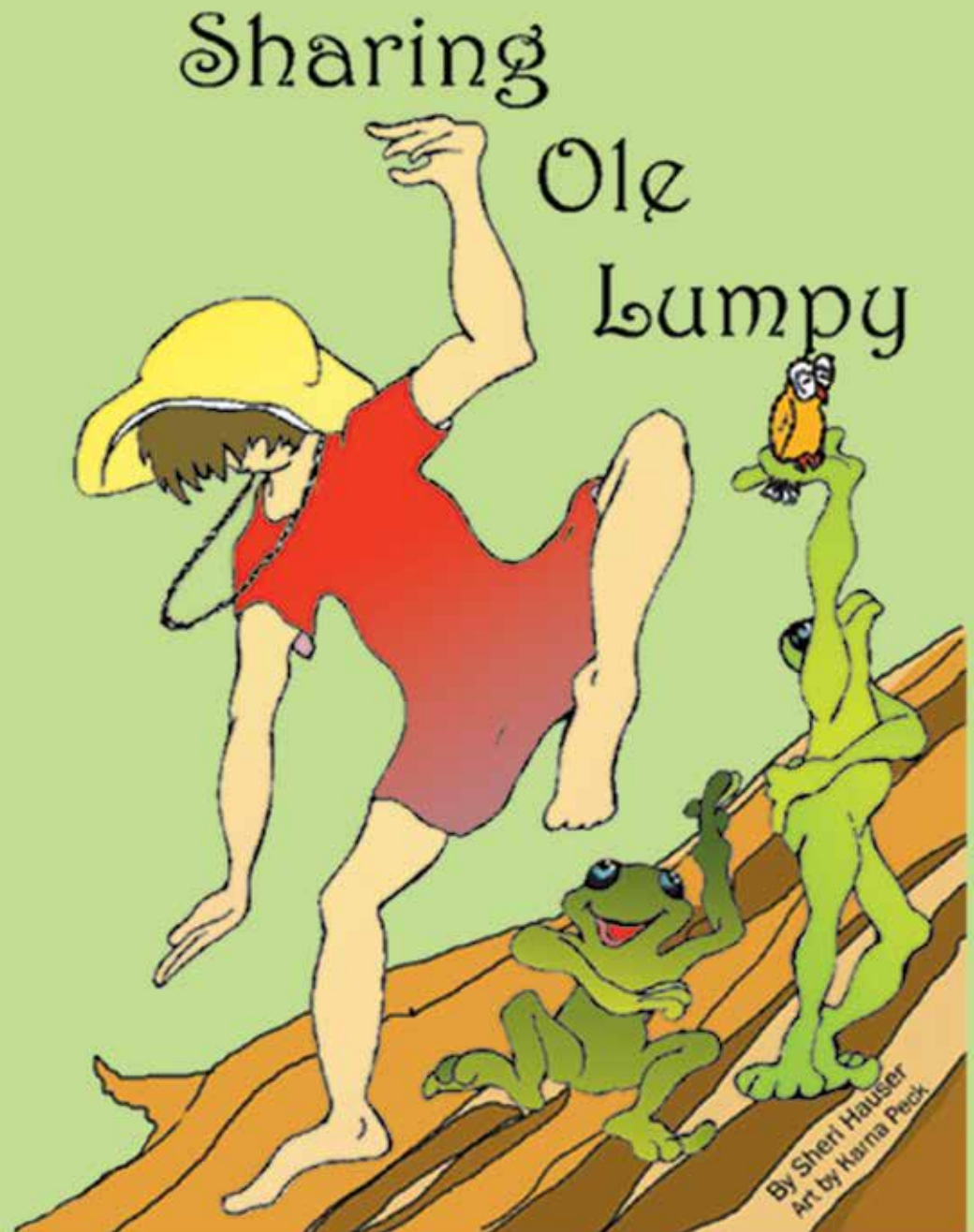

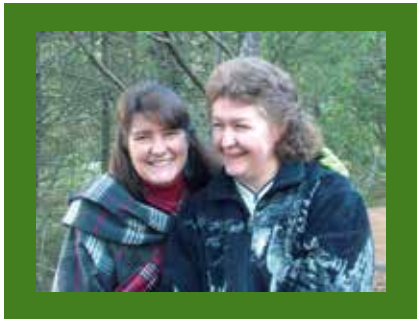


Purpose of Glory Bound Kids Books

We have other artists and authors who have joined the 'family' bringing their art and stories which we are putting into song and music making DVDs as fast

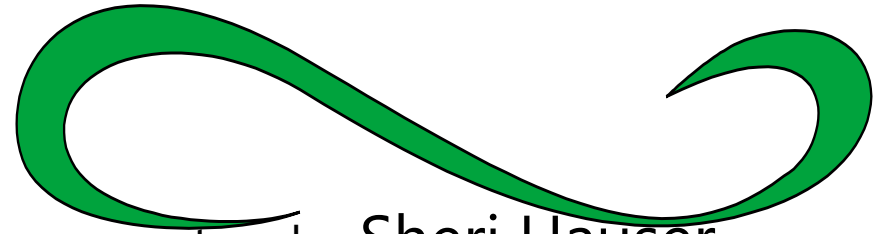
as we can. John Jones has been a wonderful help adding music and color to the stories.

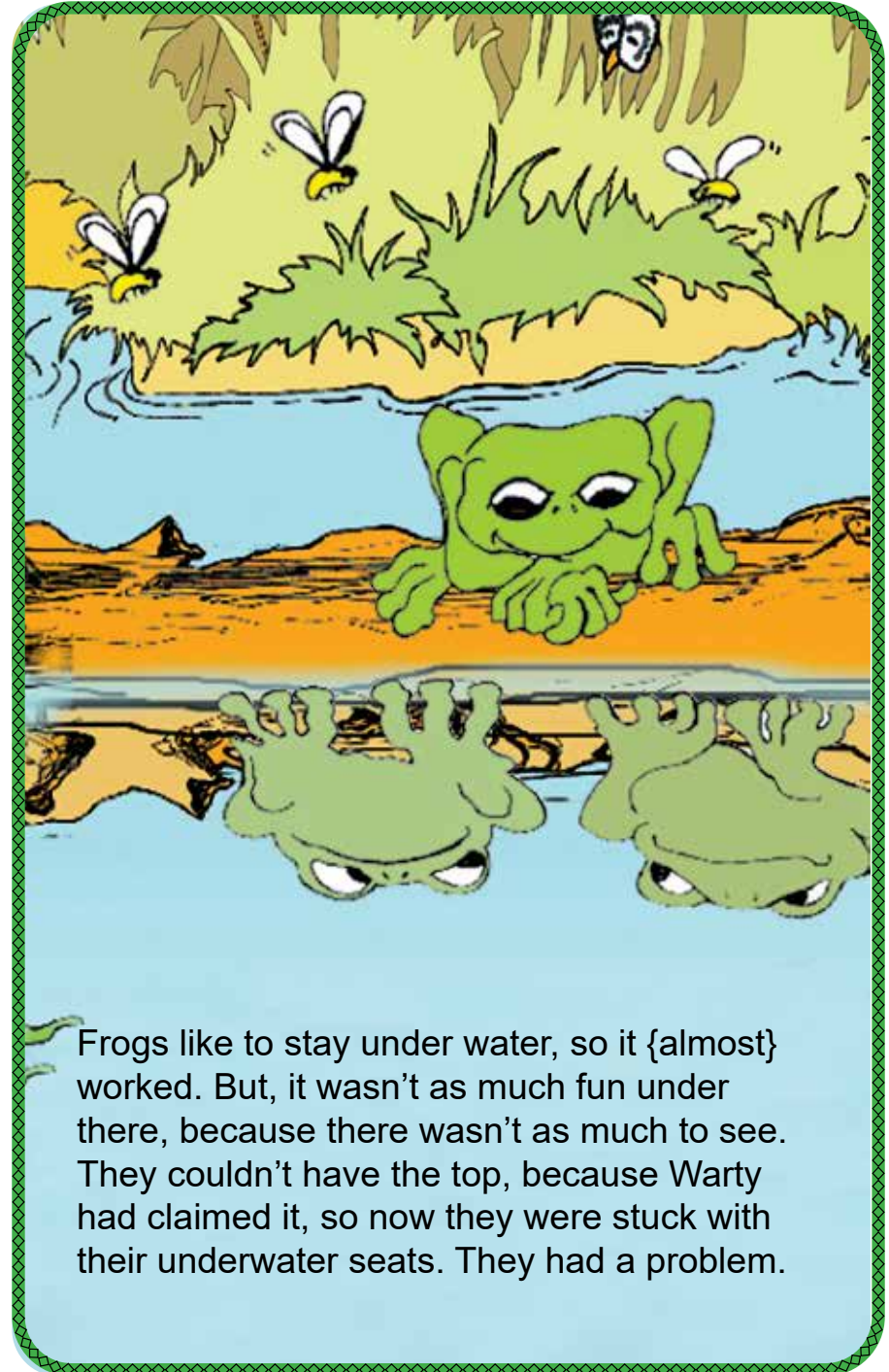
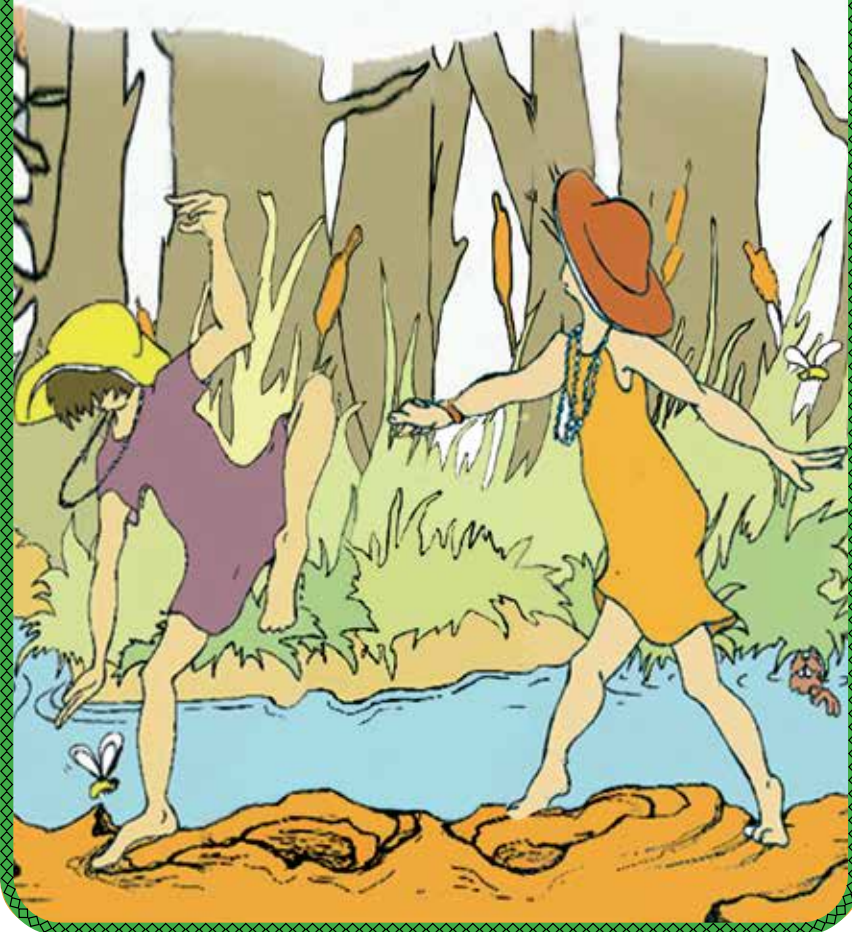
So, the three little froglets assumed positions on the log, each setting their slimy tush on their name.

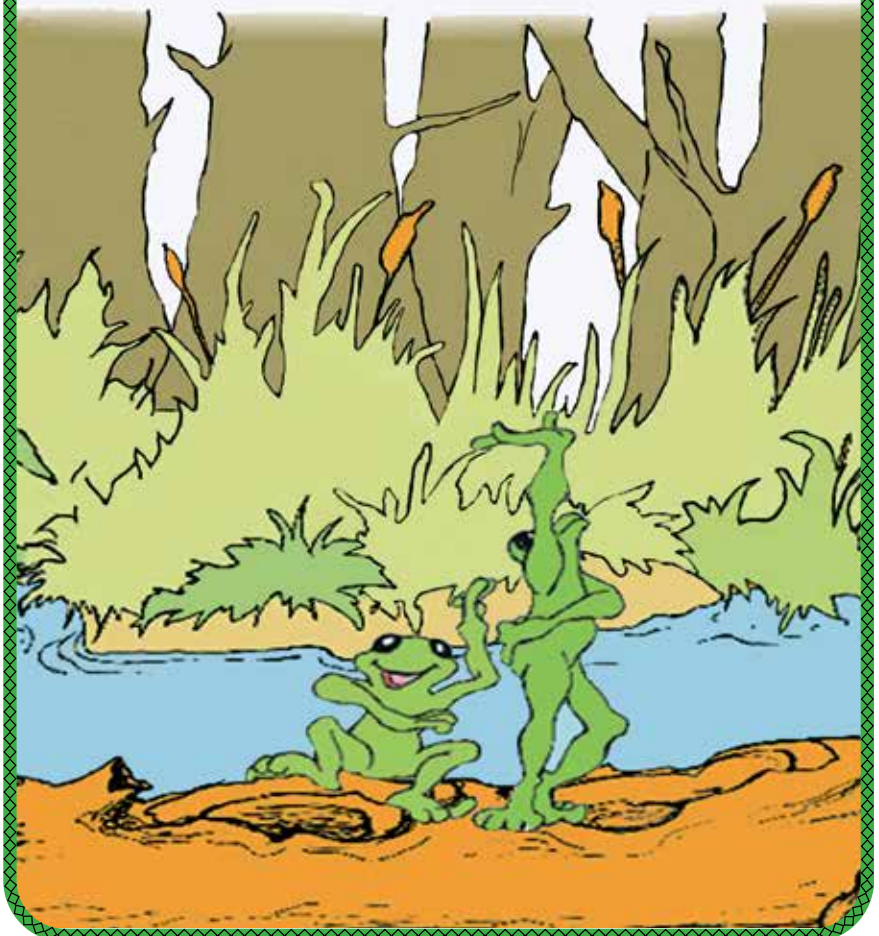


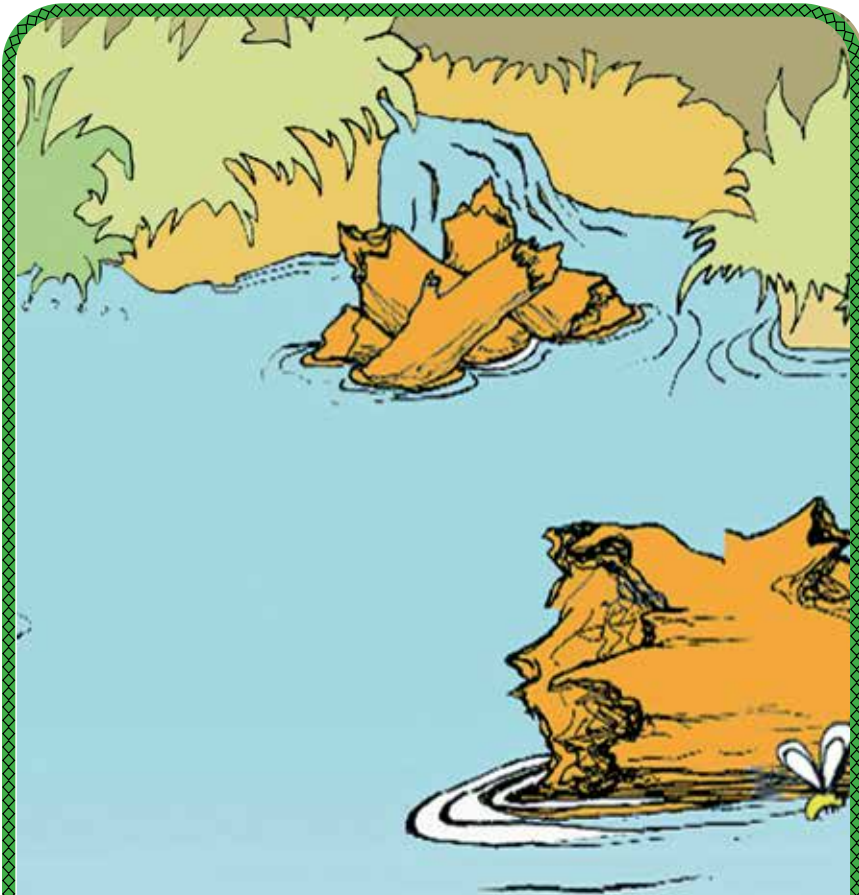

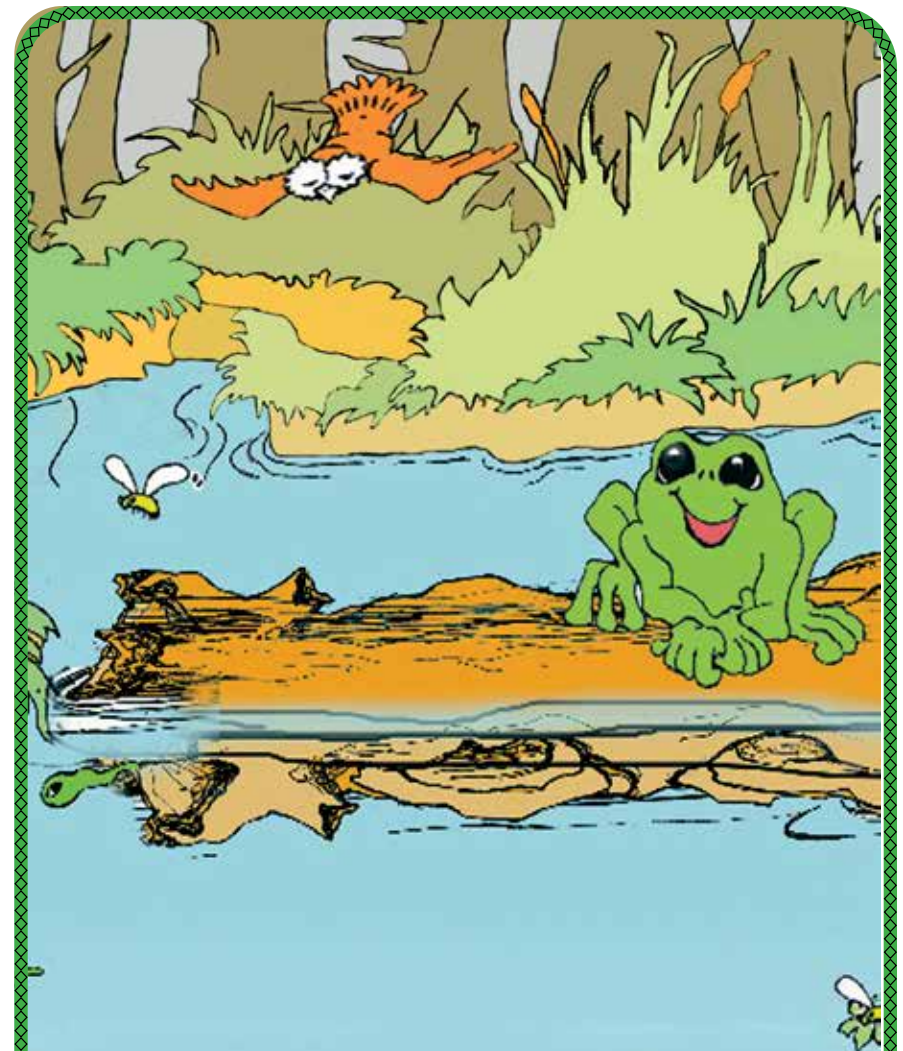

Pirouetting along the way, they twirled and looped, ducked and danced their way from one side to the next in a daring attempt to keep from falling into the stream.

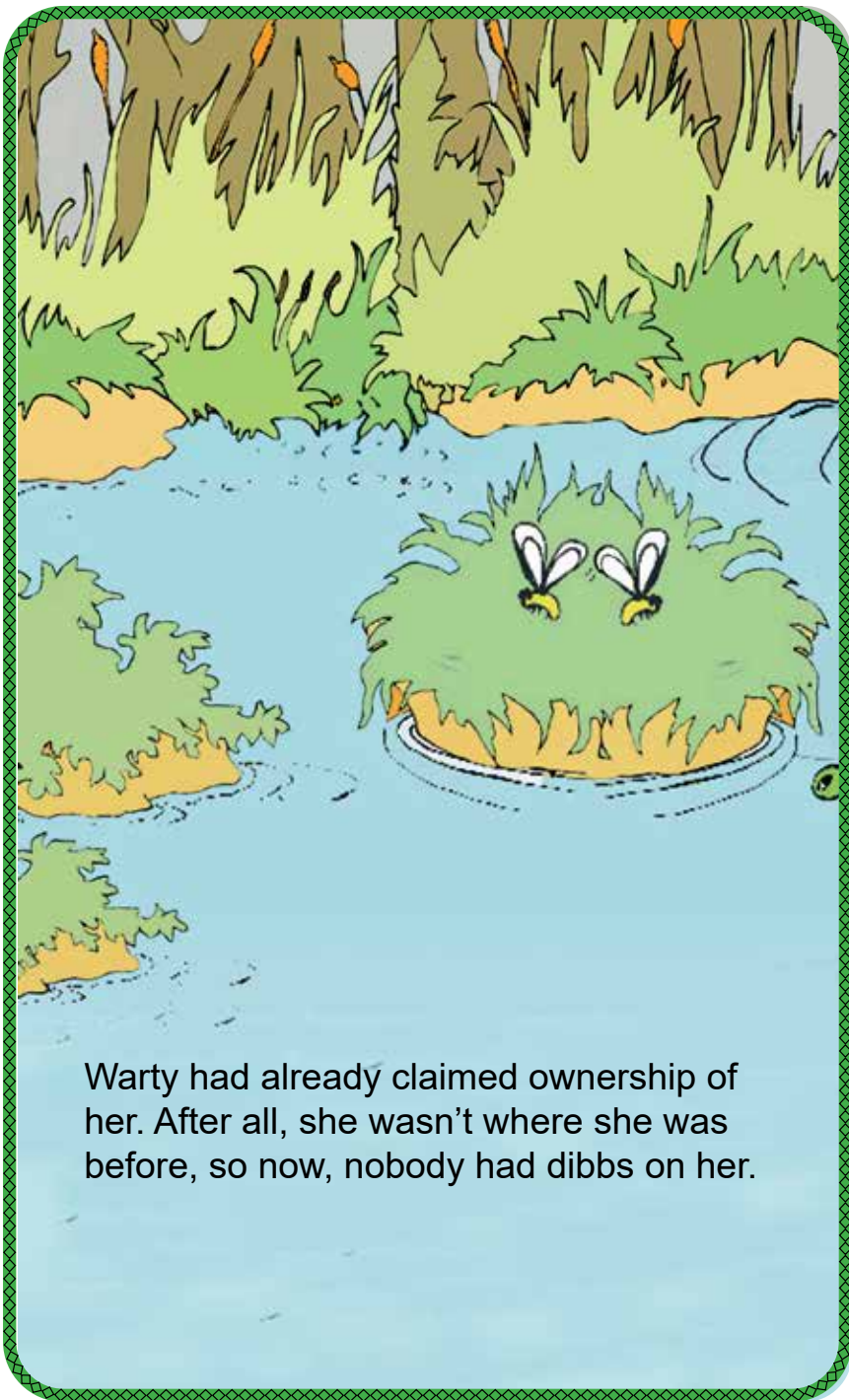




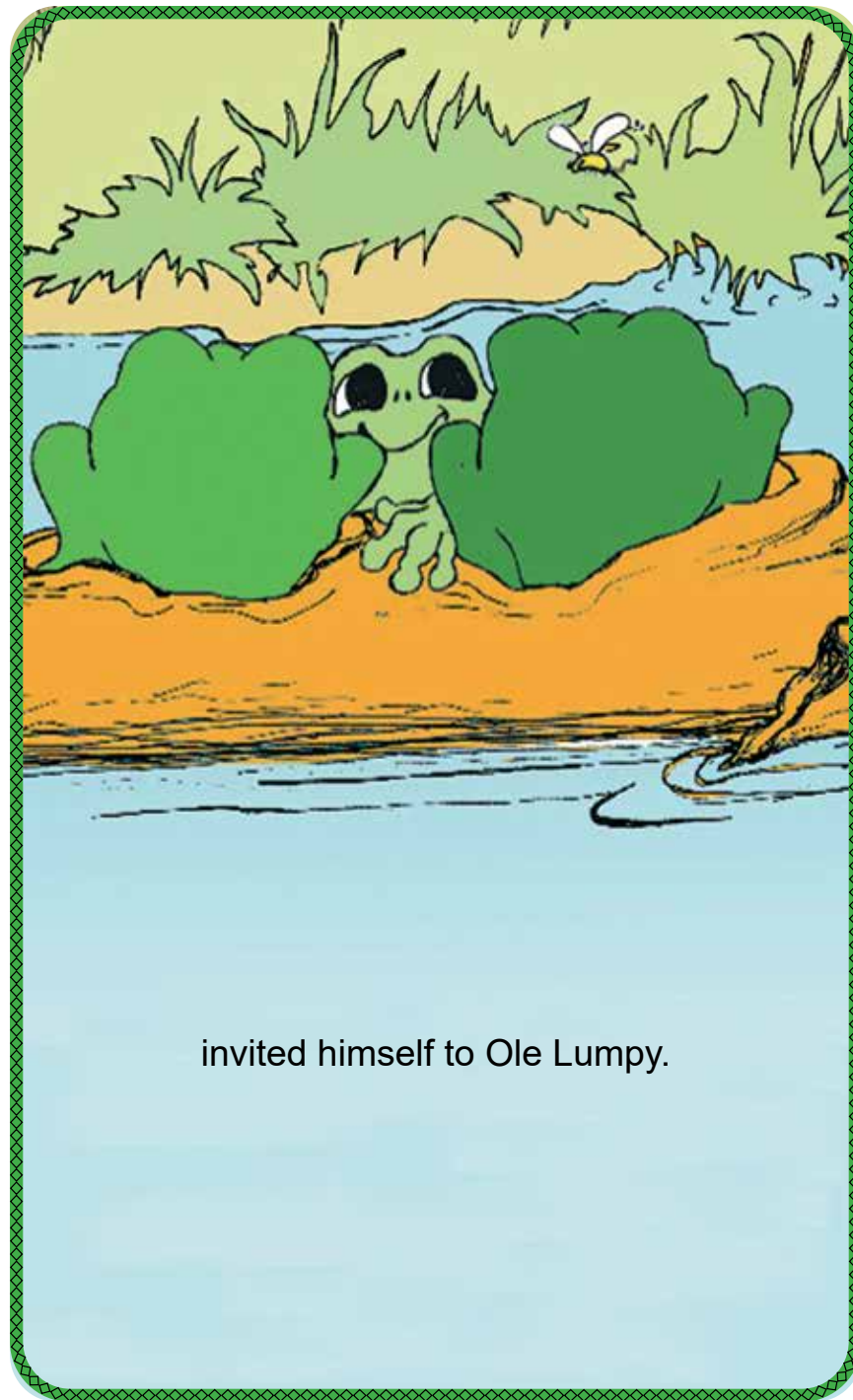
Then, one day Warty, Soaker's little brother

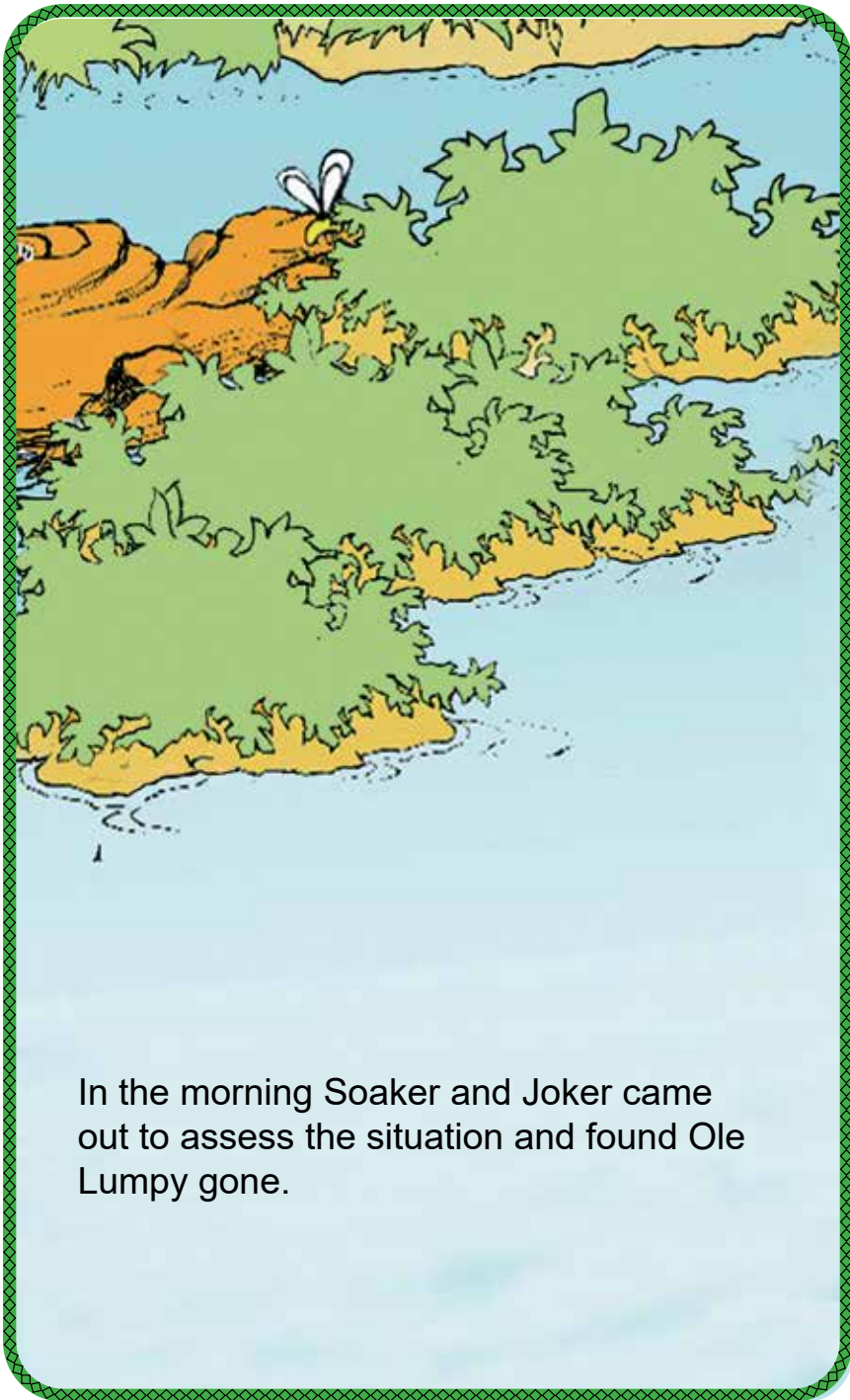
And, just as Soaker and Joker went back to their places on Ole Lumpy, Warty got scared. He heard the cat tails rustle



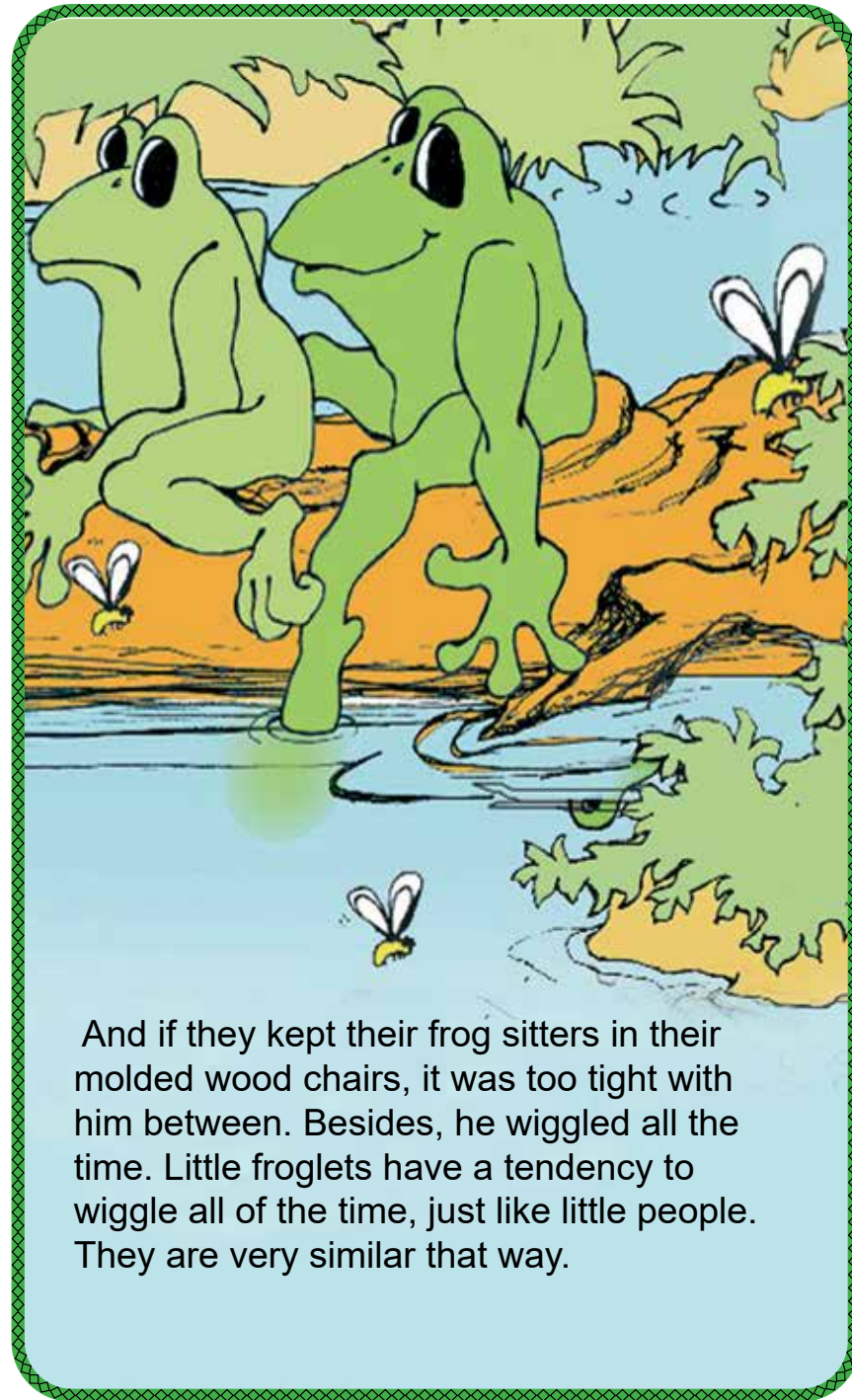

At first they blamed the beavers for taking her,



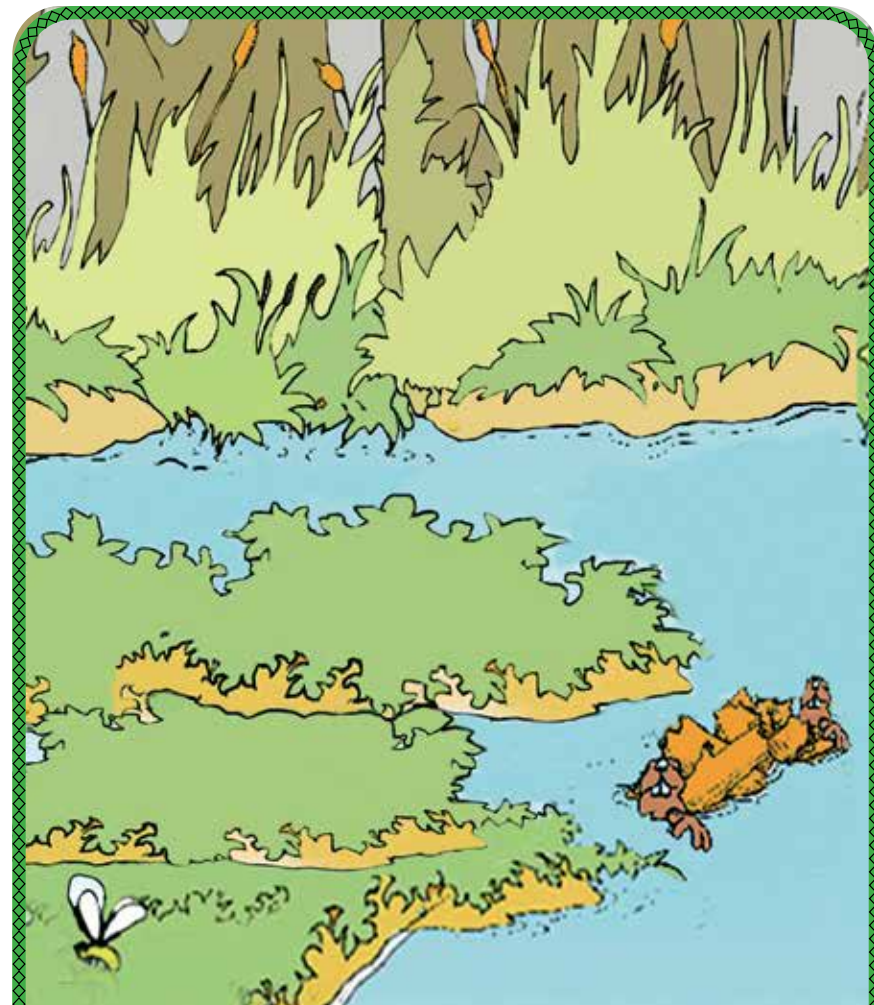
In the morning Soaker and Joker came out to assess the situation and found Ole Lumpy gone.



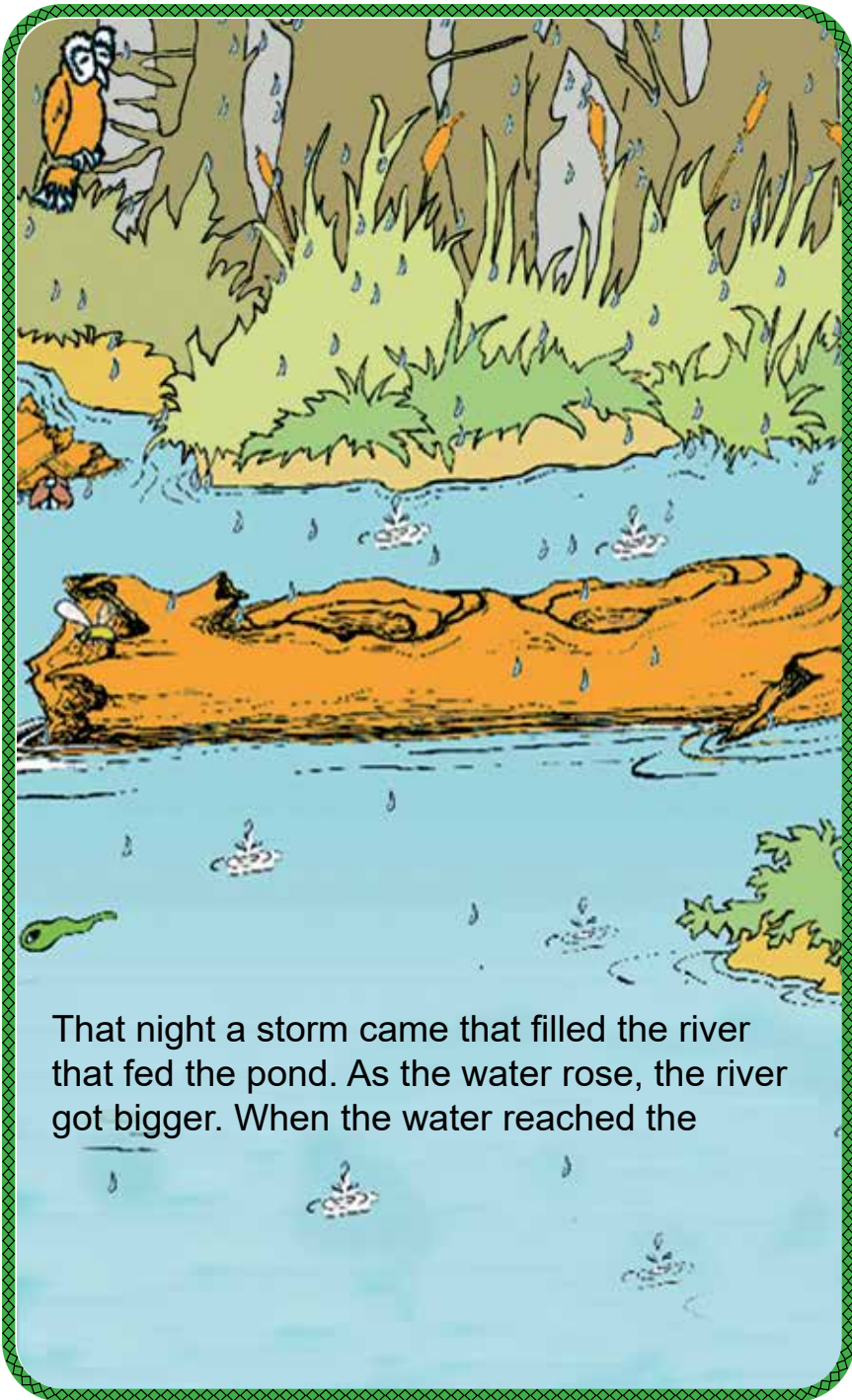
