

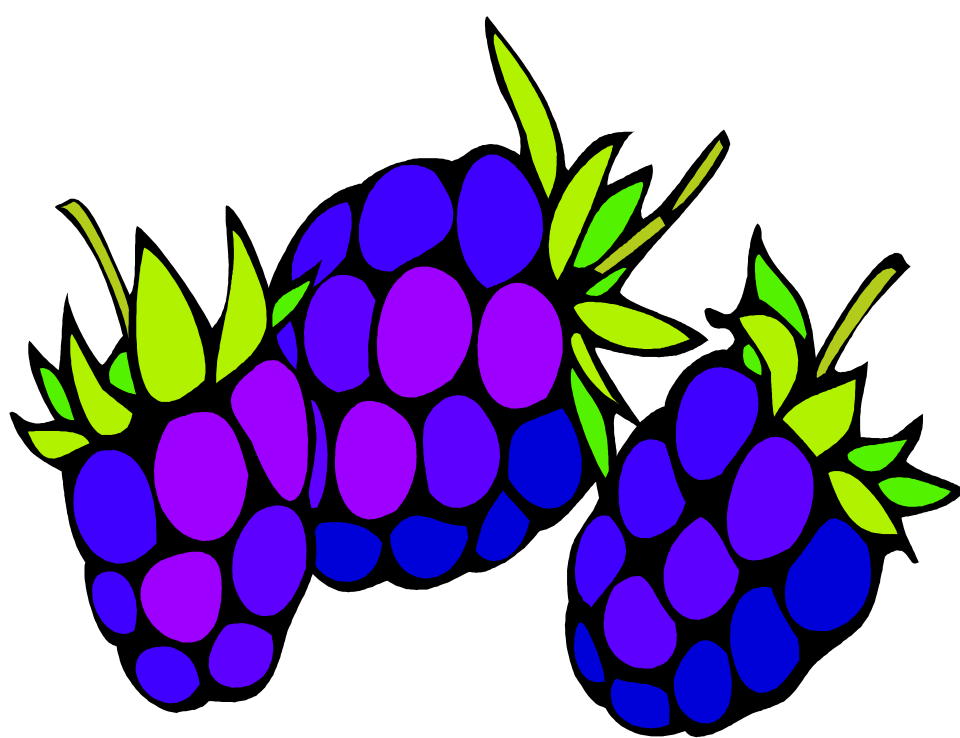




Mama Buggy lived deep in the forest, under a huge tree. She was a good rabbit mom and took very good care of her little family.

Mama Buggy was a hard working mom and very devoted to her household duties. Every day she would go with her daughter, Flopsy to gather plants and berries for a healthy meal.



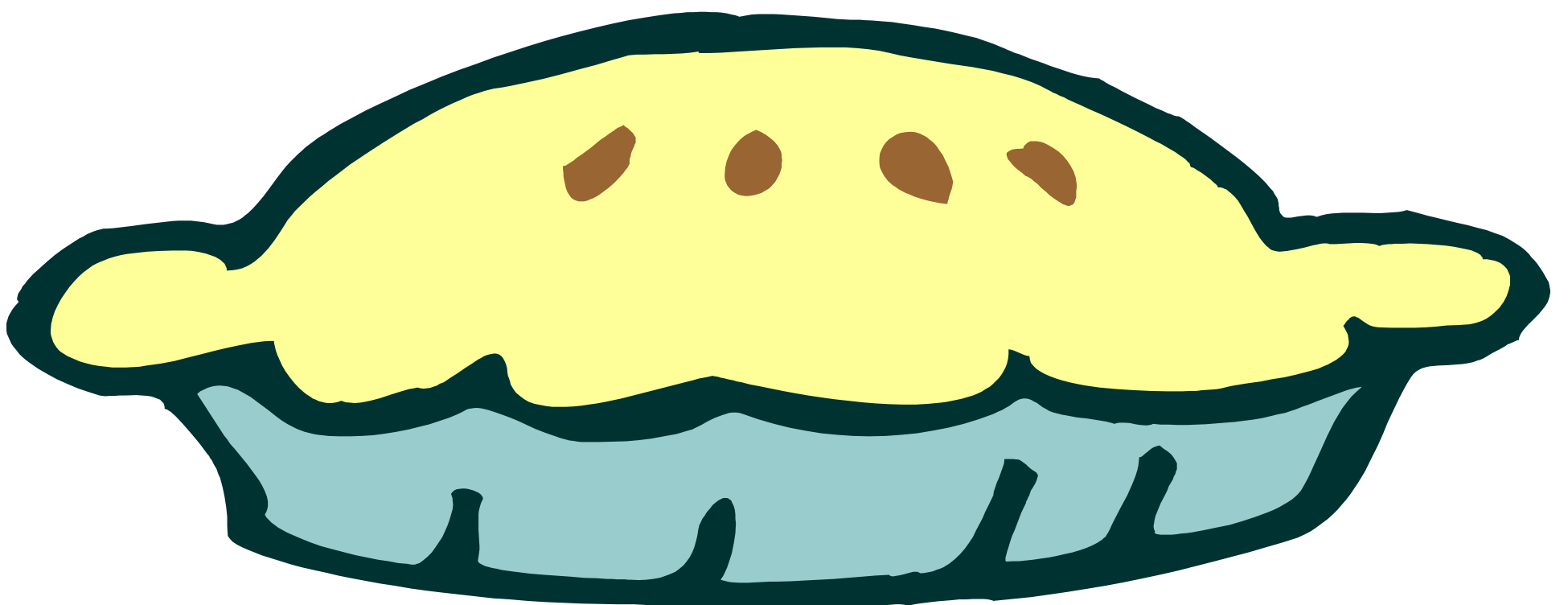
Especially now, they needed to get more food into the storage because fall started to show by the falling of the leaves and cooler nights.

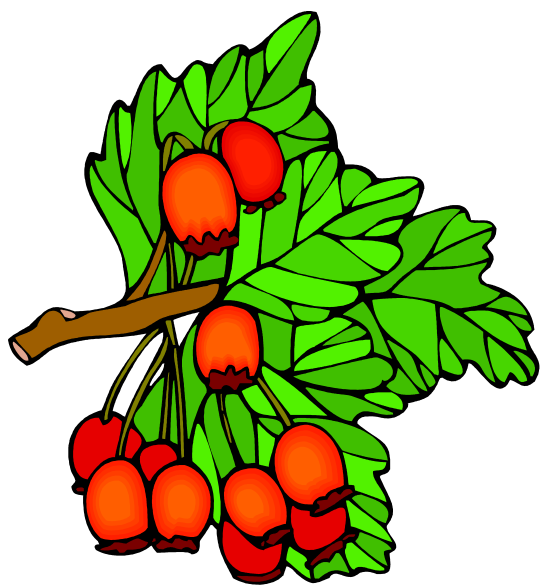

As they were all getting ready to go home later on in the evening, Mama Buggy invited Raccoon to live with them.

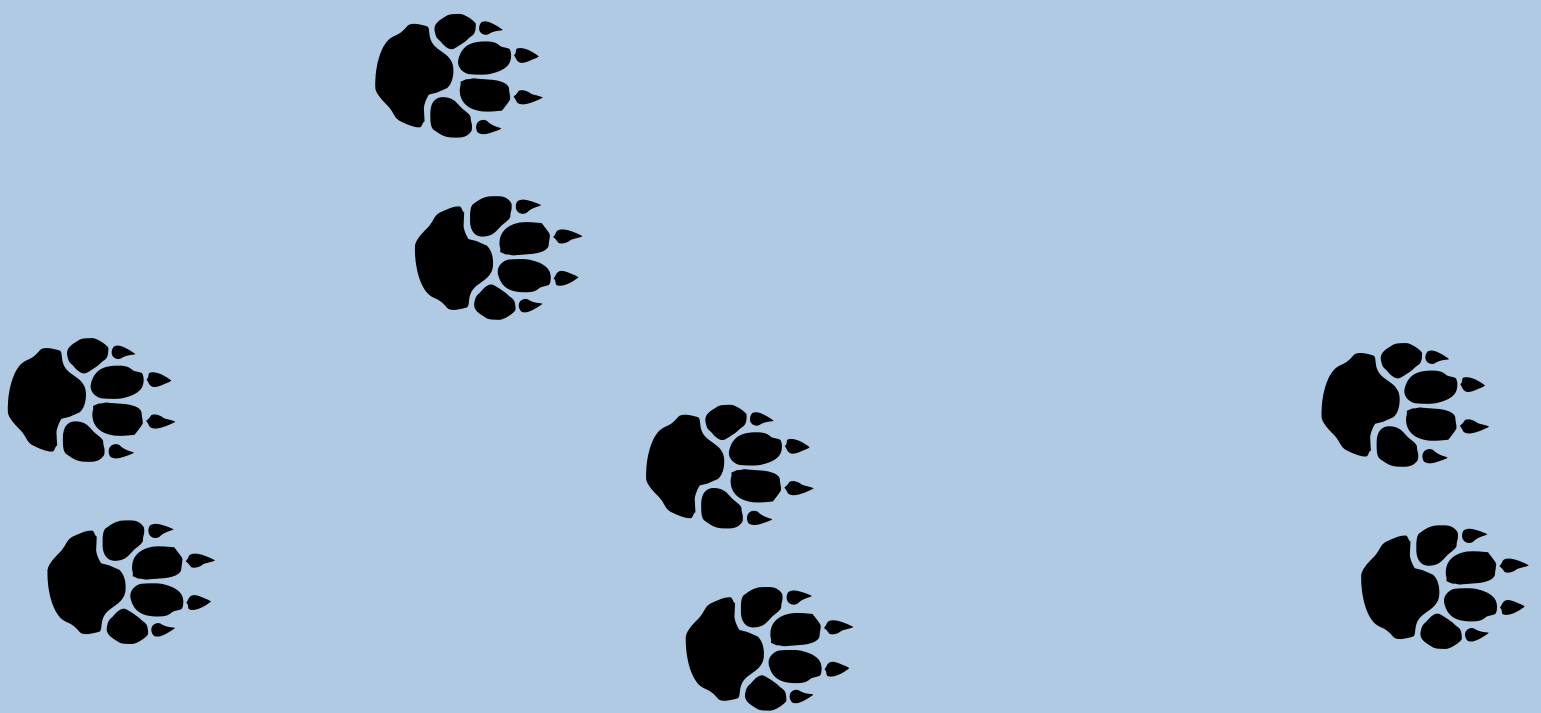
She said, "our home is lovely and spacious and there is one more place for our guest. We will have a great and happy family."

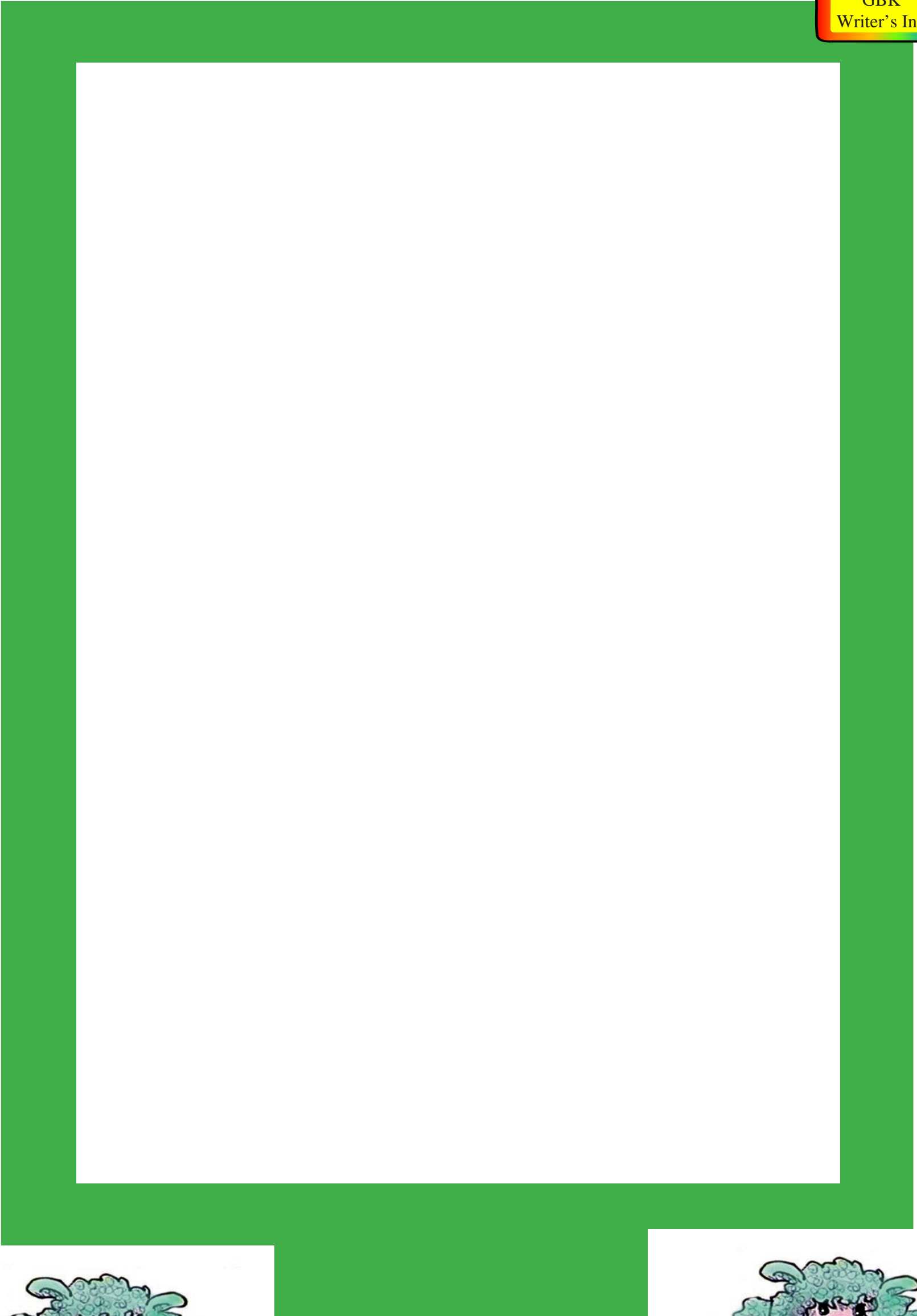


About the author

Sharing Ole Lumpy

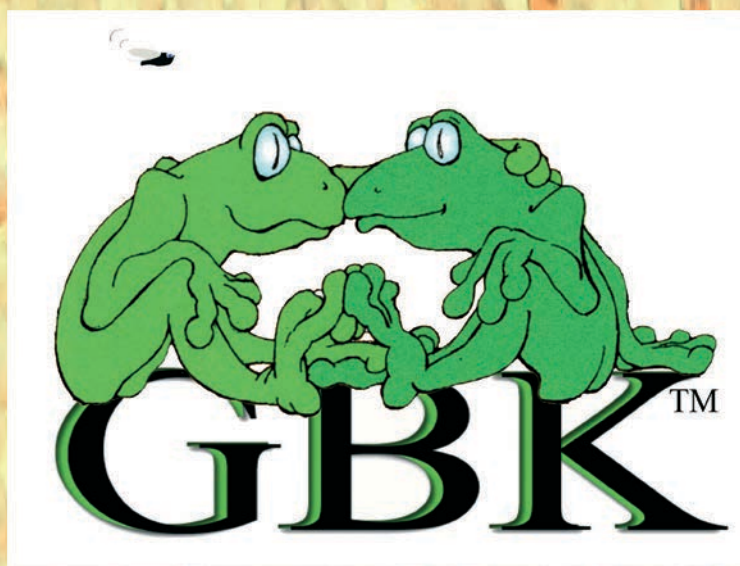




Mama Buggy helps children see that the animals share, so we should as well. Edelgard shares a heart felt story about a mama bunny who specializes in teaching the other critters to be share.
