



the left.


You might say they were in a rut, but they liked it.

They even gave it a name: 'Ole Lumpy'.








There were many fun times on Ole Lumpy. Soaker and Joker swam under it and hopped over it practicing their techniques.



Like racing cones for the practice sessions of a race driver, they hopped and ducked between the limbs trying to keep a rhythm until they reached the end of Ole Lumpy.







Sometimes they found frog eggs as they swam under it in their duck and hop adventures. The log was a great place to attach little eggs to grow up safe.




Mom hid them under a knob just out of eye view of predators. The owl, with his keen eyes never found the eggs when mom parked them under Ole Lumpy.






Pirougtting along the way, they twirled and looped, ducked and danced their way from one side to the next in a daring attempt to keep from falling into the stream.





Then, one day Warty, Soaker's little brother




invited himself to Ole Lumpy.






He would have certainly gotten sick from drinking too much muddy water if they had left him there to unstuck himself. He was difficult to control.












There was a real problem. How could they be in their favorite places but still including their little brother?




They decided it was impossible, so told him to go home. Then, they assumed their places and pretended to be happy. But, they weren't and they felt really guilty




because when they sent Warty home he hopped slowly hanging his head to the left. (Of course it was hanging to the left, because it wasn't right.)




That night a storm came that filled the river that fed the pond. As the water rose, the river got bigger. When the water reached the mouth




of the pond, it lifted Old Lumpy from her spot and floated her to the other side of the pond.





In the morning Soaker and Joker came out to assess the situation and found Ole Lumpy gone.



At first they blamed the beavers for taking her,








Warty had already claimed ownership of her. After all, she wasn't where she was before, so now, nobody had dibbs on her.




He claimed her as his log. In recognition of his new finding, he renamed her. "Floating Fatty" because she was fat and she had floated across the pond.


