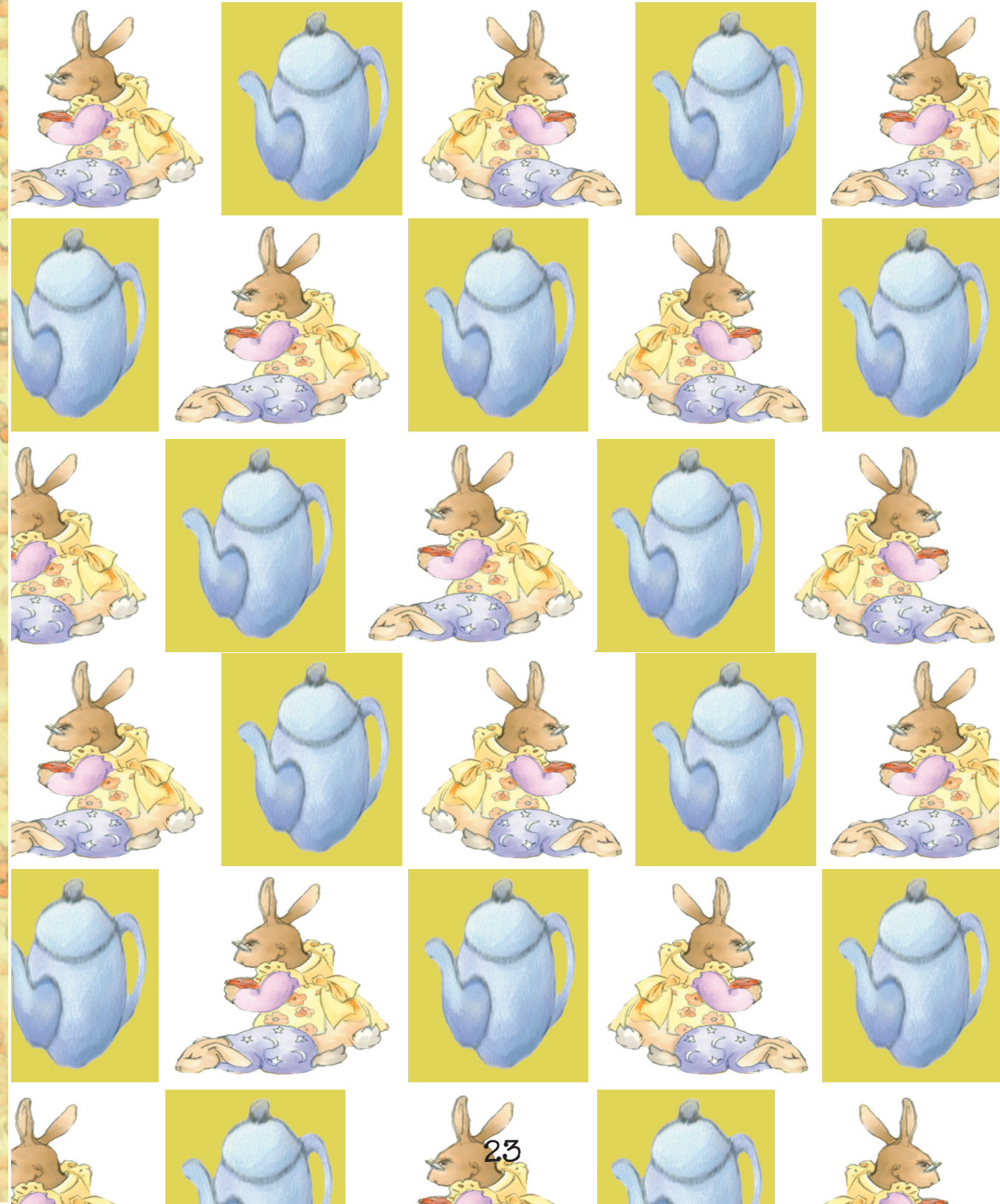

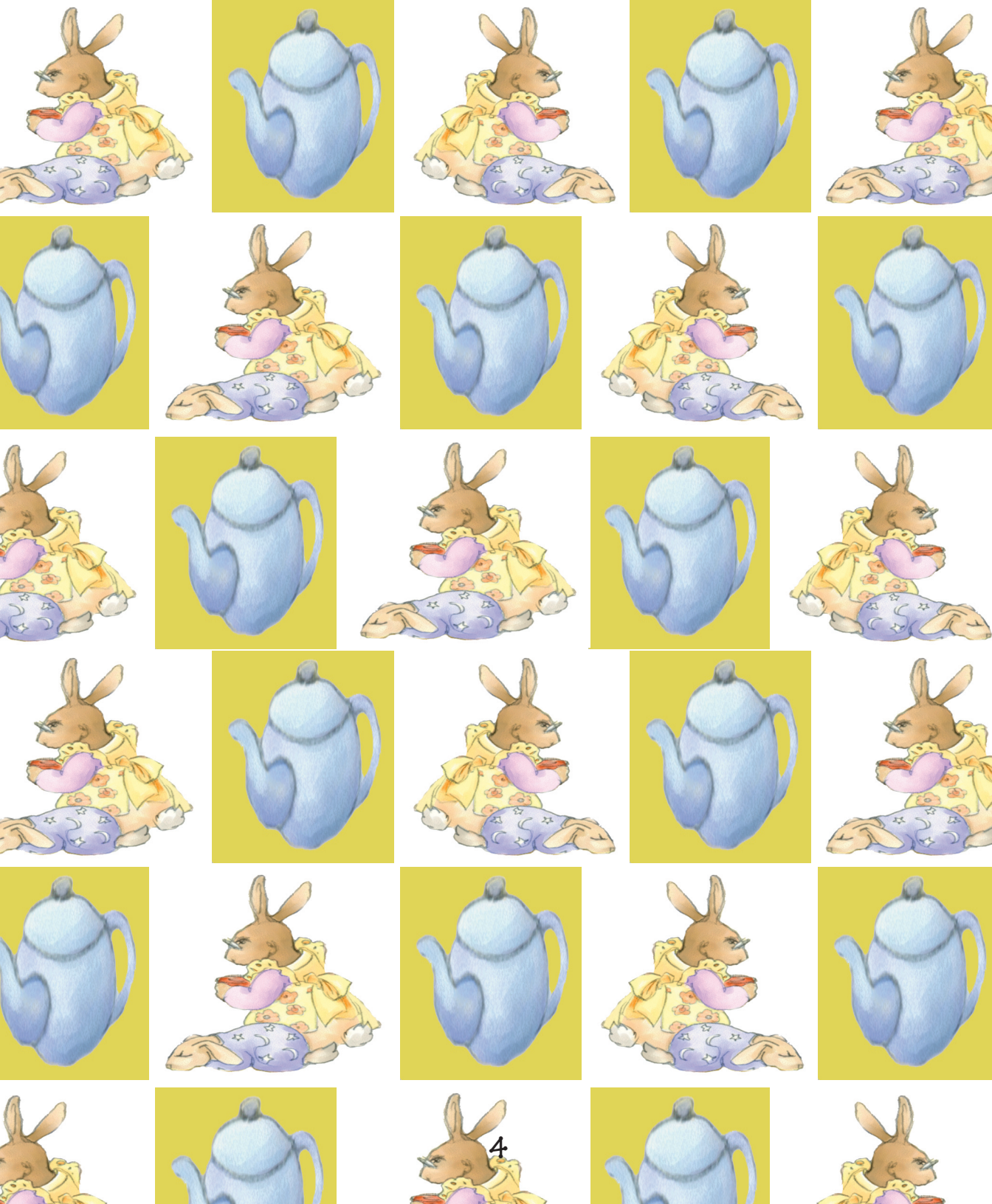

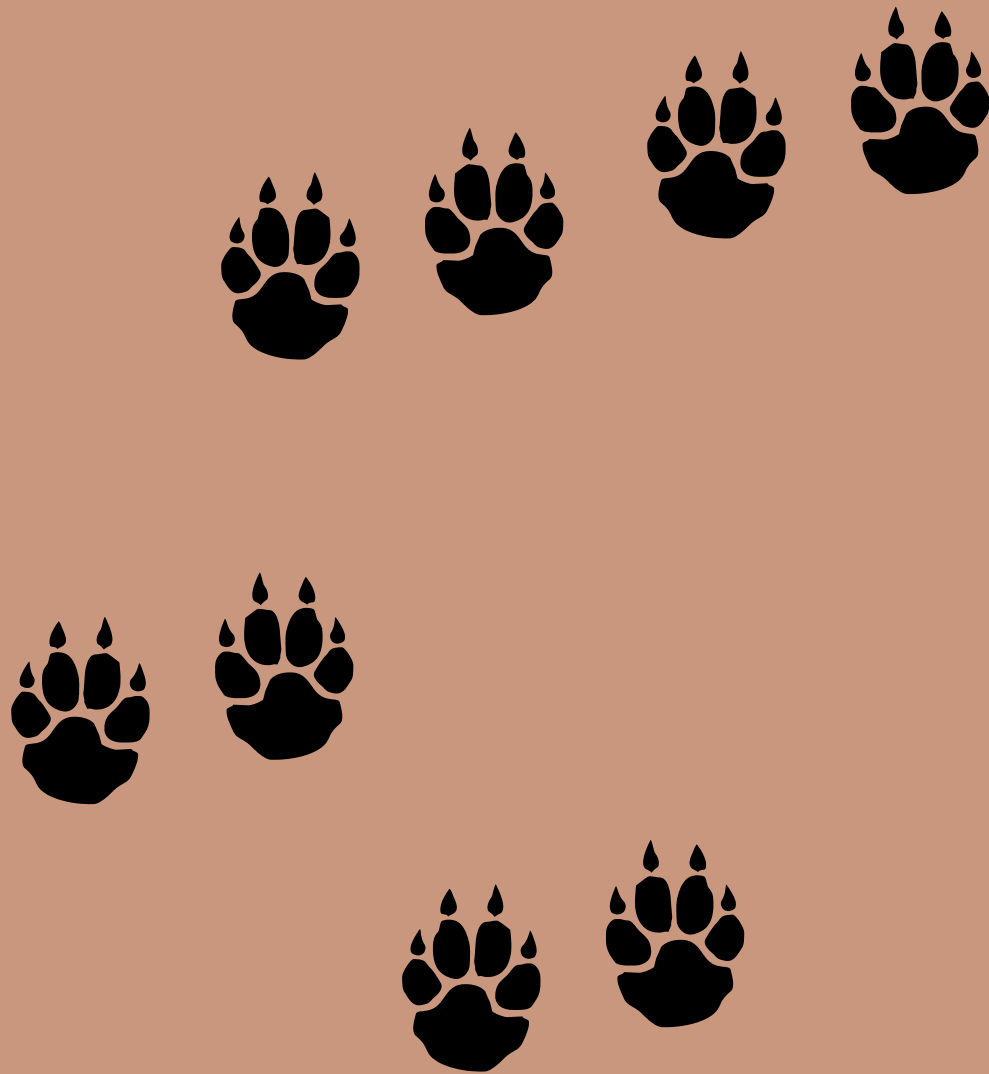


About the author

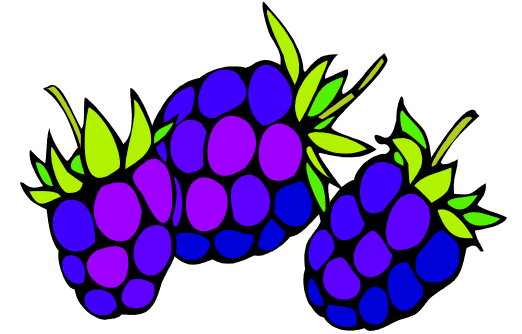




Mama Buggy lived deep in the forest, under a huge tree. She was a good rabbit mom and took very good care of her little family.

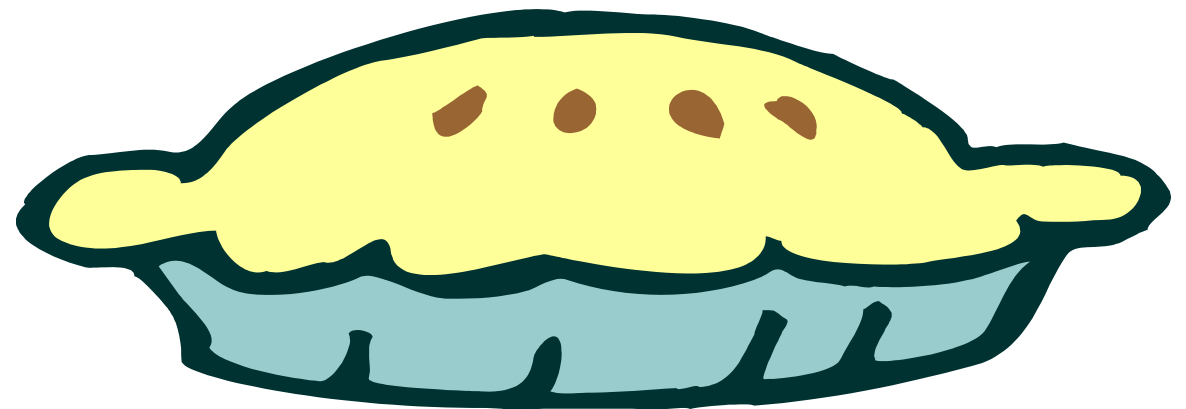
