Dear Dr Clondyke,

I am writing to refer this 61-year-old lady for further assessment.

Mrs Johnston came to my office 3 months ago with signs and symptoms of depression and anxiety. Initially, we discussed a few sessions of counselling, but later on decided to start on Sertraline 50mg daily. She reported some improvement in her symptoms after 6 weeks but returned with the same symptoms afterwards.

At the moment, her Sertraline dose is 100mg daily, and she has no suicidal ideation. Her sleep has improved but she continues to have early morning awakening and evening anxiety attacks.

I would be most grateful if you could kindly see Mrs Johnston with a view to further assessment and advice on her continued management.
