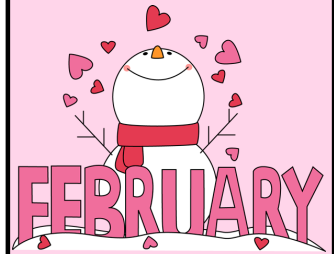

## From the Pastor



## TEN RULES FOR LENT

In his book, *The Power of Positive Thinking*, Norman Vincent Peale lists ten rules for becoming the kind of person whom other enjoy being around. Even though these principals were written almost 75 years ago, they still carry a power and wisdom that make them most relevant. They are:

1. Learn to remember names.
2. Be a very comfortable person so there is no strain in being with you-be an old-shoe, old-hat kind of individual. Be homey.
3. Acquire the quality of relaxed, easy-going ness so that things don't ruffle you.
4. Don't be egotistical. Guard against giving the impression that you know it all. Be normal and naturally humble.
5. Cultivate the quality of being interesting so that people will want to be with you and get something of stimulating value from their association with you.
6. Study to get the "scratchy" elements out of your personality.
7. Sincerely attempt to heal, on an honest Christian basis, every misunderstanding you have had and now have. Drain off your grievances.
8. Practice liking people.
9. Never miss an opportunity to say a word of congratulations upon anyone's achievement, or express sympathy in sorrow or disappointment.
10. Get a deep spiritual experience so that you have something to give people that will help them to be stronger and meet life more effectively. Give strength to people and they will give affection to you.

I think the above is good advice for all Christians. In this season of Lent, when we are so often intent on "giving up" something for the season...perhaps it would be good for us this year to embrace these principles for the season. Lenten worship...Sunday School and Faith Formation...regular Sunday Worship and Holy Communion...Prayer and acts of charity such as our Souper Bowl Offering and Lenten Offerings...all these will help us to naturally follow these precepts for healthy/fulfilled living.

Let's focus on the great love and sacrifice of Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord during these 40 days of Lent...and remember that we are called – each in our own way – to pick up our cross and follow Jesus.

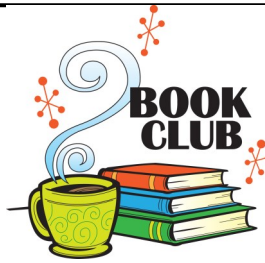


### LUTHERIDGE DATES HAVE BEEN SET FOR 2024

## WE ARE PROUD TO PARTNER WITH



OneBlood is a not-for-profit community asset responsible for providing safe, available and affordable blood to more than 200 hospital partners and their patients throughout most of Florida, parts of Georgia, Alabama, South Carolina and North Carolina.

- 1 in 3 of us will need a blood transfusion.
- A single blood donation can save 3 local lives. Whole blood is separated into three individual components, platelets, red cells & plasma.
- Cancer, transplant and trauma patients, and patients undergoing open-heart surgery require platelet transfusions to survive.
- Anyone in good health, at least 16 years old, and at least 110 pounds may donate whole blood every 56 days.
- The number one reason donors give blood is because they want to help others.

**FYI** In 2023, here at Kimball we collected 63 whole blood units – that’s 189 lives saved!! In addition to that, 8 double units were collected – that’s awesome!

## 2024 YEAR OF THE ENDOWMENT

In May of 2022, Kimball embarked on a new opportunity to move forward with service to our community by establishing an Endowment Fund for our congregation. Kimball has a long history - over 100 years - of serving the needs of people in Kannapolis and Cabarrus/Rowan counties. We have been especially strong in the areas of community outreach, youth activities both within and outside our church walls and we have a history of providing scholarships for deserving young people to attend summer camps, colleges, graduate schools and for theological education. This legacy of help and service is one of the many things that marks Kimball as a strong and caring part of our community and our North Carolina Synod.

The creation of our Endowment represents a perpetual financial gift to the church, whereby the principle of the gifts is not withdrawn, but continues to grow over time from additional gifts and investment returns. Our congregation believes this will ensure the continuing legacy of our Christian Spirit long into the future. Once the Endowment receives contributions, regular distributions will be made each year in support of the three areas which have been identified in our bylaws.

1. *Up to 100% can be used for Youth Ministries.*
2. *Up to 100% can be used for Community Outreach.*
3. *Up to 100% can be used for Scholarships.*

Now for the best part. Your Endowment committee has received full support from our leadership and council to declare 2024 as "The Year of the Endowment." Each month in 2024 you will see informative articles, specific fundraising opportunities as well as testimonials from members who have already included the Endowment in their legacy plans.

To begin the year, the Endowment committee has created a name for our Endowment. This name will help in our efforts to market and promote the wonderful legacy that the Endowment will leave to our congregation now and for many decades in the future. This will truly show the Kimball spirit. Beginning with this communication, Our Endowment will be known as the

## LAY PREACHING SCHOOL PROGRAM

Kimball member, Tony Lippard has been accepted into the North Carolina Synod's Lay Preaching School. This program is part of the Advanced Lay Ministries program that also includes the SAM (Synod Authorized Ministers) program.

The Lay Preaching School was established to provide instruction and formation for preaching—to fill pulpits across the synod so that rostered ministers can take vacation, complete continuing education or, in some cases, provide a Service of the Word worship for congregations who do not have a regularly-called pastor right now.

This is an 18 month program that includes classes in theology, Old and New Testament, worship, and the largest number of classes will focus on preaching.

For those who do not know Tony, he has been a member of Kimball since 2017. He attends the 11:00 am worship service where he serves as worship assistant, lector, and runs the slides for the projection of the services on the screens. He has just come off a two-and-a-half-year term on the congregational council. He is married to Paula Lippard and they have two grown children that live in Pennsylvania.
