From the Pastor

During June (and July) we return in our readings to the Gospel of St. Mark, and to the themes Mark emphasizes – a sense of urgency, focus, and the breaking in of the Kingdom of God among us. In August we'll move to the reading of St. John, as we delve into the 6th chapter and learn everything we need to know about Jesus as the Bread of Life.

The color of the Season is Green, reminding us of the Growth of the Church (and growing things all around us in Summer). An early church Saint – Hildegard – coined the word *viriditas* which means – if you remember your High School Latin – the greening force of the Holy Spirit. Hildegard says that the Holy Spirit is “the greening power in motion, making all things grow, expand, and celebrate.” If you're a fan of the Green Bay Packers, the Philadelphia Eagles, the Boston Celtics (and any other 'Green Team')...or if you just LOVE green, you're in for a treat for the next five months, as our paraments will basically be green – until late October.

I know that many will be traveling over these next weeks. Please do remember that your church NEVER goes on Vacation – Sunday School and Faith Formation will continue throughout the Summer months, and our worship schedule does not change. Your presence when you are in town is so very special to us during these months, and your gifts for the church in this time of lower attendance will be most appreciated as well. Please remember that we have a number of fellowship and camping events in Summer – so please do read your bulletins and newsletters carefully to stay up to date on Summer activities. I wish you a happy, restful time of re-creation during these “quieter times”...and hope that the beauty of God's creation inspires and revives you.

45TH ANNIVERSARY OF CAMPFIRMATION AT KIMBALL MEMORIAL

Eight of our young people will enjoy a summer week at Lutheridge, our Lutheran camp near Asheville, June 16-21. The week is known as Campfirmation and is an integral part of Confirmation instruction. During the week, our students will focus on the themes of Witness, Service, Prayer, Forgiveness, and Living the Christian Life. We join with other Lutheran Congregations in North and South Carolina and Virginia for this week of study and fun. During the week, in addition to their times of study, students (about 80 this year) will enjoy times of recreation at our beautiful camp.

Kimball Memorial was one of the first congregations in the NC Synod to begin a Campfirmation week, just one year after the program began. This year marks 45 years of our congregation participating in this special week. Pastor Palmer Clemmer introduced this program to the congregation in 1979, and so many of our members have very fond memories of spending a week at Lutheridge or Lutherock, where they grew closer to Christ, to their pastors and to their friends. This year for the first time, with many of our members attending other camping programs AND our large contingent of "Carver Campers", we've chartered a bus to make our journey up and down the mountain. How pleased we are to have this need for a large bus in 2024!

Please pray for Deacon Liz and Pastor John who will be helping to lead this week away – and who will both be receiving patches marking years of attendance (more about that in our July Newsletter!) and for Jodie and Jon Todd Hott, who have done so much to help with this Carver program. Also please pray for all our children and youth attending camp. UPDATE FROM THE LDR CAROLINAS SEVERE WEATHER AND HAIL STORM YORK COUNTY, SC

We requested a \$10,000 Solidarity Grant from Lutheran

Disaster Response to help with unmet needs in York County. That grant has been given to Epiphany Lutheran Church in Rock Hill to be disbursed as needed. There is some good news: SC Emergency Management recently confirmed that damage in York County qualified for a state disaster declaration, which will make additional funding available for the recovery there.

RECENT POLICE SHOOTING CHARLOTTE, NC

The recent shooting in Charlotte which resulted in the deaths of four law enforcement officers occurred in the neighborhood near St. Thomas Lutheran Church. Pastor Rich Hogg and members of the church recently hosted a meal for the local homeowners association, with funding assistance from the NC Synod Disaster Fund. Bishop Tim Smith attended that event. The congregation is also planning a meal for the local police precinct during the summer and we will be assisting with that meal as well.

REPLACEMENT BRIDGE PROJECT LINCOLN COUNTY, NC.

A private bridge in Lincoln County, NC, which serves 26 families was washed away - again - in the heavy rain last week. Fortunately, Mennonite Disaster Services (MDS) has already been planning to build a replacement bridge for that neighborhood. Lutheran Disaster Response has provided a \$75,000 grant to assist with the funding, but volunteers are needed to help with that project beginning in early June. 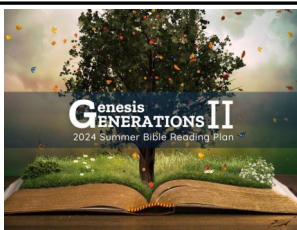

SUMMER BIBLE READING PLAN

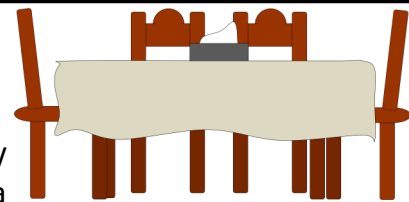
Join folks across the synod to read the Bible together—individuals, congregations, small groups—in this year's Summer
