From the Pastor...

SUCCESSFUL FAILURES

"In the Cross of Christ I Glory, Towering O'er the Wrecks of Time..."



With school starting up in earnest this month, I found myself thinking about my own school days back in Rockingham, and how important it was to make the grade. While never wanting to discount the value of being on the 'Honor Roll', isn't it interesting how many successful people begin as failures:

- Ignace Paderewski, the great Polish pianist, was once told by his music teacher that his hands were much too small to master the keyboard.
- The great Italian tenor, Enrico Caruso, was told by his teacher that his voice
 sounded like "the wind whistling through the window."
- When the incomparable British statesman, Benjamin Disraeli, attempted to speak in Parliament for the first time, members hissed him into silence and laughed when he said, "Though I sit down now, the time will come when you will hear me."
- Henry Ford forgot to put a reverse gear in his first car.
- In 1902, the poetry editor of *The Atlantic Monthly* sent a sheaf of poems back to a 28-year old poet with this curt note: "Our magazine has no room for your vigorous verse." The poet was Robert Frost.
- In 1905, the University of Bern turned down a Ph.D. dissertation as being "irrelevant and fanciful". The student was Albert Einstein.
- The rhetoric teacher at the Harrow School in England wrote this on sixteen-yearold Winston Churchill's end of year report: "A conspicuous lack of success would seem to be your destiny in life."
- Thomas Edison once spent \$2,000,000 on an invention that proved to be a flop.

In Jesus' day, many could have looked on his ministry as a failure: It was only three years in length; of his closest followers – one betrayed him, one denied him and they all ran away; part of its culmination was the brutality of a cross – a humiliating, demeaning death inflicted on criminals and enemies of the empire.


And yet, over time we have seen that it was out of His weakness that Jesus ministered to the world. And it is from the Cross that Our Lord Jesus reigns! What looked like failure to the world became Christ's Glory.

Whether you're going back to school this fall...or just reminiscing about those days from the past, please remember that failure is never fatal — it is the courage to continue that counts! As that great theologian Vince Lombardi once said, "Success is not in never falling. Success is found in getting up every time we fall!"





FROM YOUR ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE

WHAT IS A GIFT OF MARKETABLE SECURITIES?

Gifts of marketable securities, such as appreciated stocks and/or mutual funds held more than a year can support the Lasting Legacy Endowment and the long-term ministries we care so much about. Gifting an appreciated security can help you avoid capital gains, which can be as high as 20% and earn a tax deduction based on the value of your gift.

For you to enjoy the tax advantages of this type of gift, the securities must be transferred directly to the Lasting Legacy Endowment prior to being sold. If you have an interest in making a gift of this type, simply ask a member of the Endowment committee. We can put you or your financial advisor in direct contact with broker/dealer to initiate the transfer.

Additionally, if you would like to retain ownership of your securities during your lifetime but transfer all or a portion of them after your death, this can be accomplished easily. Simply contact your financial advisor and add the Kimball Lutheran Church Endowment (must use our official name) as a TOD (transfer on death). This means upon your death the assets will be transferred directly to the Endowment without going through your estate.


As always, you should ask your tax advisor if you have tax related questions. And know that the endowment committee is available to help in any way.




