





and: we give of our time, energy, and hearts, and at the same time we receive God's love in return. I often remind our young people that everyone in our congregations—member or visitor alike—are "our people," and that we, in turn, "our their people" meaning we belong to them. God calls us to connect not only our congregations to one another, but also to the wider community, loving our neighbors with the same grace and tenderness Christ shows us.

As the wonder of Epiphany still lingers, Lent draws near, inviting us into holy reflection on the great sacrifice Jesus made for each of us. It is a season to remember God's immense love and to follow Christ's example as we seek to be shaped more fully in God's image. With our children and youth, we often speak of Lent as a time to pause, to say "I'm sorry, and I'll do it differently the next time" and to mean it—to turn our hearts back toward God and to live differently because of that grace.

One of my favorite passages to share during this season, especially with children and families, comes from Micah 6:8: "He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"

It beautifully captures the heart of Lent in words young and old can hold onto—loving kindness, seeking what is right, and walking gently with God.

As ministers, many of us teach the rhythm of the church year with songs, colors, and stories, helping even our youngest learners discover that each season carries its own promise. As you enter this holy season of Lent, may you be renewed by God's love, encouraged by the communities you serve, and assured that the Holy Spirit walks with you in every classroom, sanctuary, fellowship hall, and neighborhood.

Peace and blessings on your upcoming Lenten journey.







CHURCH COUNCIL



GREETINGS FROM YOUR CHURCH COUNCIL,

The Council held their first meeting of 2026.

- Volunteers are still needed for the children and middle/high school Faith Formation Sunday School classes. The lesson plan has already been completed and all materials will be provided before the date you sign up. If you need assistance signing up or have questions about the different roles needed, please reach out to Hannah Wiethorn or Deacon Liz.
- The hearing assistance devices have arrived and will be available soon. We were able to increase our purchase from 6 to 10 devices.
- The air conditioning/heater combo unit, that supports the commons area, is in the process of being replaced. Once the work on this unit is completed the cost will be approximately \$27,000.
- The grant for \$50,000 was received from the Cannon Charitable Trust and will be used to replenish reserves that have been used for HVAC repairs in 2025.
- With the large offering received in December, the church completed the year with a budget income over expense surplus of \$26,000.

The Council would like to thank you for your continued support of our ministries.
