# FROM THE PASTOR WHAT AMERICANS ARE AFRAID OF

The Sunday supplement for the New York Times, recently ran a cover story entitled "Fear: What Americans Are Afraid of Today". With all the events in the news recently, prompting concern among most Americans, here's what readers told the NYT

- 63% are afraid of a nuclear war
- 54% are afraid of being in a car crash.
- 53% are afraid of having cancer
- 50% are afraid of inadequate Social Security
- 49% are afraid of not having enough money for retirement
- 36% are afraid of getting food poisoning from meat
- 35% are afraid of getting Alzheimer's
- 33% are afraid of being a victim of violence
- 32% are afraid of being unable to pay current debts
- 25% are afraid of natural disasters

### Other findings:

- Is the world a safer place than when you were growing up? No, say 9 in 10
   Americans
- 4 in 10 Americans feel unsafe taking a walk alone at night within a half-mile of home
- 1 in 5 fears being caught in a public place with a suicide bomber

While I know there is much about our world today that is frightening, we must always remember that as followers of Christ there should be much more of faith about us than of fear! As Dr. Hudson Taylor reminded us in a sermon I heard him preach in Chapel Hill, "We don't need a great faith...but we do need faith in a great God!"

I hope that these Biblical texts will give you hope and confidence as you read the newspapers and watch the TV Newscasts over this long, hot summer:

- Luke 1:45 Believe that there will be fulfillment of the promises that God makes to us.
- Romans 4:20-21 Believe that God's promises do not waver, and be fully convinced that God will perform what God promises.
- **Hebrews 11:1** The substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen!


### REMEMBER KIMBALL MEMORIAL THIS SUMMER

# NEW SOCIAL MINISTRY PROGRAM



a Senior Food Assistance Program The Social Ministry Committee met with Second Harvest and CCM staff to start a new project for Kimball. The program is called CSFP (Commodity Supplemental Food Program) and is a government sponsored monthly food distribution for Seniors. We will start with deliveries up to 29 individuals and keep up with the calls and paperwork required. Our plan is to host the deliveries on the fourth Monday of each month, 8:30 -10:00 am, starting in July. CCM will assist with enrolling clients and bringing the packaged food to Kimball. Right now, we will use the committee for distribution, but we will be needing some more volunteers in the future.
