CAMPAIGN KICKS OFF THIS MONTH!



75 Years is a long time to form faith among our young people, developed leaders for the greater church, and built community among those who attend, but Lutheridge our beloved camp near Asheville - has done all those things. Beginning in February our congregation will begin a two-year, \$50,000 campaign to help insure that this Lutheran Camp will continue to grow and serve other generations for another 75 years. This month, you'll hear and read information about the exciting plans for Lutheridge, and the \$3.6 million dollar campaign to make these good (and necessary!) things take place. Among the goals:

- 1. To update and renovate important facilities that have been so important for so long Whisnant Chapel, Lakeside Lodge, our Faith Center, and Kohnjoy Inn.
- 2. To build new spaces as the landscape of the Church continues to change, allowing us to adapt to groups seeking to use the Camp year round. These changes will include new Hillside cabins, new cottages in Pioneer A (where so many of our children/youth have stayed over the years) and transforming Mission Hall into housing suitable for all ages.
- 3. To sow seeds for a faithful future by paying off debt much of it incurred during the two Covid summers that were so difficult for Lutheridge, and from the terrible effects of Hurricane Helene. Paying down this debt is integral to the future of a strong camp - Remember when we did this at Kimball Memorial? It freed us to do ministry in new and exciting ways...and it will for Lutheridge as well!

For the next several weeks we'll hear more about these programs and possibilities, and we'll have the opportunity to make a commitment to help Kimball reach this goal of \$50,000 - a goal which will allow us to make a naming gift in Kimball's name to our Camp. This is so appropriate for us at Kimball Memorial, because for years our congregation has supported Lutheridge through Campfirmation, Wild Women's Weekends, Winter Retreats, etc. Last Summer, we sent 24 of our young people to camp...and 20 young people from our Carver School Connections. We have a history...and a present...and a future with this camp!

I sincerely hope that you'll join Anne and me, our congregation council, and our Lutheridge committee in making a commitment to this important appeal on Sunday, February 23rd. If you have any questions about this appeal, please don't hesitate to contact me for more information.








Free Lenten Guides
