### FROM THE PASTOR.....The New Buzz Word: Resiliency

These have been difficult days recently around the world with crises in Gaza, Ukraine, and here at home. *Time Magazine* recently featured a cover story on the subject of resilience, asking the question: "Why do some people bounce while others break?" In other words, how do we handle trying and difficult and scary times???

The writer defined resilience as the "ability to get through, get over, and thrive after trauma, trials and tribulations." A simpler definition just refers to resiliency as the ability to "bounce back". The article went on to say that while self-esteem was the buzz word in the first 20 years of the  $21^{st}$  Century, resilience was going to be the new emphasis in these days marked by great struggle.

Al Siebert, Ph.D. in his book, *The Survivor Personality*, claims that emotional resilience comes from developing the following attributes:

- ⇒ Be curious, play and laugh. Life's best survivors have a child-like curiosity.
- ⇒ Learn from unpleasant experiences. Treat difficult situations like a workout at the gym You do your very best, pause afterward to reflect on what happened, and ask, "What can I learn from this?" Then imagine yourself doing better next time.
- ⇒ Develop strong self-esteem. Self-esteem works like a thick skin or blanket of energy around you.
- ⇒ Practice empathy for difficult people. Either find a way to love and appreciate them, or acknowledge that their opinions really don't matter and move on!
- ⇒ Expect good outcomes. Anticipate that things are going to go well in any given situation. So often…our results are predicted by our expectations.
- ⇒ Trust God's presence to give you strength in every situation. As Christians, we are not promised any sort of refuge from difficult times but we are assured of God's presence and power in all times. This is one of God's greatest gifts to us!

Remember the powerful words from Romans 8: "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril or sword?...No, In all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us."

Please know that loving thoughts and many prayers are with all our members in both hard and joyous times, and that all Christians are invited and encouraged to pray daily for the Church, our Community and our World.

### **Crop Hunger Walk & Fellowship**


Sunday, October 12, 12:15pm
