In the spirit of reconciliation, the Indigenous Relation Team (IRT) will offer a **single point of contact** focused on **building and maintaining meaningful relationships** with First Nations, Métis and Inuit communities and interested parties **based on mutual respect and trust.**



Building and **maintaining** relationships with interested parties through regular meetings to provide updates on Commission proceedings.



Identifying regulatory processes initiated by the Commission that may be of **interest** to Indigenous communities and other interested parties.



Supporting new and ongoing consultations and **promoting** and **encouraging collaboration** through various engagement mechanisms with Indigenous communities to **facilitate** their participation in these processes.

What We Plan To Do



 Promoting information sharing and reconciliation throughout the Commission with Indigenous communities and interested parties.




• **Supporting** a collaborative approach between Indigenous partners and various policy teams within the CRTC.

Work Done To Date



- Supporting the IBP Team with a CRTC Conversations
 Project, Broadband Fund Indigenous Stream, Subsidy
 in the Far North, and Emergency Alerts proceedings.
 Our team will be working on helping to measure the
 success of proceedings like the IBP and Telecom in
 the North.





Who Are We Talking To?

- Externally, the IRT has held **informal/introductory discussions** with multiple organizations.
- Including, but not limited to, the AFN, ISO, APTN, and more.
- These external partners have responded positively to the creation of our team and expressed interest in working with us to help them navigate CRTC processes and projects.
- We have also met with the Public Participation Team to discuss a review of the Cost Awards Process. We hope to engage with Indigenous broadcasters on how to include them in such a process.











Work With Commissioners
