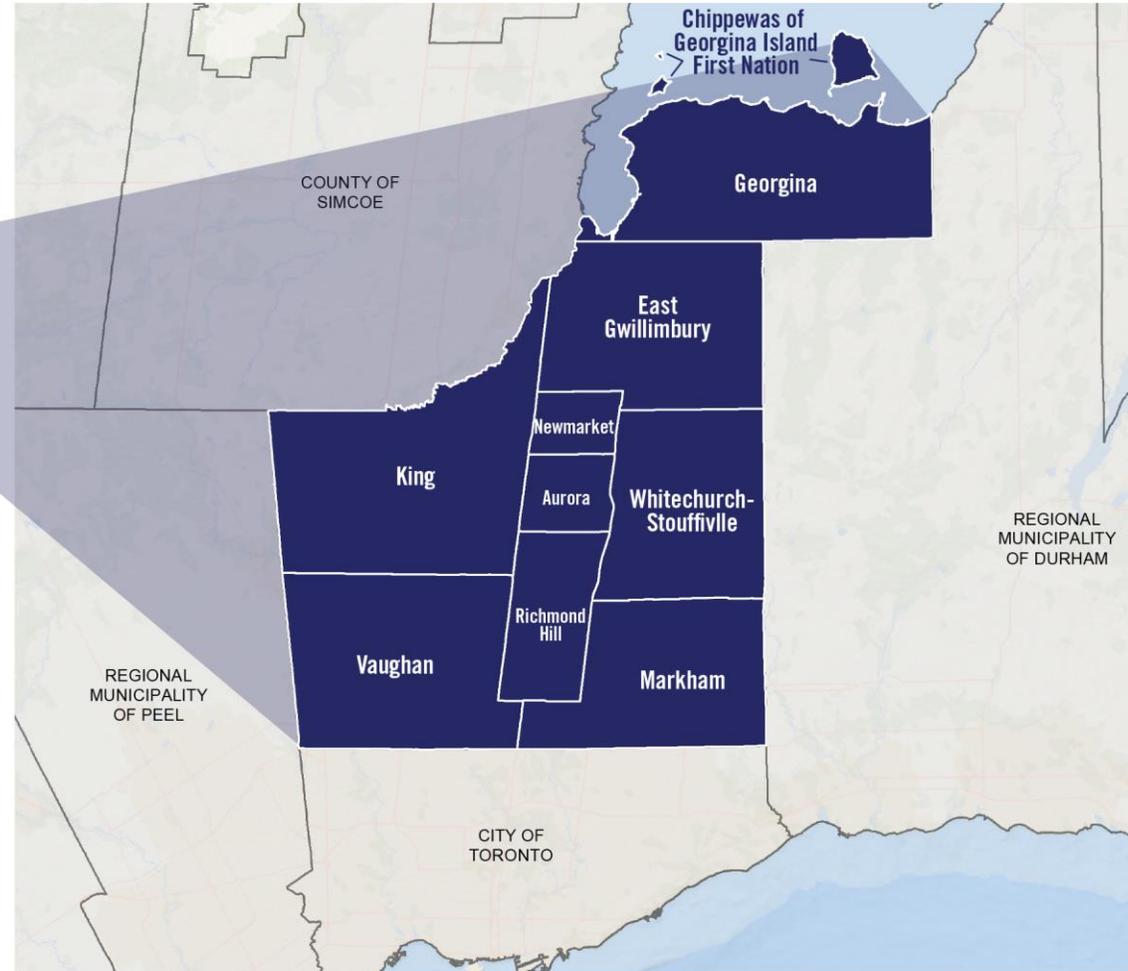

**Nine municipalities**

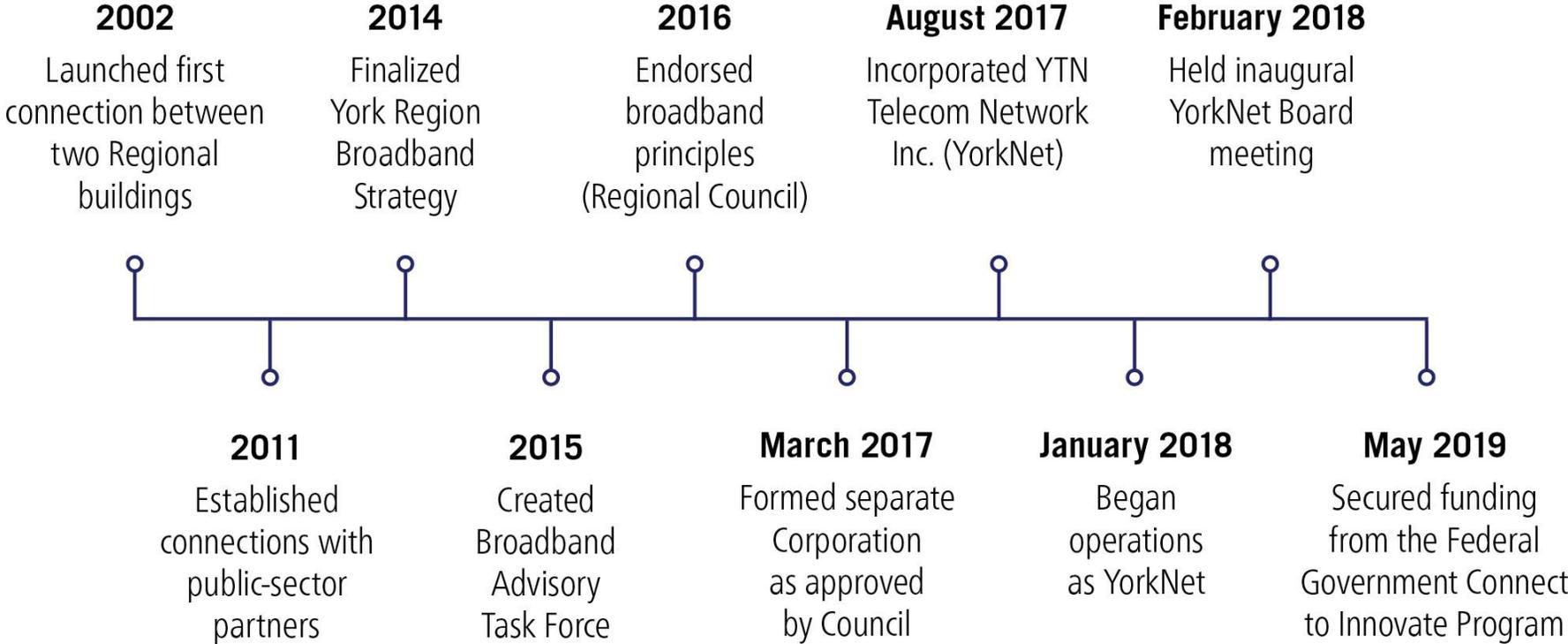


## About YorkNet

## Private sector



- Providers decide when and where to bring high-speed solutions to communities
- Communities may struggle to keep pace for economic success

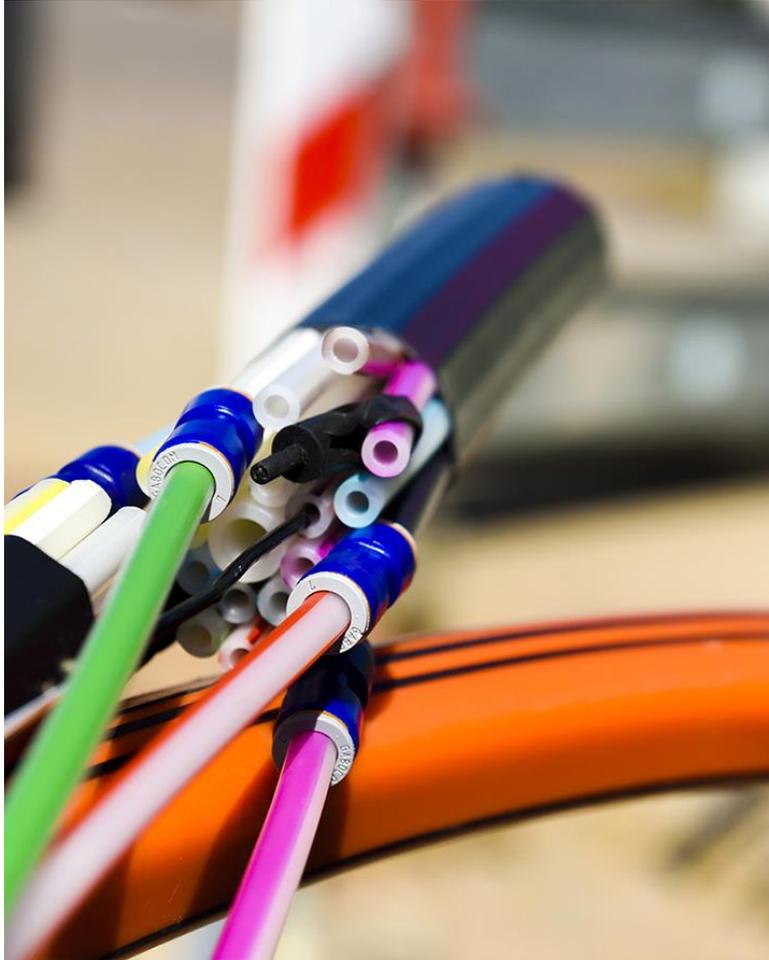


## Public and private partnerships



- Public and private sector partners collaborate to provide high-speed internet service to communities
- Enables a commitment to the community to ensure that dollars are spent responsibly





## Build it



- Communities have decided to build their own networks
- Often provided through Local Distribution Companies (LDC) who have the technology and means to monitor and manage connectivity
- Some build through local municipalities
- Offers open access to bringing the potential for high-speed internet to businesses and households

## Funding considerations

- Competitive process
- Must meet criteria eligibility
- Reporting requirements
- Eligible expenses
- Time constraints

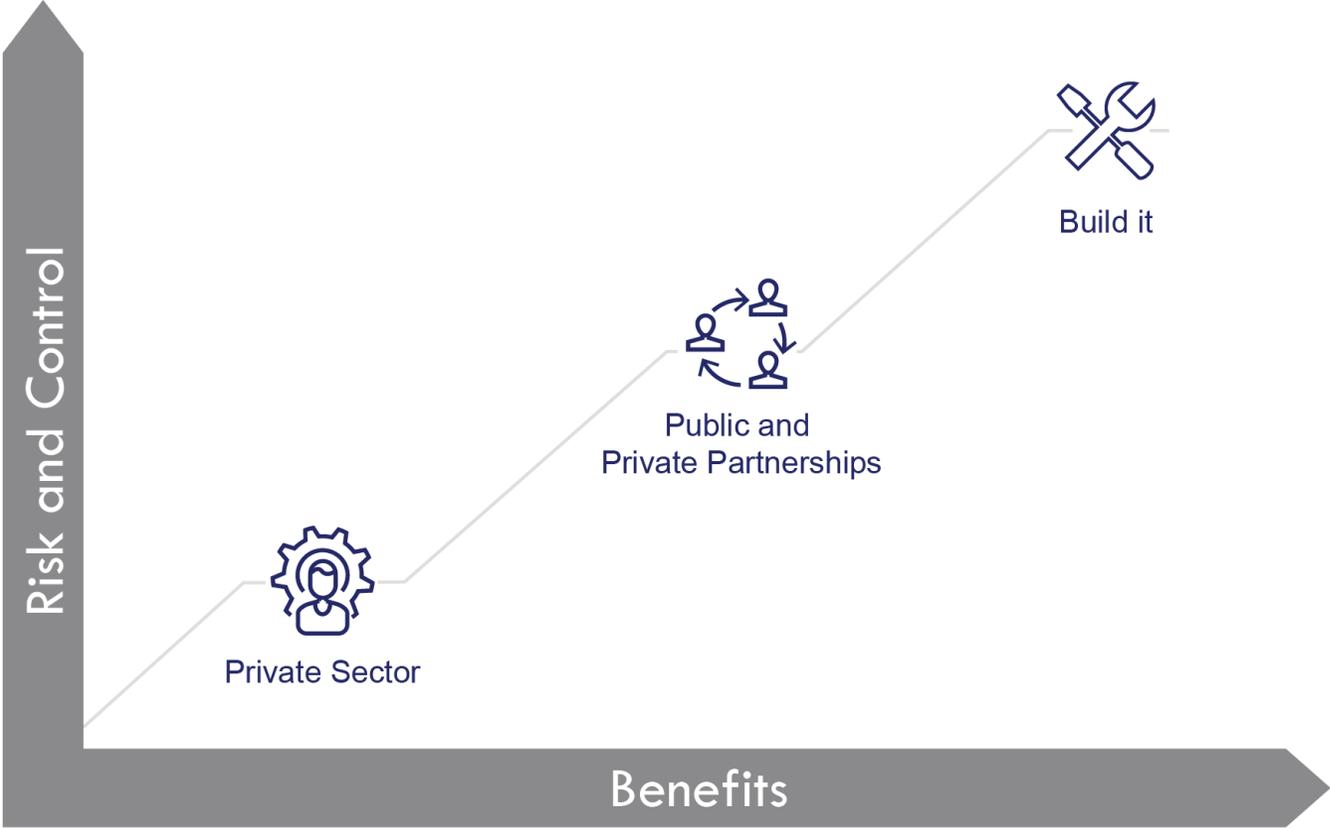


## YorkNet's Build It model

- Building dark fibre and leasing to others
- Co-building in rural areas allows private internet service providers to deliver high-speed internet to new areas and enables government to address specific needs



# Funding model considerations

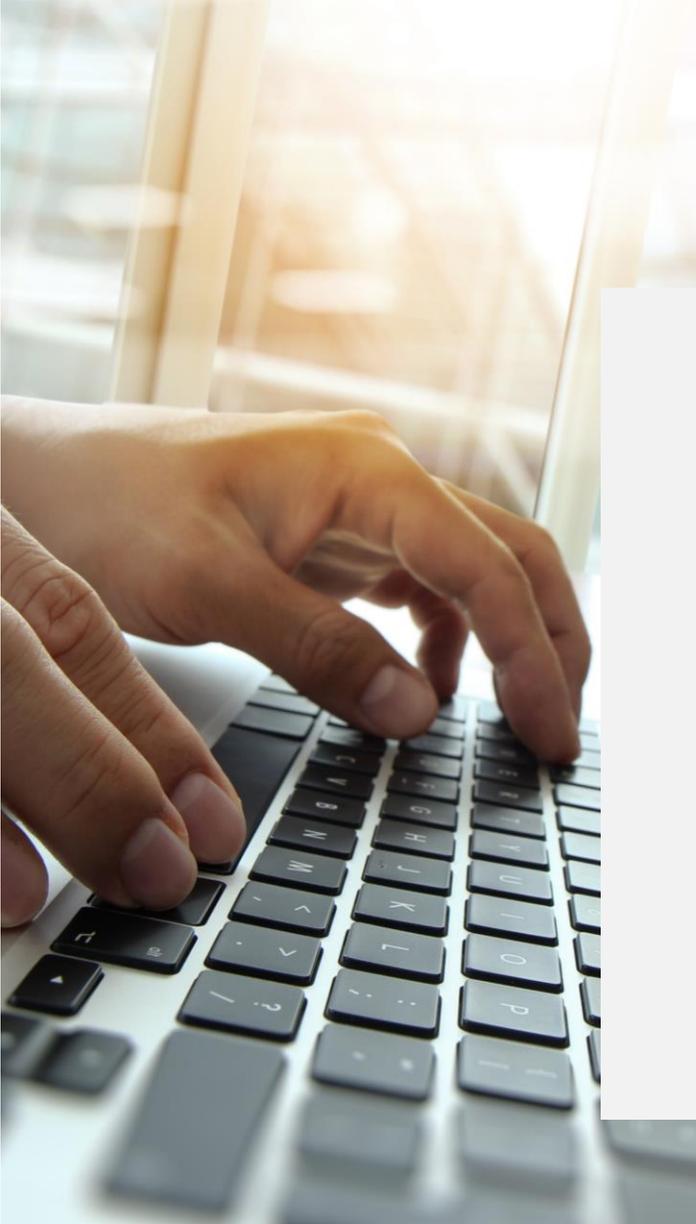


## Funding benefits

### Applying for funding can:

- Support areas unable to attract private sector investment
- Provide an opportunity to build the network sooner
- Address the need to advance connectivity for future needs





## Funding options

**Applications to apply for funding can be made through:**

- Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC)
- Province of Ontario (awaiting funding details)
- Connect To Innovate (CTI)
- Investing In Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP)

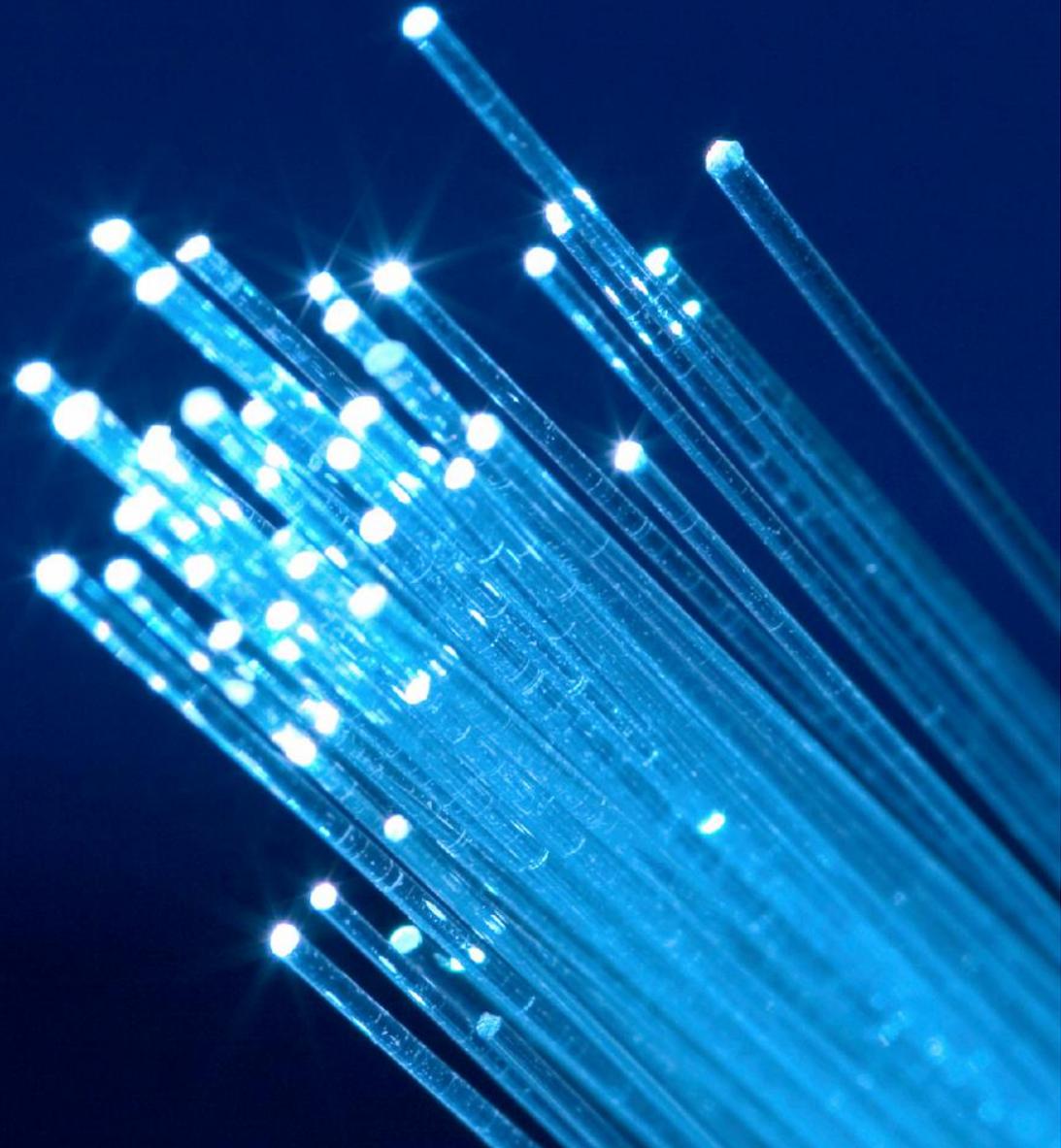




## The future is bright for broadband
