Deepalaya was established to promote the voluntary action from the grass root level in the field of complete rehabilitation for the disadvantaged group: persons with disability, women & children in distress, rural /semi urban women. It has worked for the promotion of sustainable, equitable and participatory development, social welfare and social justice, Livelihood promotion among women through: Various Program for social work, women empowerment, SHG formation, Rehabilitation Centre for Mentally Challenged, Health service and other human service through social research and dissemination of socially relevant knowledge, social intervention through training and field action, contribution to social and welfare policy and program at state and National level.

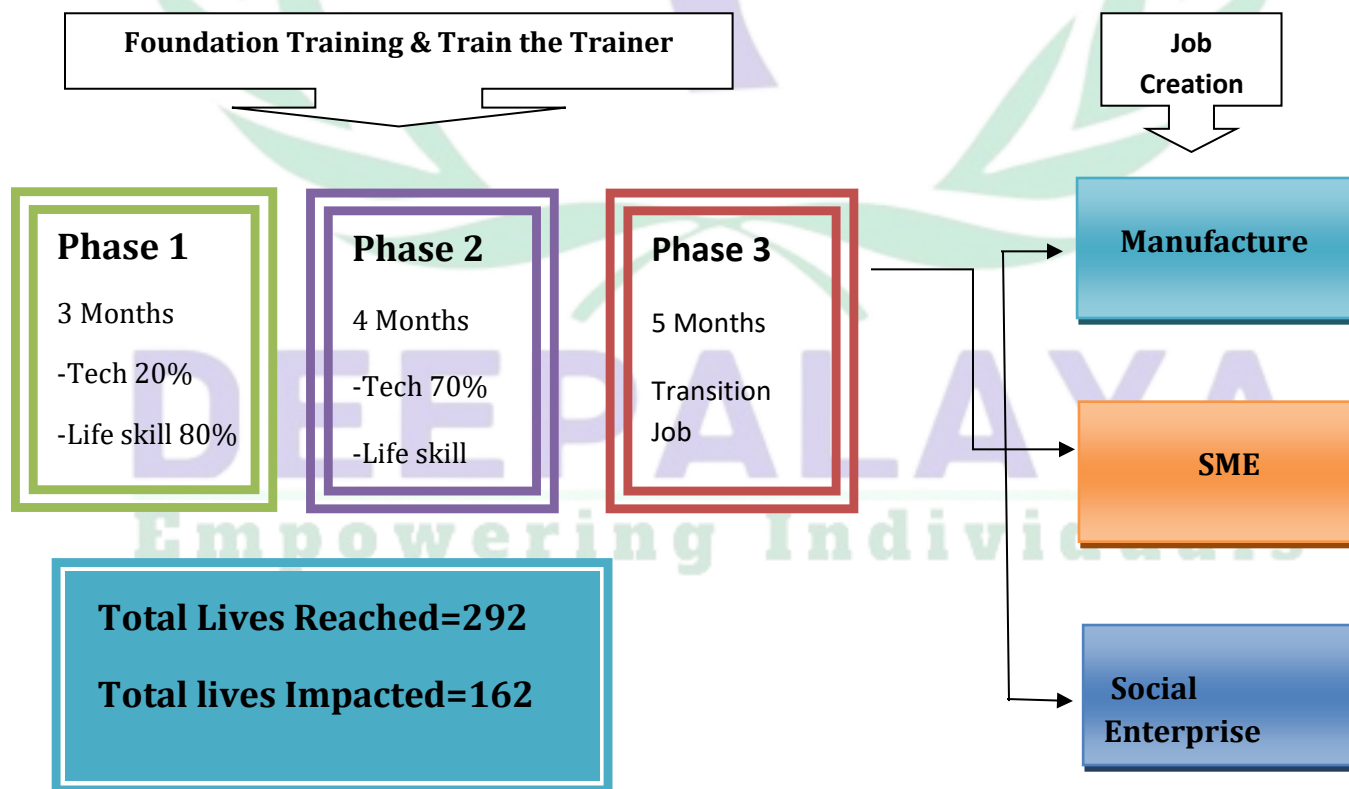

# NOMI WFD Project- NI102, Purnia

Deepalaya initiated a project on Creating Economic Opportunities for Women in April 2019 in partnership with Nomi Network International. The main objective of the projects is providing legal awareness, counselling, and aid to victims of domestic violence/abuse, and their rehabilitation through vocational training in computer application, beauty culture and cutting & tailoring. The center is a catalyst for bringing about social, economic, and legal empowerment of underprivileged women; encouraging micro-enterprises and entrepreneurship development through Self-Help Groups (SHG). Adult education and health are other areas of assistance.

## The Steps of Training under NI102 WFD Project

### ➤ FPI (Foundation Phase I)

Foundation Phase I course duration is for 3 months. The training module is focused on two aspects.

1. Life Skill (80%)
2. Technical Skill (20%).

*Number of Classes is = 24 (Twice a week)*

### ➤ FPII (Foundation Phase II)

Foundation Phase II course duration is 4 months (According to Lesson Plan) but depends on Trade selection. For example- Tailoring and Beautician Course (1.5 Months) duration varies from the course duration of Animal Husbandry cum Poultry Farming (10 to 15 days) or Computer Application (6 To & 8 Months) and Para Medical (6 To 7 Months). Our JIP (Job Implementation Partner) include Ashpara (PMKVY), Sheelpi (DDUGKY), R-Seti (SBI) and Excess (PMKK) by NSDC, Govt. of India.

### ➤ FPIII (Foundation Phase III)

After completing FPII training the beneficiaries are promoted to Foundation Phase III before final placement stage (FJCP). The beneficiaries have completed their FPII Training but are not included in FJCP are a part of FJCP.

### ➤ FJCP (Final Job Placement)

In this phase beneficiaries get into jobs or SME after completion of FPI, FPII, FPIII. Until today our 43 beneficiaries are economically independent.

### 1. Covid-19 Community Outreach Program

In May 2020 we initiated an awareness program entitled - Community Outreach Program on Covid-19; to reach the left-out communities and spread awareness among our community about the COVID-19 virus, its method of progression and safety measure for prevention from the virus. 29 COW (Community Outreach Worker) daily visited door to door of each household in different communities and demonstrated the safety methods while following the government safety guidelines.
