OUTREACH PROGRAM



COMMUNICATION Faithfully From Pattie Meyer

The dictionary defines "communication as the act of transmitting; a giving or exchanging of information; signals or messages by talk, gestures, writing, etc.; and a system of sending and receiving messages; the art of expressing ideas especially in messages and speech.

Why is communication so important? To put it simply...if we don't appropriately communicate, nothing will be accomplished in a timely and professional manner.

About Ash Wednesday. The first of the forty days of Lent, named for the custom of placing blessed ashes on the foreheads of worshipers at Ash Wednesday services. The ashes are a sign of penitence and a reminder of mortality, and may be imposed with the sign of the cross. Ash Wednesday is observed as a fast in the church year of the Episcopal Church. The Ash Wednesday service is one of the Proper Liturgies for Special Days in the BCP (page 264). Imposition of ashes at the Ash Wednesday service is optional.

"Ashes to Go" is a way of taking church to the streets on Ash Wednesday, meeting people in the midst of daily life with a moment of grace. Each year, clergy and congregants throughout the diocese go out to the people to administer ashes at train stations, coffee shops, shopping malls, hospitals, street corners, anywhere busy people are. The Church of the Holy Spirit in Tuckerton will be participating in Ashes to Go from 7-8am and 12-1pm.

Morning Prayer Service. The worship services on Sunday February 23rd will be Morning Prayer. "Morning Prayer once was the chief Sunday service in most Anglican churches on three out of four Sundays, the First Sunday usually being a celebration of Holy Communion. This practice has not continued because the eucharist has been recognized as the "principal act of Christian worship on the Lord's Day" in most parishes (see <u>BCP</u> page 13). However, Morning Prayer is clearly designated as a daily service for the worship of the church."

Prayer List. Prayer unites us—to God and with one another. Tom Don has volunteered to serve as our Parish Pray Sheppard. Tom will help to make sure those in need of prayer are included in our Prayers of the People. If you, or a loved one, needs the support that prayer can give, please fill out a Prayer Request Card found in the pews, email us, or call the Parish Office. People will stay on the prayer list for about 30 days and longer if continued prayer is needed. We intend to refresh the prayer list in the coming weeks.
