Affiliation News - Discerning Our Common Call



The Discernment Process to Call a Priest-in-Charge has officially begun. The Wardens of both churches had a Zoom meeting with Bishop Stokes on January 23rd. During that meeting the Memorandum of Understanding was reviewed and thereafter Bishop Stokes officially started the Discernment Process. St. Stephen's and the Church of the Holy Spirit have established a Joint Discernment Steering Committee. The St. Stephen's members are Glenys Baulderstone, Ray Davis, Peggy Beck and John Will. There are three phases to

the discernment process, which are: (1) The Church <u>Profile</u> Phase, (2) The Search Phase and (3) The Transition Phase.

We have retained an experienced consultant in Rhonda Jackson who will be providing guidance to the committee and the Vestries. We hope to have completed the first phase in the early Spring and immediately enter the Search Phase. The joint committees have begun discussions and have weekly meeting planned. We will keep you aware of our progress.

About Ash Wednesday. The first of the forty days of Lent, named for the custom of placing blessed ashes on the foreheads of worshipers at Ash Wednesday services. The ashes are a sign of penitence and a reminder of mortality, and may be imposed with the sign of the cross. In the Episcopal Church Year, Ash Wednesday is observed as a fasting day. The Ash Wednesday service is one of the Proper Liturgies for Special Days in the BCP (page 264). Imposition of ashes at the Ash Wednesday service is optional.

COVID-19 precautions will change the Ash Wednesday Service. At the time of publishing this newsletter, the Bishop has not yet told us what the Ash Wednesday procedures will be. We expect to know that within the next few days and we will advise you by email or phone call.

WORKING TOGETHER WITH OUR CHURCH FAMILY

With the holiday season behind us, and now facing some other challenging tasks ahead of us, how blessed are we that there are members of our Church family that are working to keep St. Stephen's viable. We are faced with the prospect of occasionally not having a priest for our Sunday service, since most of the available supply priests either have previous commitments or are just not available. Fortunately, a way to help our church community

with a worship service is by having a Morning Prayer service. Rett Rich and Glenys Balderstone, with the help of a few others, have put together a prayer service that is both inspiring and helpful with a service that can bring us closer to God and feel like we are in unity with our Church family.

This Morning Prayer service has been well thought out so that in the absence of having a priest, we can still participate in a worship service. We also now have music which is recorded and able to be played through the church organ with the help of Carlos who can prerecord the hymns and have them played during our services even with he not being present.

Our Senior Warden, Jim Joeriman, has been working diligently to reach out to any supply priests that may be available to come to St. Stephens and offer a Eucharistic service while we are working on getting a permanent priest. This is a difficult task since there are not many supply priests to choose from and most of them already have previous commitments.

Please know that behind the scenes, we are working to support the needs of our St. Stephen's family. Despite the restrictions imposed by COVID-19, winter weather, and the lack of a Rector to provide regular pastoral care, we can be thankful that our church is enduring and positioned to grow. As a Church family, we want to do whatever we can to keep the unity and inspiration that any type of service can bring. Positive feedback is so important to encourage those that are working hard to help all of us be together in our beautiful church. Just walk through the doors and you feel it right away. That is what keeps us going to try and make sure we enjoy the feeling of worship.



Update From The Saint Stephen's Food Pantry

In December 2020, we feed 78 families comprised of 171 adults and 94 children. During the entire year of 2020 we feed 764 separate families which was comprised of 1749 adults and 791 children—2540 individual people in need of the assistance our food pantry provides.

The Food Pantry now has a direct phone number which is 609-312-7041. The Pantry is open from 9am until 11:30 on Monday through Wednesday. Spread the word to those who are in need of this ministry. We are in need of volunteers (need not be church members) in order to expand the hours to Thursday & Friday.

The Memorial Garden is located at the rear of the Parish Hall and it is consecrated as a columbarium for

the cremated remains of members of the church and their family members. There is no fee for <u>inurnment</u> other than the optional cost of name engraving.

Funds donated to the Memorial Garden are segregated from the general grounds of the Parish and used for the development and maintenance of the Memorial Garden.

Like any outdoor area, it needs constant care. We are thankful to Gloria Davis who

volunteers her time to maintain the Memorial Garden. This Christmas, she made sure it took on a Christmas look. *Thank you* Gloria.

Lori's parents were regularly involved with our Church and Barbara was a major force in getting our Thrift Shop up and running.
