From The Vestry...

Planning for the Future. At the February meeting, the Vestry adopted an overview of a three year Strategic Plan on Return to Viability. The tactics of the plan include Prayer, Affiliation Parameters, Clergy Selection, Communications, Ministries and Outreach and Sunday School. The entire plan is available for you to [read on our website](#). The objective, vision and strategy statements are:

Our Objective. To become financially viable in order to maintain all ministries and employ a full time dedicated Rector.

Our Vision. Over the course of the next three years, the size of the Saint Stephen's congregation will have grown in both numbers and involvement to a point which provides self-efficiency and the opportunity to employ a dedicated Rector.

Our Strategy. Saint Stephen's will pursue a three year plan which involves prayer, reduces operating costs, and embraces what God has placed around us. We will strive to improve fellowship, stewardship, communications, ministries and community outreach to grow the size of the congregation. Growth of the congregation will increase pledge income and our volunteer base. With commitment and God's help, we will return to viability.

Affiliation Discussions. Discussions continue and should such an affiliation occur, it will not alter our three year plan on return to viability, indeed it shall be a means to help us succeed in achieving our objective. The Vestry is working with Holy Spirit and the Bishop to schedule one or more joint congregation town hall style conversational meetings with the Bishop. We expect this to occur after Easter.

Southern Ocean County Episcopal Fellowship. The fellowship consists of Saint Stephen's in Waretown, [Holy Spirit](#) in Tuckerton, [Holy Innocents](#) in Beach Haven and [St Peter's](#) at the Light.

MOTHERING SUNDAY *Bon Appétit! Pattie Meyer & Maureen O'Keefe*

The term “Mothering Sunday” comes from a 16th Century custom for people to return to their “mother church” which could be either the church they were baptized in or the local parish church or cathedral. This custom was popular throughout England, Ireland and Europe. Anyone who did this was called “amothering”. Mothering Sunday thus became a day when domestic servants were given the day off to visit their mother church and family members. Legend has it that at some point in time servants were given a portion of flour to take home in order to make a special cake for their mother. Children who were “in service” were also given the day off and usually picked wildflowers as a gift for their mother. It was also a time for families to gather together and celebrate.



The tradition lapsed throughout continental Europe and Ireland by the 1920s. But a revival began when Mother’s Day became popular in the United States. The tradition of Mothering Sunday is still practiced in the Church of England and the Church of Ireland, and was merged with the new imported commercial traditions.

Mothering Sunday is now traditionally held on the fourth Sunday of Lent. In keeping with the tradition of taking flour and making a cake for your mother, there will be a traditional Simmel Cake served during Coffee Hour after both 8am & 10am services on Sunday, March 29th.

Best Practices. As the flu season continues, and amid growing concerns about the possible spread of the Coronavirus, now is a good time to remind everyone about best practices concerning hygiene during Eucharist and other worship services.

The Peace. Parishioners who are coughing or sneezing should refrain from handshaking during the Peace. Fist bumps, elbow bumps, friendly waves, and peace signs are all acceptable substitutes. Should you have a cough, sneeze, or if not feeling well, we suggest that when approaching or being approached you extend a fist for bump or display a peace sign.

Eucharist. The Diocese tells us to avoid intinction because it does little to avoid the spread of disease and may actually increase the spread, as the wafer spends more time in the (possibly unclean) hand before being dipped in the wine. There has never been much evidence of risk of disease associated with the shared communion cup, but of course each parishioner must make up their own minds about its use. Refusing to receive wine is acceptable. Hand sanitizer stations are being installed inside the Church.

Maundy Thursday Agape Meal. Prior to the Maundy Thursday Service, Saint Stephen's and The Church of the Holy Spirit will gather for a [agape](#) simple meal of soup, bread, cheese, wine, fruit and fruit juice will be at 6:00 in the Parish Hall at Saint Stephen's. Maundy Thursday is the Thursday in Holy Week (the week leading up to Easter). The day is a time for remembering the Last Supper. The name comes from the Latin word *Maundatum*, for “commandment”, for Jesus said: “*I give you a new commandment; that you love one another.*” This loving of one another is acted out by the Celebrant washing the feet (one foot) of parishioners. If there is to be “Communion” at the Good Friday Liturgy, it is consecrated at this Service for Reservation at the [Altar of Repose](#). At the conclusion of this service, altars are stripped of any ornamentation and crosses are removed or veiled to mark the solemnity of the occasion. ***The Maundy Thursday service will be at St. Stephen's at 7:00PM. It will be a joint service which includes Holy Spirit. The Celebrant will be The Reverend Don Muller.*** Ad your name to the foot washing list located in the [Narthex](#).

Vigil at the Altar of Repose begins at the end of the Maundy Thursday Service and continues until the beginning of the Good Friday evening liturgy. It gives us a time to “keep watch with our Lord in increments of one hour”. Saint Stephen's parishioners take turns standing watch for one-hour as an individual or group of two. This is an enriching experience. **Please** sign up for a one-hour watch time. The watch list posted in the [Narthex](#).
