They handed out the Sunday Bulletin and always had the opportunity to "chit-chat" with fellow parishioners. They would collect the offering and along with the host present it to the priest, then close the altar rail and maintaining an even flow of parishioners to the altar rail. When the service was concluded, they did a little bit of housekeeping before the lights were turned

off and the doors locked.

That all changed when COVID-19 came to town. The Bulletin is now the service protocol itself and is placed on those seats for each parishioner. Except for household members, everyone is 6 feet apart. We're all encouraged to leave the church when the service is done. There's no Coffee Hour or "just hanging out" in general.

While several people have declined to return, I do have a group who are still willing and dedicated. Our Ushers are still answering the call to serve the church under a whole new set of guidelines that have been established to keep us all safe and healthy.

When the day comes that we can go back to worshiping as we have done in the past, I know that the Ushers will be in the "back of the church" ready to assist their fellow parishioners.




There are always so many people to thank and this month we want to say Thank You to Pattie Meyer!

Spotlighted This Month... John Will



There are some members of our congregation that have much to offer and unfortunately, we only see a small part of who they are. John Will has been a member of our church for the past 36 years and has been a huge part of lending a hand when needed. Being a truthful individual, John lets you know what is on his mind and that is a gift that we wish more folks possessed. Talking to John, who by the way has a caring heart, one observes that he will communicate so that there is no question of where he stands.

John grew up in Mid-Town Manhattan and has been married to his lovely wife Pat for the past 50 years. They were blessed with 2 children, Michael & Christine, who both attended St.

Stephens Sunday School and are now in their 40's with kids of their own. Although John is a cradle Episcopalian, starting as an acolyte, altar boy and a member of the choir, Pat was raised Catholic and as some of us can attest, changing to Episcopalian has many benefits.

John worked for the postal service for 30 years and during that time was a Union Representative, which carried a lot of responsibility and before retirement he was a substitute teacher for night school. He also did home schooling during the 1990's up to 2004. He worked nights so that he could attend college and practice student teaching during the day in order to obtain his degree.

When John & family relocated to this area due to a job transfer, St. Stephens welcomed them and since then, John has served in many capacities. He started with Fr. Paul as a Lay Reader and also trained other lay readers for that position. He participated in the Vestry on and off for many years helping to make the decisions that were needed going forward. John is also a Eucharistic Minister of which one must be certified to carry out this important task. Added to those duties, John worked on the committee for Grounds & Maintenance, Boy Scouts' affiliation and organized many trips for youth groups that were once here at St. Stephens'.

John also had a position with the Diocese on the Review Committee that would oversee disciplinary review for pastors. Another important task was creating the format for Prayers of the People so that Lay Readers would have guidelines for each service. Up until COVID-19 became so much a part of our society, John studied and worked as a Court System Mediator. Getting both parties to reach an agreement would alleviate the heavy load of the court system and the result of that Mediation would become final for the parties involved. This last job is what gives John the ability to have a vital role on the committee that oversees the Good Sam House and all that job encompasses. The GSH is a home for a maximum of 4 men giving them a chance to get back on their feet by offering a safe home with food and shelter. This is a full-time position and John is on call 24/7 for situations or emergencies that need attention. The men help with maintaining the grounds and also with the needs of the Thrift Shop. Thank you John for the many years of helping St. Stephen's in so many different capacities. Your diverse background is a great compliment to all the tasks that you participate in.

The Saint Stephen's Food Pantry is open from 9am until 11:30 on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday to help meet the needs of people in our communities. Spread the word to those who are in need of this ministry. We are in need of volunteers in order to expand the hours to Thursday & Friday.
